MOTION: MOVED BY JERRY BOYER AND SECONDED BY RALPH HOLLAND TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDED JUDGES FEES OF \$30.00 PER FULL DAY, \$15.00 MAXIMUM LODGING, 12¢ PER MILE, AND NO MEAL ALLOWANCE. MOTION CAPRIED.

ENTERTAINMENT FORMAT INPUT

Mr. Boyer noted that the entertainment for Fair 52 worked very well and suggested that the entertainment format for Fair 53 be the same.

It was suggested that the open class Horse Show commence Thursday, 2:00 p.m., August 3, 1978 instead of the 6:00 p.m. time at the 1977 Fair.

MOTION: MOVED BY JERRY BOYER, SECONDED BY RALPH HOLLAND FOR THE HORSE SHOW TO COMMENCE AT THE EARLIER TIME OF 2:00 P.M. MOTION CARRIED.

OVERVIEW FOR BOND ELECTION PROGRESS Joan Smith presented the Fact Sheet that is available for use in presenting the Bond and Serial Election campaign information. Mrs. Smith has already spoken to the Beaverton Chamber of Commerce with positive reception. The preparation for the election that has been done thus far seems to be noticed favorably.

The tabloid brochure will be mailed to approximately 4,000 open class exhibitors, grangers, 4-H and FFA families, and 500 selected farmers. The brochure will be incorporated into the surrounding community newspapers and distributed to as many stores, banks, etc., as possible.

OVERVIEW (CONT.) A second mailing of a legal size postcard will be sent the week of February 13, 1978 as a follow up reminder to vote.

A scale model of the proposed fairgrounds/museum will be available Monday to be used when speaking. It will also be taken for display at many businesses etc. to reach as many voters as possible.

Postcards will also be available for personal endorsements.

A news conference will be held at the fairgrounds/museum Thrusday, January 12 at 10:00 a.m. A fact sheet will be given along with a brief summation by Mrs. Smith and Adeline Hesse, followed by a brief tour of the fairgrounds and county museum.

Hillsboro Kiwanis have indicated they would be happy to help with the campaign.

January 16, Monday, Shute Hall, 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. will be the V.I.P. Kick-Off of the Fairground/Museum Bond Election Promotion Campaign. Jerry Boyer will welcome and introduce elected officials, Commissioner Miller Duris will give the Commissioners' greeting and endorsement. Mrs. Hesse will summarize the goals of the fairgrounds, and Dick Matthews will present the museum goals. Mrs. Smith will present the campaign history and up date the fairground and museum situation. Mr. Boyer will then ask for questions. Refreshments will be served by Mrs. Boyer, Mrs. Holland, Mrs. Evers, Mrs. Springer, and Mrs. Colegrove.

If funds allow, paid newspaper advertising will be used just prior to election time.

The Fair Board wishes to extend sincere appreciation to Mrs. Smith for her help in the promotion of the campaign and extends their vote of confidence.

SEE FABRIC AND DECORATING Mrs. Hesse received correspondence from See Fabric and Decorating stating the cost for rental of a 40' x 60' tent as \$912.00 with lights and a \$50.00 set up fee. The senior citizens as well as the audience for entertainment need protection from the weather, sunny or rain. It was felt that a larger size - 40' x 80' would be more suitable.

MOTION: MOVED BY JIM SPRINGER, SECONDED BY JERRY BOYER THAT MRS. HESSE NEGOTIATE FOR A TENT. MOTION CARRIED.

BILL FOR
INSURANCE FROM
COUNTY

A bill from the County for comprehensive insurance was received in the amount of \$1510.80 for October 1, 1977 through October 1, 1978. The Fair Board was unaware of this expense coming due and it was not a budgeted item.

MOTION: MOVED BY CHARLES COLEGROVE, SECONDED BY RALPH HOLLAND THAT THE INSURANCE BE PAID AT A RATE OF \$125.00 PER MONTH UNTIL PAID IN FULL. MOTION CARRIED.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Because the bank statement did not arrive until the Fair Board meeting date, the financial statement will be presented at the next Fair Board meeting.

EMPLOYMENT
DIVISION LETTER

Correspondence from the State of Oregon Employment Division, Department of Human Resources stated three reimbursement options.

MOTION: MOVED BY JERRY BOYER, SECONDED BY RALPH HOLLAND THAT THE FAIR BOARD ACCEPT MANAGEMENTS RECOMMENDATION TO OPT FOR THE NEW STATE TRUST FUND WITH THE 1.6 PERCENTAGE RATE OF GROSS WAGES. MOTION CARRIED.

MILKING PARLOR REPORT

Mr. Colegrove reported that the Milk Parlor Committee met at the fairgrounds on Tuesday, January 10th at 10:00 a.m. Don Anderson will request a grant from Reader's Digest. The committee has asked that the Fair Board consider budgeting \$7,000 toward the construction and drainage for a new milk parlor. The rest of the funds will be raised by the committee. Mr. Colegrove reported that the Milk Parlor Committee revised sketches for the new building to change a doorway because of the food concession location. The new location for the milk parlor was discussed.

Mr. Evers indicated the committee would like to sell miniature plastic cow figurines to raise revenue for the new milk parlor.

MOTION: MOVED BY JERRY BOYER, SECONDED BY JIM SPRINGER THAT THE MILK PARLOR COMMITTEE IS AUTHORIZED TO PROCEED WITH THE DAIRY COW PROMOTION ITEMS. MOTION CARRIED.

DARIGOLD BILL

A bill for \$90.00 from Darigold was received by the Fair Board for hauling and installing coolers, and removing and cleaning coolers. This charge is reasonable although no notification of a charge was received, prior to Fair 52.

The Fair Board requested that notification of any charges prior to an event would be appreciated and stated that a milk fund is being started and donations are being accepted.

DARIGOLD BILL (CONTINUED)

MOTION: MOVED BY CHARLES COLEGROVE, SECONDED BY RALPH HOLLAND THAT THE \$90.00 BE REMITTED TO DARIGOLD. MOTION CARRIED.

BID ON 1949 TRUCK A bid in the amount of \$75.00 was received for purchase of the 1949 Dodge Truck, flat bed with dump.

MOTION: MOVED BY JERRY BOYER, SECONDED BY CHARLES COLEGROVE TO ACCEPT THE BID IN THE AMOUNT OF \$75.00 FOR THE 1949 DODGE TRUCK CURRENTLY ON THE FAIRGROUNDS. MOTION CARRIED.

4-H AWARDS

The premium book deadline for award listing is March 1. Because of the early date many people are not yet thinking of Fair time, therefore award offerings are presented as late as July 1st. The Fair Board recommends that the 4-H organize the committee to review those offerings that come in too late for the premium book and at that time can either be approved or disapproved. If approved, notification can be given that there will be no advertising in the premium book, because of the late date.

PRINTING BID

A bid for the printing of the premium book was received October 27, 1977 from the Hillsboro Argus. For 3,000 open class and 2,200 4-H books the amount is \$2238.91. For 3,500 open class and 2,200 4-H books cost is \$2343.70.

MOTION: MOVED BY RALPH HOLLAND, SECONDED BY JIM SPRINGER TO ACCEPT THE BID OF \$2343.70 FOR 3,500 OPEN GLASS AND 2,200 4-H PREMIUM BOOKS. MOTION CARRIED.

PUBLIC SERVICE EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT A review of the Public Service Employment Agreement was presented for the Fair Board Chairman's signature.

MOTION: MOVED BY CHARLES COLEGROVE, SECONDED BY RALPH HOLLAND TO ACCEPT THE PUBLIC SERVICE EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT AS PRESENTED. MOTION CARRIED.

4-H MEETING

Hesse, Colegrove, Boyer and Holland attended a 4-H Horse Meeting on January 9th. The 4-H Horse Committee expressed the wish to become part of the County Fair July 28 - August 2. They indicated that only the horse barns will be used. There would be intense supervision. There is a change for open class in that the open class dairy goats and 4-H would come in later for one day of the Fair. The 4-H will take care of the arena. Mrs. Hesse related that on Tuesday, official opening day of the Fair, gates will be manned and admission will be charged. However, 4-H parents would be entitled to purchase season passes for half price.

4-H MEETING (CONTINUED)

The Fair Board is pleased to have the 4-H Horse participation in the fair. The Board recommends that the tie stalls be removed as they are a hazard.

HORSE SUPERINTENDENT Gail Anthony was recommended for the position of Open Class Horse Superintendent. She with her family has been active in horse related activities for many years.

MOTION: MOVED BY JERRY BOYER, SECONDED BY CHARLES COLEGROVE TO APPOINT GAIL ANTHONY AS OPEN CLASS HORSE SUPERINTENDENT. MOTION CARRIED.

ESTIMATED RATE FOR BOND ISSUE

Mrs. Hesse read correspondence from County Counsel Larry Derr. It stated the estimated maximum tax rate per thousand dollars of true cash value to pay for the \$5,410,000 bond issue is 11½c. This estimate of 11½c per thousand is based upon the following assumptions: the bonds are sold on a twenty year maturity schedule with a level annual debt service and an average interest rate of 5 3/4%; the first tax levy is in fiscal year 1978-79. Due to increases in total assessed value of the County, subsequent year's tax levies may be at a lower rate than the estimate.
