Acting Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls the meeting to order with the standard welcome to the audience.

Garza introduces new Fair Board member; Rich Vial, staff introduces themselves. Vial gives a short Bio. Past Fair Board member David Lintz says goodbye, thanks, and welcomes Rich Vial. Spiesschaert thanks Lintz for his five years of service to the Washington County Fair and Rodeo.

Spiesschaert adds a few short items to <u>Old Business</u>; (A) John Thomas Memorial, (B) Cal Wade's exit interview, (C) audit update, (D) mileage reimbursement update, and (E) Rodeo queen sponsorship update.

- 1.Citizen information: Garza introduces Ms. Myra Coe, a guest at the Fair Board meeting and an officer in the 4-H program. Ms. Coe endorses the 4-H program and thanks the Fair Board for the support that has been given to the program in the past. Ms. Coe gives a short overview and update of her role, experiences and on the program(s).
- **2.Consent Agenda:** Margaret Garza gives report, goes over the financial position for December, 1998. General Discussion regarding financials.

Acting Chairman Spiesschaert calls for a motion to accept the consent agenda, Kathy Christy so moves, Sheila Day seconds, the motion carries.

3.Rodeo Report: Cody Feinauer gives report. The Rodeo committee is preparing for this year's show. Looking into the feasibility of a utility pole being moved; Garza mentions that she has already talked to JJ about the project of moving it to provide for more seating. The Committee is working on the by-laws. The confusion on contract signatures was discussed, and a procedure has been put in place to improve communication to avoid a double booking by requiring two signatures, one by the Fair representative and one by Rodeo Board Chairman in order to make a contract valid. Spiesschaert asks if the current problem regarding the double booking of the clowns has been resolved. Feinauer said, through scheduling there are alternatives that can solve the problem. Vial suggests that we use one clown or the other on the grounds if feasible.

Bill McKinley gives report. Talking with EJD concert 4.Fair Report: services on preparing our big name entertainment line-up. We have been looking for a high quality grounds act. Paige Payne has been investigating in this area. Black Horse productions that does a western act and is local is a possibility for that high quality act. These folks do contracted stunt work for Hollywood studios. They did stunts on the Maverick movie here in Oregon. DuPre gives a short description of the group. McKinley says that there are not that many high quality grounds acts that pencil out and are practical for our needs. Vial mentions that local publicity for Black Horse would be to their advantage. Day asked McKinley if he believed this act is superior to the "pirates" act. McKinley says that the Pirates act is high quality but the Board mentioned that they had seen them at the Fair recently and that it would be nice to find something "new". Vial mentions that the cannon act of last year could have led to an accident in the livestock area because of the noise, asks if this Black Horse act is a high noise act. McKinley says he doesn't know, but doubts that any sound that the act makes will be at the level of the cannon act. The area where the railroad exhibit is discussed as to the best exposure for this location. McKinley mentions that the railroad exhibit relates to the sold landscaping commercial exhibits that are adjacent to the exhibit. Cal Wade mentions that the cost of the railroad exhibit has gone down considerably, given increased sponsorship commitment and the fact that we bought and now can reuse props from the previous year's display. McKinley mentions that he is reviewing service contracts for issuance in late February and March. Food concessions are in the final process of review with some contractors not being invited back. The carnival proposal process is in review with the eve of selecting a contractor soon. We want to visit the candidates winter quarters before selection. We are preparing for the OFA

convention. Paige Payne is involved in the "showcase" entertainment presentation and McKinley manning the "fair foundation" booth. McKinley says he is well along in Air Show preparation. This year the Rose Festival is emphasizing warbirds because they have not been able to procure a jet team. Spiesschaert asked about the Grange moving their exhibit. McKinley mentions that Paige has been working on this and will be having a meeting shortly with her superintendents to discuss a rearrangement in the ME building with the needs of the Grange in mind. Day asked where we were on 4-H sponsorship recognition. Garza mentioned that she had talked to Paige and they agreed to approach John Baggot and tell him we wanted to go forward with published recognition, and that the superintendents would be encouraged to get the pertinent information to him in a timely manner so that the sponsorship credits would be included in the book. Garza explains the difficulty in time-lines in the publication. Vial mentions that the Fair should have a recognition dinner for the superintendents to strengthen our relationship with these important people, Garza and Day concurs. Vial mentions that we should hand out invitations to the Fair, in person, to the County Commissioners.

<u>5.4-H Horse Fair:</u> Sandy Baker gives report. She thanks the Fair and Fair Board for the support of the program, and feels that we are on very positive ground in our relationship. Sandy mentions that the 4-H trailer is going to be gone. (applause) Baker mentions a new scheduling for the gaming events, and that she gave Paige a copy of that new schedule.

6.Marketing Report: Lisa DuPre gives report. Things are going well with interim usage. For wedding events, we are into October in scheduling. New event. Jeep wants to build a course to promote their vehicles for 5 or 6 days. It's all turnkey including any "restoration" of the grounds that may need to be done. We had to turn down another potential user because we did not have enough room in the ME building for a Freightliner event. Again, our not having the facilities will prohibit us from booking profitable events. The 727 project is at the stage where Bruce Campbell is demonstrating by computer and measurement the feasibility to make the move. Getting past the various regulatory bureaucracies is where he is at for the present. We are charging him \$150 a day for the use on of our grounds. Cal Wade mentions the positive publicity we have been getting with the aircraft on our property.

7.Maintenance Report: Earl Bemis gives report. The Maintenance team has been working on restoring the restrooms in the Arts & Crafts building, which is mostly cosmetic work. Patching roofs is on going. Bringing electricity to the Red Storage Shed is proceeding. The water pump is coming off the truck for a rebuild. Albert JR and SR are working on table and furniture repair. Mike Wold has been working on leaf removal and

keeping the drains open. Also tree trimming is going on. Cody asks if the small shed roof on the side of the museum could be looked at because it is leaking.

8.Old Business: (A) Garza talks about the OFA convention and who will be going. (B) Cal Wade talks of the John Thomas memorial, and suggests tabling the process until next Fair Board meeting. Spiesschaert mentions that we are leaning in the direction of dedicating one day of next years' fair to the memory of John Thomas. Wade mentioned that Sally (Thomas) plans to bring their cattle to show next year. (C) Spiesschaert refers to the exiting report submitted by Cal Wade and of the value and usefulness the document brings to future fair operations. Wade distributes the document. (D) Garza refers to the audit and a question the Board raised related to it in last Fair Board meeting. In conversation with Bob Davis and in answer to Garza's question of the status of the audit, his reply is that "it is done" and that they monitor the Fair and it's activities through the monthly paper work we submit. In follow up, Garza mentions a conversation with Susan Walker and that she reiterated much of what Bob Davis had said, that with little exception they have no serious questions as to our financials and our operations that would require an on-sight review. Kathy Christy mentioned Walker's willingness to come to a Board meeting to answer any questions about the audit process. Wade mentions that a more useful audit can be had if the Fair did an "outside" rather than a County directed audit. Garza said she was in conversation with John Dalquist of Jones & Roth in assessing the cost of an outside, independent audit. (E) Spiesschaert inquires about the process of defining mileage reimbursement for Board members. Garza mentions that she had consulted with county council Allen Rapplevea on reviewing the language and format of the mileage document and he said that it was OK. (F) On Western World sponsorship, Garza relates she has not written the letter yet, but will. (G) Wade will be attending a CPO meeting that is coming up that will be dealing with the future development of the Fair Grounds (this in regard to the letter brought by Linda Gray).

<u>9.New Business:</u> (A) Spiesschaert suggests that in the absence of board member, Ken Leahy, that the selection of Fair Board officers be tabled until the next meeting (B) Spiesschaert suggested that when we have a correction to the minutes, that we note the nature of the correction in the corrected minutes. Wade states that he feels that looking back over many years at the minutes, that they have not been very good, not very consistent in documenting policies, this he has discovered in his work on the creation of a unified policy manual for the Fair Complex. (C) Garza mentions the "thank you" letter she received from Linda. (D) Spiesscheart questions what kind of recognition would be in order for departed Board member David Lintz.
