Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls the meeting to order at 4:35PM with introduction of Board, Staff and Guests. Spiesschaert welcomes the new 2000 Rodeo Queen Lacy Thurmond. Spiesschaert also notes the absence of CEO Margaret Garza due to a death in her family.

1.Consent Agenda: Margaret Garza's report on the December and January financial position of the Fair Complex will be given at the February, 2, 2000 Fair Board meeting.

Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls for a motion to accept the Minutes from the December 7, 1999 Fair Board meeting. Rich Vial so moves, Kathy Christy Seconds, the motion passes.

**2.Rodeo Committee Report:** Cody Feinauer gives the report. Feinauer mentions that the Queen coronation dance will be held January 29, 2000 in the Floral Building at 6:30 PM. Contracts are done and will be signed so Bill McKinley can get them out. The Drill Team process is under way, Bill McKinley and Laurie Benton are taking care of that. McKinley said that we came up with what we think is a "bullet proof" but simple

selection process. Sheila Day asks if there are any other teams that we don't already know of that applied. McKinley said "no". Feinauer said that "technically" there are three that are interested. Feinauer said other than budget stuff that's about it for his report. Feinauer also mentioned that he and the Rodeo Committee had made a few changes to the Budget that had been submitted to McKinley previously. (Feinauer passes out revisions) Spiesschaert mentioned to the Fair Board that the line items you are now seeing are in your Master Budget, but they might not be what the Rodeo Committee is requesting now, so these (hand out) are the ones that they are now requesting. Margaret Garza will now have to review it. Feinauer said on the third page is what we expect to get in sponsorship dollars. Leahy ask Feinauer if all the sponsorship money has been paid in yet? Feinauer said that it's all paid. He said he handed in the Friberg Electric check the day he thought the Fair Board meeting was last month. Leahy asked if there wasn't a policy about the payment by sponsors in having their money to come in a month prior (to the event),,, Feinauer said that he was not aware of any such policy, but said he thinks we should make such a policy. Spiesschaert said that Feinauer and he had talked about it and thought it was a good idea. Feinauer said that we will get "letters of intent" well before and then send out billings about two months before the rodeo with a due date being hopefully July 1st. Spiesschaert said he did not see the major sponsors on this sheet (page 3). Feinauer said they are not there in name because they were "not for sure" yet. Feinauer said to look at the last page and you'll see "major" sponsors as in the "title" sponsor and "presenting" sponsor, those are the major sponsors. Spiesschaert asked Feinauer if he had any reason to believe that the major sponsors may be different this year. Feinauer said that the impression he was get from talking to some individuals is that United Rentals will probably not be back, but we have two other companies that have been trying to get in in the past. Spiesschaert asked if he knew about Friberg Electric sponsorship. Feinauer said that they are 99.9 % "in". Spiesschaert asked about NECA. Feinauer said that was the one that we were really not sure of because of the bullfights (not having). Feinauer said that Gary Price is talking to them to see what they plan on doing. Spiesschaert said he saw in their (rodeo) minutes that they had a back up there to. Feinauer said yes.

3.4-H update: John Baggott, 4-H Extension service gives report. Baggott said that he has been working with Paige Payne on the fair book revisions. The Superintendents are finalizing judges and those kind of things. In terms of livestock, there have been some discussions about "release time", and that Payne had met with the livestock leadership, and since last Fair Board meeting he (Baggott) had sent out an update on the schedule changing, and work on the traffic pattern on how the vehicles would be routed during Sunday move-out. Spiesschaert asked if the plan would be "workable". Baggott said that it would be very workable. Rich Vial asks in clarification, if the release time stays at 6 PM for the 4-H livestock. Baggott, "yes". Baggott said what makes that possible is the new gate scheme of exiting out the Cloverleaf parking lot and that will relieve

congestion. Vial mentions his concern for the possible loss of "tie-out" space. Baggott said that the gate would function as a tie-out rack and only would come out during move out. Baggott talked about having a silent auction for 4-H exhibits in the Cloverleaf building, it would act as a draw and also allow 4-H members to somewhat market their skill. It would be a help for 4-H members. Spiesschaert said he talked to Garza about this and thought that it would be a good thing as long as it's not a "hard sell". Baggott said that he did not envision the auction as being that. Baggott mentioned the Horse Fair. Spiesschaert said he thought that the Fair Board should be involved when moving Horse Fair dates were concerned. Spiesschaert said that he was not informed as to the two prospective and then final move/change dates. Spiesschaert said that he talked to Garza and said she didn't know it had gone that far. Spiesschaert said that judges letters have gone out, and that we are now locked in, and he would suggest in the future that the Board be involve in that process. That, as well as you (Baggott) do communicate, some 4-H divisions may feel that they are being pushed out, when our intent should be to include them in more. Spiesschaert in talking to one of the leaders said that one issue was that we could not get the stalls converted in time (for fair). Spiesschaert said that he would like to even get a night crew together to tear stalls down. Spiesschaert asked Baggott if the dates are now set for 2000. Baggott said yes. Baggott said the schedules have been reconciled with 4-H Camp and Wagon Trail and that there is no overwhelming problem logistically related in the date change. Spiesschaert said that he would like to see Horse Fair more apart of the Fair itself. Sheila Day asked about Baggott's comment about with the date changes and that we will not be "rushed". Baggott said the problem for the last couple of years is that, when "back to back" in using multiple barns, beyond just the horse stalls, it's trying to get horses out of while the livestock are trying to come in. Baggott said we may be able to do something with volunteers but lets not make it even more difficult. Spiesschaert said we may be able to help in that regard (volunteers). Spiesschaert said we may be set for this year, but would like to re-visit this issue sometime soon. Kathy Christy asked if we are mis-conceiving the feelings of the 4-H staff on being more apart of the fair? Baggott said he did not think there is a disconnect with the Fair, he does not believe that they (horse fair) feel that they are feeling that they are being pushed away. In fact, they like it that there is no parking fee or camping fee to limit spectator interest in the event. Baggott said you want to relate the Horse Fair to the Fair, but the time frame separation per se (Baggott) see is not that critical. Vial asks what other fairs do in this regard. McKinley said that when he was at Multnomah, the horse fair was not on the grounds at all, but at Mount Hood Equestrian because they did not have the facilities nor did the 4-H horse people want temporary stalls and whatever to have the event at the fairgrounds. Kathy Christy asked if there are others in 4-H that could be brought into the discussion for 2001. Baggott said that he would like to involve the 4-H Horse Advisory Board somewhere in that process. Spiesschaert mentioned he worked with the Josephine County Fair and the horse show was part of the Fair . Also the Benton County Fair had 4-H horse during their fair, and that many fairs do it that way where feasible. And would like to see it more a part of our Fair. Spiesschaert thinks there

is synergy when horse fair and fair are closely linked. Spiesschaert said there used to be "championship day", where all the horse winners came back on opening fair day to be honored. It was a good recognition thing for the kids. Spiesschaert said livestock folks would like to show a week ahead and get out of here, but should we allow it to happen? It's a complex issue but its worth sitting down and talking about it. Baggott said that they should do some demonstrations and have some horses on display. Vial asked of the 4-H enrollment, what is the percentage of the horse participation. Baggott; 20%. Vial said that is a significant number not being involved in the intense leadership development during fair. And in his beef club there is the impression that the horse kids think they're too good to be at the Fair with the others. He said that he was sure that wasn't true but that was the impression. Baggott said, that at the 4-H dance, while the horse kids might know about it, they for the most part don't attend. Sheila Day asked what was the actual date of the horse fair. Baggott said 14-18 of July. Baggott has been talking to Paige Payne, about doing some leadership kind of things and have the FFA also involved, and would like to expand to all youth activity.

4.Maintenance Report: Jim Jordan gives report: Mike Wold is installing a new water line at the M.E. building to facilitate the animal shows that take place there. Jordan is involved with the never-ending electrical needs of the facility. The "Albert's" (Flanagan) are busy with set up and tear down for the events. Kelly Goodin has put a new roof on the booster's booth. We had some tie-racks in the beef and dairy barn and FFA barn, they were made wrong about four years ago we went back and re- welded them to correct some problems. We haven't had enough water to really put pressure on the drainage system. Spiesschaert asked about the new pick-up truck we purchased. Jordan explains the circumstances under which we made the purchase. Spiesschaert said he hoped the word trickled down to the staff that we support the staff in getting the equipment they need to get the job done. Jordan said that it had. Spiesschaert mentions to Mike Wold that they had not forgotten him and the survey that he and Ken Leahy were going to make on his house. Vial asks about taking a roller out and smoothing out the high spots in the parking lot, and, or use the gravel that's available to fill some of the low spots. Mike Wold said that we will have to have something fairly big to get the job done. Spiesschaert said that a lot can be done in the months in March and April.

5.Old Business: (A) Policy Manual: Status and Update: Rich Vial gives report. Vial said he had a "policy on policies" (hand out). Vial goes over the hand out. He basically distilled the many disorganized policies from over the years into four types of policies. 1. Fair Board Administration. 2. Rodeo Issues. 3. Ground Operations. 4. County Fair Operations. Vial said that at this meeting, the "process" for establishing policy should be discussed and agreed too. Vial "walks" through the basic elements. Discussion about distinguishing between gratis usage of the facilities and hard rental, or "controversial" rentals. Vial said that is a good example where a policy should be made. Discussion. Vial suggests that over the next six months or so, a notebook should be organized that has all

these policies in a "tab". Spiesschaert thought that would be great. Spiesschaert suggests that the Board not take any action until Garza gets back, and then do it at the February Board meeting. (B) Fair Complex Expenditures Update: Bill McKinley gives update. The new pick-up is outside the door. The computers are set up, hard wired and ready to go, with a three hour training orientation coming up tomorrow. The web site development will be taking place sometime later in the month. The phone system is in and we are learning all the many options that these new phones provide. Vial asks if we can now phone directly in to an individual after working hours. McKinley didn't know. Day asked if Melissa still gets the calls when calling in. McKinley said yes. Spiesschaert likes the idea of a "human body" answering the phone. The stage has been ordered. The stanchions are ordered. Jordan procured 30 dividers (room partitions) for two dollars for all of them from State Surplus. Normally they cost \$85 a piece. Spiesschaert suggest we find a good place to store them. Jordan said that is going to be difficult. Spiesschaert said to keep reminding us about finding storage. McKinley states that the replacement for the mower was well researched by Jim Jordan. We carefully examined our needs against what was most cost effective and durable. We found three comparable machines. The Toro was the most expensive at \$16,097. The second was the John Deere that came in at \$12,148. And the low figure was the Ford at \$11,800. Again, the specs were very close on all three. McKinley said his recommendation given the closeness would be the New Holland Ford. Discussion over the options including leasing, warranty and machine features. Jordan goes into detail over the individual mower features. Spiesschaert said if all things are equal, we should consider patronizing a Fair sponsor like Fisher Implement. McKinley mentioned that if we do not go with the lowest bidder that there are some county purchasing hoops that we must negotiate. Spiesschaert asked Mike Wold what his preference would be. Wold said he'd go with the Toro. The one we have now has years and years of service behind it. We really haven't had any trouble with it until 1995. Wold said that we can't get a rear discharge (on the Toro) that would be ideal around here. We have had windshields knocked out with side discharging. McKinley said there is also the liability of hitting someone in the head with a rock or other debris. McKinley also added that the New Holland Ford was the only one that we looked at that had a rear discharging option. Leahy said that that maybe we could write the specs to factor in the Toro if that's we want. McKinley said that the specs are so close that that would be difficult to fend off a challenge from the losers. Spiesschaert asks if we have the money in the line item to make the purchase. McKinley said we have the money and the Board approved the expenditure for selected capital items at the last Fair Board meeting. Kathy Christy said, if the purchasing rules are followed and we have a low bid, should we entertain a motion? Spiesschaert asks how we came to a price on the mower. Jordan said he haggled with the dealers like buying a car. He talked to Mark Christensen at New Holland who developed Jordan talked to all three representatives of the three individual firms the price. considered.

Kathy Christy moves that the Board approve the purchase of the Ford New Holland mower for \$11,800, with the consent of the Executive Director. Rich Vial seconds, the motion carries.

(A) PGE Correspondence. Bill McKinley gives information. 6.New Business: McKinley has the Board refer to the two letters in their packets. One from PGE and the second from County Counsel, Allen Rappleyea. In Garza's communication with John Newell from the Port of Portland, he feels that there should be some compensation for the easement that PGE would like granted. Garza agreed and is now in a "holding pattern" waiting to hear Newell's suggestion for an equitable solution so that compensation for both the Port and the Fair Complex may be uniform and consistant. Spiesschaert asks if this issue might not be deferred, and that the Board definitely wants to be a part of this process. Leahy said also, that when Grant street gets extended, they should compensate for a junction. McKinley mentions the leverage that we may have with Intel in terms of sponsorship that might be explored since this cable easement benefits Intel directly. Spiesschaert said that we should look at these easements very carefully, like the size and location of those vault boxes, where they go can really hamper our operations, for once we sign off, it will then be our problem. Spiesschaert asks if the graveled land outside the fence by the Armory is our property. Wold said that it is our property.

McKinley mentioned as a side note that the indication was from Garza's communication with Dan Aberg with the Chamber of Commerce, that the Air Show will be paying to lease the property for parking. (B) 2000-2001 Draft Budget Review: Postponed until the February 2<sup>nd</sup> Fair Board meeting.

7.Correspondence: There was no correspondence this month for the Fair Board.

8.Board Communications: Sheila Day asked about the HB 2766 that was passed in the last legislative session that would allow for a special district, privatization and fair association, she asked if we are doing that? McKinley said that the bill allowed for the "mechanism" to allow us to do that, if, that was what we cared to do. However, the process is long and very exacting with much mandated public participation. Sheila Day said in the last minutes she noticed that the Rodeo had received an award. Cody Feinauer explained that the Washington County Rodeo Committee was honored by the Columbia River Circuit as the "most supportive", as voted by the contractors, cowboys, etc. . Spiesschaert congratulated Feinauer and the committee in receiving the honor.

Kathy Christy moves the Fair Board meeting adjourned. Sheila Day seconds the motion, the motion passes.

CHAPTER ......

AN ACT

Relating to county fairs; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 565.210 and 565.230.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. { + Sections 2 to 6 of this 1999 Act are added to and made a part of ORS 565.210 to 565.310. + }

SECTION 2. { + A member of a county fair board appointed under ORS 565.210 may be removed by the county court for inefficiency, neglect of duty, misconduct in office, incompetence, incompatibility, dereliction of duty or other good cause, as those terms may be defined by county ordinance. A member of the fair board shall not be removed by the county court until after the member receives a copy of a statement containing the cause for removal and a hearing on the removal is held. The statement shall be given to the member at least 10 days prior to the hearing, at which the member must have an opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel. When the county court removes a member of the fair board, a record of the proceedings, together with the cause for removal and findings thereon, shall be filed in the office of the county clerk. + }

SECTION 3. { + (1) As provided in this section and sections 4 and 5 of this 1999 Act, a county court may abolish the county fair board appointed under ORS 565.210.

(2) A county court may initiate proceedings to abolish the county fair board by issuing an order creating a county fair advisory committee with six members who shall all be residents of the county. Upon issuance of the order under this subsection, the county court shall appoint three members to the advisory committee and the county fair board shall appoint three members. The advisory committee shall consider the relevant issues and make recommendations concerning the abolition of the county fair board and, if abolition is recommended, the future operation of the county fair by either a fair association or a fair district. If a majority of the advisory committee agrees that abolishing the county fair board is in the best interests of the residents of the county, the advisory committee shall recommend abolition of the county fair board. If the advisory committee recommends abolition of the county fair board, the county court and the county fair board may meet to consult and negotiate concerning the future operation of the county fair and fairgrounds. If the county court and the county fair board agree that it is in the best interests of the residents of the county to have a fair

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association or fair district replace the county fair board, the county court may adopt a resolution that expresses the intention of the county court to abolish the county fair board, sets forth the reasons for the intended action, states that either a fair association or a fair district will replace the county fair board and declares that the abolition of the county fair board is in the best interests of the residents of the county.

- (3) A resolution adopted by a county court under subsection (2) of this section must be accompanied by a resolution adopted by the county fair board that acknowledges the proposed action of the county court and declares that abolition of the county fair board is in the best interests of the residents of the county. The resolution adopted by a county fair board under this subsection must be adopted at a regular public meeting of the county fair board and filed with the county court.
- (4) After adoption of the resolutions described in subsections (2) and (3) of this section, the county court shall conduct a public hearing concerning the abolition of the county fair board at which testimony of interested persons and other evidence shall be received.
- (5) Notice of the public hearing required by subsection (4) of this section shall be published twice in at least two newspapers of general circulation in the county. The first notice shall be published between the 90th day and the 60th day before the hearing. The second notice shall be published between the 30th day and the 20th day before the hearing.
- (6) After the public hearing required by subsection (4) of this section, the county court shall consider the testimony given and the other evidence received at the hearing. If the county court determines that abolishing the county fair board is in the best interests of the residents of the county, the county court shall issue an order abolishing the county fair board and authorizing either the creation of a fair district or an agreement with a fair association for the purpose of managing and operating the county fair. The abolition of the county fair board shall be effective on the date specified in the order.
- (7) This section applies only to a county having a population exceeding 400,000 but not exceeding 600,000, according to the most recent annual estimate of population under ORS 190.510 to 190.610. + }
- SECTION 4. { + (1) As used in this section, a 'fair association' means a corporation incorporated under ORS chapter 65 that has a board of directors with at least three members and that is authorized by its articles of incorporation to exercise the powers and perform the functions exercised and performed by a county fair board under ORS 565.210 to 565.310.
- (2) If the order issued by a county court under section 3 of this 1999 Act authorizes an agreement with a fair association, the county court, before the abolition of the county fair board, shall enter into an agreement with a fair association for the management and operation of the county fair. Except as otherwise provided in the agreement, a fair association may exercise all of the powers and authority granted to a county fair board under ORS 565.210 to 565.310.
- (3) An agreement between a county court and a fair association under this section may not provide for the conveyance or other transfer of public property to the fair association unless the

public property is transferred as allowed by the laws of this state. + }

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SECTION 5. { + If the order issued by a county court under section 3 of this 1999 Act authorizes the formation of a fair district to replace the county fair board, the county court, before the abolition of the county fair board, shall initiate the formation of the fair district by order as provided in ORS 198.835. After initiation of formation proceedings as provided in this section, a fair district may be created as provided in ORS 198.705 to 198.955 and section 6 of this 1999 Act. + }

SECTION 6. { + (1) A fair district shall constitute a municipal corporation of this state, and a public body, corporate and politic, exercising public power. A fair district may:

- (a) Have and use a common seal.
- (b) Sue and be sued by its name.
- (c) Make and accept any and all contracts, deeds, leases, releases and documents of any kind that, in the judgment of the district board, are necessary or proper to the exercise of any power of the district, and to direct the payment of all lawful claims or demands.
- (d) Assess, levy and collect taxes to pay the cost of acquiring sites for the county fair and constructing, reconstructing, altering, operating and maintaining the ground and all other property devoted to the use of the county fair, the expenses incurred in the business management and financial and other affairs of the county fair and any lawful claims against the district.
  - (e) Employ all necessary agents and assistants.
  - (f) Call elections after the formation of the district.
- (g) Generally do any acts necessary and proper to the complete exercise and effect of any of its powers or the purposes for which it was formed.
- (2) The officers of the district shall be a board of five members elected by the electors of the district. The district board shall be the governing body of the district and shall exercise all powers of the district.
- (3) Five district board members shall be elected at the election for district formation. If the effective date of the formation of the district occurs in an odd-numbered year, two district board members shall be elected for four-year terms and the other three district board members shall be elected for two-year terms. If the effective date of the formation occurs in an even-numbered year, two district board members shall be elected for three-year terms and the other three district board members shall be elected for one-year terms. The district board members shall be elected at large by position number. Each district board member shall hold office until election and qualification of a successor.
- (4) ORS chapter 255 governs the nomination and election of district board members and the conduct of district elections.
- (5) The district board in each year shall determine and fix the amount of money to be levied and raised by taxation for the purposes of the district.
- (6) A county may convey or otherwise transfer public property to a fair district as provided by law. + } SECTION 7. ORS 565.210 is amended to read:

565.210. (1) Any county may hold county and industrial fairs; but only one county fair shall be held in each county.

(2) { + Except as provided in section 3 of this 1999 Act, + } in counties holding county fairs, the county court of such county shall appoint a board consisting of not less than three nor more than seven residents of the county, to be known as the county

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fair board. When the first members of the board are appointed under this section, one member shall be appointed for a term to expire the January next following appointment, one for a term to expire one year from the January next following appointment, and one for a term to expire two years from the January next following appointment. In addition to the three members, the county court may, at any time, appoint not more than four additional members, the fourth and sixth members to be appointed for a term to expire one year from the January next following appointment and the fifth and seventh members, if any, for a term to expire two years from the January next following appointment. Annually thereafter, at the first meeting in January, upon the expiration of the term of a member, a successor shall be appointed to serve for three years.

- (3) The court shall require each member of the board to furnish a good and sufficient bond or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by an insured institution as defined in ORS 706.008 in favor of the county, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties of the office. The bond or letter of credit for each member shall be in a sum equal to \$10,000 or 20 percent of the total revenues received by the fair in the last fiscal year ending prior to the appointment of such member, whichever is the lesser amount. The bond or letter of credit when approved by the county court shall be filed with the county clerk. The premium on the bond or the fee for the letter of credit shall be paid for by the county fair board as an expense of the board.
- (4) No more than one member of the county court may serve as a member of the county fair board.
- $\{ + (5) \text{ A member of a county fair board appointed under this section may be removed from office for cause as provided in section 2 of this 1999 Act. + <math>\}$

SECTION 8. ORS 565.230 is amended to read:

- 565.230. (1) The { + county fair + } board has the exclusive management of the ground and all other property owned, leased, used or controlled by the county and devoted to the use of the county fair, and is entrusted and charged with the entire business management and financial and other affairs of such fair.
- (2) In order that the fairgrounds and buildings may be utilized to the fullest extent for pleasure, recreation and public benefit, the board shall at all times have the authority to provide park facilities for the public or to issue licenses and grant permits for the holding of any exhibitions, shows, carnivals, circuses, dances, entertainments or public gatherings upon the fairgrounds. During the progress of county agricultural or industrial fairs and not otherwise, any such businesses so licensed by the board shall not be required to pay license to any city or county other than to the board as provided in this section. The board shall fix the sum to be paid for such permits and licenses, which shall be issued and signed by the president and secretary of the board. The moneys received from the issuance of such permits and licenses shall be deposited to the credit of

the fair fund and warrants drawn against it the same as upon the disbursement of any other fair funds.

( + (3) Donations of real property for the use of the county fair shall be made by an instrument that may be accepted for recording by a county clerk. An instrument of donation shall be recorded in the records of the county clerk where deeds are located. The donated property shall be used in compliance with the express intentions and purposes set forth in the instrument of donation.

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(4) A county court may conclude that an agreement is needed to protect the county and the county court from liability relating to personnel or contractual matters. If the county court asks the county fair board to begin negotiations for an agreement, the county fair board and the county court must enter into an agreement concerning the rules, policies and procedures to be used in the conduct of fair activities for the purpose of limiting the liability of the county for personnel and contractual matters. However, if a county court determines that an agreement is unnecessary or that an existing agreement provides sufficient protection from liability, then an agreement under this subsection is not required. + }

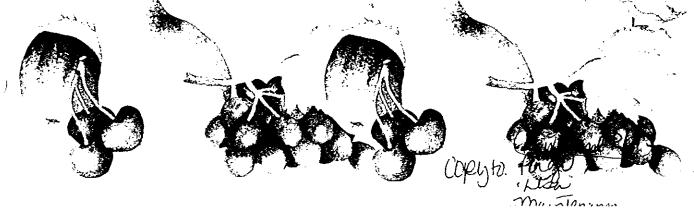
