

February 23, 1948.

Washington County Fair Board met in the office of the manager with all members present including the manager and secretary. Joe Cox, assistant county agent and Faye Nichols, Home Demonstration Agent were present to present their changes for the 1948 premium list for the discussion and approval of the Board.

Mr. Cox asked for another month in which to arrange copy for his part of the premium list as he wished to investigate further the using of a sliding scale in judging 4-H cattle and hogs.

Miss Nichols asked for a Jr. and Sr. class in the bread baking contest so as to conform with the system used at the State Fair. This would make a \$7.00 increase in girl's 4-H.

Mr. Thomas, F.F.A. instructor and superintendent presented a list of increases for their premium list which were read and discussed. The Board decided they would like to discuss this with Mr. Thomas at the next meeting after which they would pass on all premium book changes.

Motion by Mr. Guerber and seconded by Mr. Schmeltzer authorizing purchase of \$247.00 worth of flags and pennants from a Red Bluff, Cal. firm as presented by the manager. Passed.

Manager reported on a few of the items he saw at the Fairmen's Fair which he attended at Sacramento, Calif. He investigated the use of turnstiles and an electric ~~door~~ eye attendance register on gates or doors. The electric eye cost \$44. each. After discussion Mr. Schmeltzer moved we buy 4 of the electric eye registers, Mr. Guerber seconded the motion. Passed.
