The meeting was called to order by President Lindow at 9:00 P.M.

Minutes of the previous meeting and the special meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. Jim Underwood, representing the Tri-County Fat Lamb Show, met with the board to discuss use of facilities at the Fairgrounds to be used the last Saturday in May for the Lamb show. The board advised him the main exhibit building may not be done by that time but the barns would be available. Mr. Underwood expressed his thanks that that the area used would be cleaned and left in good condition.

Mrs. O'Shay and Mrs. Rayburn, of the Portland Unit of EMBAA, presented the board with tentative plans to stage a style show with all proceeds to go the the Fair. Methodist Church wolld be used instead of the Armory since the facilities are more adequate. Seeting 500 - 600. Last week in September. Furrier in Portland to furnish garmets. Jane Erickson moderator. Will have film, story of mink farming. Music donated, Lighting to be rented for \$25.00. Rent of chruch \$2.00. Budget set at \$100.00. Models donating time. Fair board to supply tickets. Garden clubs to decorate. Tickets would be on sale during the fair. If ticket sales showed that there was great interest, the show could possibly set for two consecutive mights. There would be close to \$100,000 worth of garments shows. Mrs. O'Shay stated it wolld be a nice gesture of the Fair board to offer the furrier additional insurance. She felt he would have ample. Mr. Danielson made a motion to continue planning for this event. Mr. Johnson seconded. These representives will meet with the board again at a later date.

Mr. Howard Gilliam and Anita Kanzler attended the meeting. Mr. Gilliam reported on plans for the Lamb show and the possible need for more money. Mr. Johnson made a motion to make facitilities available for the lamb show. Mr. Danielson seconded. Motion carried.

The board discussed the shyle show funds and agrred that the proceeds should definetily be earmarked for a certain building on the gounds. The 1-H dormitory was suggested.

The contract concerning the rebuilding was discussed. Mr. Mallary advised Mr. Ball that they would not be using the blocks and that the 4-H Leaders Association

could have them. Also, he advised that the pilasters on the building be reinforced with steel rods and concrete at the cost of less that \$100.00. He felt this contributed the to the collapse since the original building did not have this done. The Board agreed this be done. The contract was not signed since the confirmation did not come from the Commission ers regarding the insurance money. Mr. Lindow stated he would try to get in touch with them and obtain confirmation. He took the contract and bonds so that if he were able to get action, he could sign the contract and give a comy to Mr. Herb Mohr.

The Secretary advised the board, she had checked with Mr. Graham about the insurance on the old barn, and it was not insured. The question of it being in a safe condition was raised. Mr. Ball stated this barn is still a very sturdy building.

The position of placement for the new cow barn and chacken barn was disc seed. The new cow barn will be placed east of the show rings with additions kept in mind. The poultry building will be placed east of the Hobby Hall.

Mr. Lindow advised the Secretary to get in touch with the Rabbit Association to see if they are still interested in exhibiting at the fair.

Mhe Secretary informed the board that the motorcyle races will not be held since that date has been held for two years for a meet in Salem. She stated the Active club is still working on some type of enteratinment.

Mr. Ball suggested that the Active club be hired to park cars.

The resolution from the Pomona Grange was read (copy attached). The board suggested the Pomana grange meet with the board. The Pomona Grange is sending a committed to the next meeting and at that time the drawing for booth space will be discussed.

The thought of having Mr. Mareks' Civil War carams program open the fair was discussed. The board felt t is would not create enough; interest unless the governor could be here to make more of an official opening ceremony.

The Secretay asked if Mrs. Marge Davies could again be hired at \$50.00 to set up the Talent Shows. Board agrred.

The following bills were presen ed for payment:

Mr. Danielson made a motion athat the bills be paid. Mr. Johnson seconded. Motion carred.
