Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert called the meeting to order at 4:35.

[correction of November 3, 1999 minutes; page 20, line 12, word 5, replace "He" with Cody, same line, 8<sup>th</sup> word, replace "their" with "the committee's"]

A discussion in the clarification of the fair dates ensues with Rich Vial amending the motion of November 3, 1999 to read;

The fair date would be set beginning on Tuesday and including the last Friday of July, and ending on Sunday. Kathy Christy seconds the motion. The motion carries.

1. Consent Agenda: Margaret Garza gives the report. Garza reviews comments and explains the Fair Complex financial position for the month of November.

Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls for a motion to accept the consent agenda. Kathy Christy moves that the consent agenda / minutes be accepted as corrected. Sheila Day seconds, the motion passes.

2. Fair Organization's Report, Maintenance Report: Albert Flanagan Sr. gives report. Flanagan said the he and Flanagan Jr. have been setting up and breaking

down events. Kelly Goodin has been doing work on the Booster's building reroofing, and fixing leaks in the Floral building. Mike Wold has been doing the yard work and collecting the leaves that have fallen and unplugging drains. Jim Jordan is doing maintenance and tune ups on the various rigs. Garza mentioned that Goodin was working on the entryway to the front office. Day mentioned the possibility Goodin may be trained on the grader. Garza said that we would like to pursue a training program through the County Land Use and Transportation Department (LUT).

3. Old Business: (A) Executive Director Review. Lyle Spiesschaert collects review material from all Board members. Spiesschaert then proposes a discussion on the selection of a date and time for Garza's review. Kathy Christy said that we are very late in doing this review given that September 1, was Garza's anniversary date. The date of Monday, December 20, 1999 at 12 noon until 2:00 PM at Ken Leahy's office was selected. Spiesschaert will collect all the comments from Board members and compile them into a composite. (B) Fischer Donation (Hot N' Now) Garza leads the discussion. Garza mentioned that she had procured a quote of \$30,000 from Gene Zurbrugg Construction on moving the structure, putting in footings, do some site work, providing some new siding and offered to put a new roof on the building because it was pretty "chopped up" on top. Garza informed Zurbrugg that the structure is a "three phase" electrical facility, Zurbrugg said that to get three phase here it would cost an additional fifteen to twenty thousand dollars. Garza also asked Zurbrugg if he looked inside and ascertained what equipment that we may need. Zurbrugg said yes but that would be something that we needed to determine. Garza's research indicated that the cost for that equipment would be an additional approximate \$7,500 from restaurant equipment providers such as Boxer Northwest, Marcus and others. Zurbrugg said that the cost will have to remain "approximate" until locally approved detailed-engineered drawings were available. Zurbrugg said he did not think the building was in that great of shape, and if it were him, he wouldn't accept the structure given the expense to make it viable. Discussion. Garza presents amortization data for recovery of investment. Spiesschaert advises caution in the interpretation of that data. Garza's recommendation is to not accept the Fischer donation given the potential cost of making it ready for use based on the numbers. And that we do not have that money in the budget for this year for this unexpected / unbudgeted expense. Further, if we go ahead with the development scenario, where will we get the additional capital to do that? Kathy Christy clarifies that the building is being offered as a gift. Spiesschaert said he thinks that it's a real valuable building but seeing what Garza learned and all these unknown costs, the bigger picture is that we are pretty well committed to re-development unless it's a perfect match. Christy asks if the 50 to 70 thousand

dollars could be better spent on existing buildings like the Cloverleaf or Main Exhibit Hall buildings. Spiesschaert asks Garza to write an appropriate letter that explains our reasoning for not accepting the donation. Spiesschaert thanks Garza for her research work on the project. (C) Policy Manual: Status and Update. Rich Vial leads discussion. Vial believes that we need to adopt a "policy on policies". Vial said that we first must see how policies are adopted, make a "book", then that same book would keep a copy of all of the resolutions that we adopt, then synthesize it into a half a dozen policies, "chunks" of this that will be the first ones we adopt. Vial said that he should have that ready by next [Board] meeting. Vial proposes a strategy that would avail itself to public review. There will be a section in there that will allow for emergency policies. Spiesschaert endorses the process for public review. Spiesschaert asks if it could be ready so it can be put into the mailing packet for the January 5, 2000 Fair Board meeting. Vial said yes. Garza said that we would need the material by the 29th of December to be able to make the mailing. Vial said that he would have it made available by the 28th of December. (D) CPO Newsletter Update, Sheila Day leads the discussion. Day said that through the Extension Office that our input would be of a "generic" nature and would go out at various times, not one set time. Spiesschaert mentioned that Day will be writing the articles and Garza will review for accuracy. Spiesschaert said that we may or may not use this medium for release to the media, and that Spiesschaert asked Day to follow up in writing [to Extension] as to what we are doing. (E) Parking "Grades", Spiesschaert asked Leahy if he had come to the Fairgrounds to do the "grades" for the parking lot. Leahy said that he had not.

4. New Business: (A) Fair Complex Capital Expenditures. Margaret Garza leads the discussion. Garza passes out a sheet prioritizing a potential ten capital items. Garza tells the Board that in the capital expenditures line item; (511-515) we have the monies to expend through June 30, 2000, of approximately \$49,527.00. First item is a used small pickup. Garza gives the rationale' for the need for this vehicle. Garza then rationalizes the need for the other capital expenditure items on the list. Leahy mentions the option of "leasing" fuel tanks. Discussion. McKinley reviews the public address system and the options to refurbish and improve. McKinley's suggestion is to consult with a sound specialist like a Larry Carroll to more accurately assess our alternatives. Vial mentioned his problem areas were the show ring and the preparation area. Vial said that it might be as easy as just turning a horn in the proper direction. Spiesschaert said that he believed there was an offer, not sure how official, by the Livestock Association to pay for some upgrades. Garza said that she did not know about that. Spiesschaert said that he thought it was totally inexcusable for the kids and for those bidding thousands of dollars in the auction not to be able to hear the

auctioneer. Vial gives the name of Ron Rau as the person to call who is in the Livestock Association. Spiesschaert asked where the "numbers" on the Toro diesel rebuild came from. McKinley said from Jim Jordan and the research he had done. Spiesschaert said it's important to know because sometimes these overhauls cost more than the machinery is worth. Garza mention she did some independent research with New Holland and that question was asked. Discussion. Garza said that items 1-5 (small pickup, diesel mower, telephones, computer networking & internet connection, interim equipment) will run \$33,428 and if we go with a new diesel mower, it will put us close to our \$49,000 figure. Spiesschaert said that we need the equipment, in that's how we make money and urged approval on items 3,4,5, (telephones, computer networking, interim equipment [stage,50 folding chairs, stanchions]). The Board then granted the authority for the expenditure. Spiesschaert said that we need to do something with the caretaker's home. Discussion. Spiesschaert and Leahy said that they would go over to the home and see how unlivable the place is. Leahy suggested that they do the inspection at the same time he looks at the grades for the parking lot. Spiesschaert summarizes, the pickup is a "go" but try to get a better deal on it. Garza said that there is an auction coming up and if there is an opportunity there and have to move quickly, she would like to call Spiesschaert or Leahy on a purchase approval. Leahy suggests that we should look at a new mower on perhaps a payment schedule. Vial said, make a lump sum of money price of say \$20,000 and make the staff responsible for purchasing the pickup and the diesel mower. Discussion. Garza said in summary that we should hold off until January on the diesel mower, if there is a great opportunity on the pickup, call Spiesschaert or Leahy for approval. Spiesschaert asks to have a "criteria" in regard to the computer networking and asks, if in the price, that includes the web page construction. Garza said it did. Vial suggests "direct posting" interactive capability, like to be made available for the superintendents. Spiesschaert says that worse than no web page is a web page that is not maintained. Garza suggests that a distinction on the web page should be made between the fair as an event, and that of interim usage. Vial suggests a "dynamic site" whereby the input into the site does not have to come from one single person. Spiesschaert says in summary that we are going to let Kelly Goodin address the re-roofing needs for the floral building, and then report back on his suggestions. Garza said in her discussions with Goodin and the maintenance team, that the floral building roof is an issue that we can address in the next fiscal year. With the sound system we are going to try to find out where the weak spots are and then address them with a limited amount of funds. Christy asks if the Booster's may have money to put into this [sound system]. Garza said that they (Booster's) asked for ideas where to spend their money, and that the "auction committee" may have money as well. Spiesschaert mentions

that Margaret will be looking into the fire suppression system for St. Matthew's booth to see if we can find some alternatives to the high dollar remedy that the Fire Marshal advanced. Spiesschaert thanks Garza and staff for the research work done on these capital expenditures items. (B) IAFE Update, Garza gives update. Garza mentions the considerable expense of Big Name entertainment. Vial asks what is the cost of an act like Three Dog Night. McKinley said approximately 30-35 thousand dollars. Garza talked about the workshops and round tables. The Trade Show went daily from 1-5 PM and she brought back many things for McKinley and Payne to review. Good networking with knowledgeable people but recommend that there is so much there that two people should go next year rather than one. (C) NFR Update, Sheila Day gives update. Day said that Spiesschaert and her went to some exceptionally good, speaker presentations, especially on advertising, hospitality and promotional things. We went to some of the larger sessions that were really good, and we did have our members attending. The presentations were really professional. Day also said that Skoal Girl was good and presented many good ideas and they do a lot. Spiesschaert said one of our goals for being there was to build relationships of trust and respect with the Rodeo Committee and Associates. I hope we improved that as we tried to do. General discussion about NFR.

- <u>5. General Correspondence</u>. Lyle Spiesschaert mentions that Garza has the correspondence for the Board to review that is mostly from 4-H.
- 6. Announcements: (A) Next Fair Board meeting. Next Fair Board meeting is January 5, 2000. Garza suggests that we contribute the minimum to the Foundation, and that staff can respond to the questions. (refer to correspondence)

Thank you for taking the time to meet with us to discuss the proposed plan for Portland General Electric Company (PGE) to install new underground lines along NE 28<sup>th</sup> Ave. where it borders your property.

As we stated in the meeting PGE must add new distribution lines in order to accommodate new growth in the area. We will be installing these new lines north from the light rail tracks past the fairgrounds and through a portion of the airport property. In the area between the light rail tracks and NE Cornell Road, the lines will be underground and there will be underground vaults placed about every 600 feet. These vaults will be placed strategically so that they will not interfere with ingress or egress to your property. They will also have vault lids designed to allow a vehicle to cross over them if it becomes necessary.

We have been informed that there is a good possibility that NE 28<sup>th</sup> will be improved in the near future which means that the street will be widened. Because of that and other considerations PGE would like to avoid future problems and additional costs by installing these new lines outside the current right-of-way. This means that we need to obtain an easement from you. The easement requirements would be twelve (12) feet wide and would run along the West Side of your property from the light rail tracks to NE Cornell Road. PGE will design this project so as not to disturb the trees that are currently growing along NE 28<sup>th</sup> Ave. It is my understanding that you met with Dave Elliott at the site and it was agreed that PGE would bore about four hundred (400) feet under a row of trees near the south end of the property so as not to disturb their root system. Of course we will return the ground to as close as possible the same condition as it was prior to the project.

This project is scheduled to start approximately in the late spring of 2000 so we would like to complete this transaction as soon as possible in order to finish our design work in time. We would be happy to meet with your board or answer any questions you or your board might have regarding this project at your convenience. You may call me at (503)

ORS 271.310 allows the Board to sell, "any part of their interest in" its property for which there no further need. ORS 275.110 allows the Board to sell "less than the whole fee" of property its owns through the sheriff sale process. You can avoid a sheriff sale (auction) if the property is worth less than \$5,000. If it is less than \$5,000, you can conduct a sale through private negotiations. If the easement is worth more than \$5,000, let me know and I will do some further research. It would appear ridiculous to auction off an easement. Once the auction took place and there were no buyers, then the negotiations could be conducted by private sale. The County appraisal staff may be able to assist you with a value. Larry Strong at x8652 is the supervisor.

The Fair Board, as business managers of the Fairgrounds, makes the determination that the property is not needed for a public purpose, sets the price, and negotiates the sale. The County Board then concurs and authorizes the sale.

Dear Floyd,

I am responding on behalf of the Washington County Fair Board to your November 30, 1999 letter in questioning the organizing of the Oregon Fairs Foundation. I think it is accurate to say that our fair board members are uncomfortable, given they have not been a part of the process, in answering the questions presented in the letter. First of all, with the goals and process of the Foundation apparently still not specifically established by consensus, it would be difficult, for one, to recommend professionals who would be willing to generate money and/or be willing to serve on the board of directors. It would be equally difficult to comment with any degree of confidence as to the make up of the Foundation Board given the uncertainty and unresolved issues posed in the correspondence.

It appears that concerns of some kind have surfaced sometime after your presentation at spring conference. A question that has come to staff is that it seems as though we have returned to "square one" in terms of defining the direction of the Foundation, and we assumed we had come to a consensus on this cornerstone understanding. As in item #1, we thought that we pretty much had designed and put to bed the framework of an acceptable process whereby fairs could be funded in perpetuity based on an annuity derived from the interest from a foundation generated principle. Are we reopening this basic premise? Further, there appears to be in item #3 the question posed for the potential, at bottom line, of the larger fairs to be subsidizing, through the Foundation, the smaller fairs based on a percentage of attendance driven "assessment"?, after reading the item, is this a fair assumption to make?

I look forward to our meeting at OFA to thoroughly discuss these issues and others outlined in your November 30<sup>th</sup> letter and beyond where necessary. Please call me if advisable in establishing a time and date for a much-needed Foundation committee meeting, preferably during OFA? The Washington County Fair and Rodeo will reserve in contributing to the Foundation fund until the basic issues concerning the Foundation's direction and philosophy are firmly established.
