Ken Leahy calls the meeting to order with the standard welcome to the audience.

Leahy talks about the death of Fair Board Chairman John Thomas. Reflects on how much can change from one meeting to the next. Dedicates this meeting to John, recommends naming or dedicating something in his memory. Suggests looking into that further later on. Margaret Garza suggests running through the agenda items then giving everyone the chance to reflect on John.

1. Consent Agenda: Margaret Garza gives report, going over November 1998 financial position. General discussion takes place regarding financial report. David Lintz comments it would be interesting to see a month-by-month chart of income & expenses. Requested the opportunity to see it for the last several months.

Leahy calls for a motion to accept the consent agenda. Lyle Spiesschaert so moves, Sheila Day seconds, the motion passes.

- 2. Rodeo Report: Cody Feinauer says a group representing the rodeo went to Las Vegas and signed all contracts. Said in speaking to those that come to our rodeo who go to other rodeos, they think this rodeo's biggest problem is lack of promotions on the part of the Rodeo Board. Said Rodeo Board will look into ways to get the rodeo's name out more and improve that aspect, especially focusing on more than just advertising in Hillsboro, and look into getting the name out more on the Eastside. Speisschaert asks if it was participants who made these observations. Feinauer says, no, it was the announcer, stock contractors, and the like who made the comments and he said he didn't know what they based the comments on. Garza suggests before spending money on further advertising, make sure there's not duplication between what the Fair Complex staff is doing and what the Rodeo Board is doing. Feinauer says they will coordinate that effort to prevent duplication. In other matters, Feinauer says the bullfights should be back again and the bullfighters are signed, and it's a matter of waiting for the final word from Wrangler. Feinauer asks if money has come in from Power Rents. Garza confirms that the entire \$15,000 check has arrived. Feinauer says Rodeo is working on getting sponsors tied down earlier and finding more sponsors. Adds that Rooster Kirsten and Lecil Harris are the clowns that have been signed.
- 3. 4-H Horse Fair: Garza says Sandy Baker called to say she couldn't attend this meeting, but reported things are going well.
- 4. Fair Report: Bill McKinley is out of town, but Cal Wade reports that grounds acts are coming along great and there still are a few openings to fill. Says nothing has been confirmed yet for signing the Pirates of the Carribean, but it's being worked on. The major entertainment is also still being looked into and will continue for some time. The carnival contract is in progress.
- <u>5. Marketing Report:</u> Lisa DuPre' reports nearly all of the 1999 contracts have been renewed and those yet to be signed are the current December events and a few others waiting to work out details. Says Fair Complex buildings are already very full for 1999. Spiesschaert asks if contracts are renewed at the same rate or if changes are made. Garza says the prices have been very constant for a number of years and she and DuPre' have been discussing pros and cons of raising costs now or waiting to see if new facility develops. DuPre' says the lease price does go up for some events because they choose to change things and lease more for the next year. Garza says, for the most part, most of those leasing, for example, the Main Exhibit Hall, are anxious to have a new, bigger facility to move into, and appear to be prepared

to pay more. DuPre' says most have expressed an awareness and expectation of increased costs with new buildings. Leahy asks if those who voice concerns about the new facility are worried that it will be too expensive or too big. DuPre' says most are very positive and want a new facility and simply want to get into it. Says if they have concerns, it's merely about how the transition would be done, and can they count on having a building there in the years ahead if they commit to a contract. Wade confirms DuPre's comments and says the concerns aren't negative from the tenants but more of "I'll believe it when I see it," related to getting a new facility to lease. DuPre' says a number of people are ready to bring events here and spend the money, but the available buildings and dates aren't there for them. Wade adds there are also former tenants who were forced to leave because they out-grew the facility, but eagerly want to come back. Garza says there also are a number of local organizations whom have brought their meetings to the Complex and want to bring their national organization's events here, but we just don't have the facility to do it.

- 6. Maintenance Report: Michael Wold says a couple of pieces of equipment are back from the shop after getting repaired. Boat storage is just about complete, with still 1 or 2 to possibly arrive. Questions were posed by Lintz and Leahy about the cost to store a boat and whether tenants are allowed to work on them.
- 7. Old Business: Garza directs the board to refer to page 29 of the meeting packet which is the County Counsel's response to the Fair Board's questions about travel allocations for Fair Board members. Garza says County Counsel says the board can go ahead with that, and choose an amount that they feel would be appropriate and cost-effective, but not to make it retroactive, and begin it on a designated date in the future. Sheila Day suggests going ahead with starting the allocation as of January 1, 1999. Speisschaert says there needs to be a definition of what a "Fair Meeting" is. Lintz says a "Fair Meeting" should be anything involving a meeting on Fair matters, not strictly the monthly Fair Board meeting. Garza says things like the OFA Convention are fully reimbursed expenses, and are different from the meeting/travel allocation issue being discussed. Speisschaert asks if mileage is included for traveling to things like the OFA Convention and Garza says yes, it always has been. Speisschaert suggests establishing a board expense policy so it will be very clear what compensation is given and how board members will receive it. Lintz proposes a flat fee of \$20, based on a \$15 fee and \$5 of expenses for local area Fair Board business-related affairs. Says this should be totally separate from fully reimbursed events like the OFA convention.

Lintz makes a motion that any meeting for Fair Board business-related matters or events, attended by a Fair Board member, is compensated at a rate of \$20 per meeting or event, which includes a mileage expense within Washington County, therefore mileage cannot be paid for any mileage traveled within the borders of Washington County. For such Fair Board business-related matters or events happening outside of Washington County, Fair Board members will be compensated for mileage at the current government-allowed mileage rate, as measured in miles traveled to that meeting from the Washington County Fair Complex. Effective January 1, 1999, this will be established as the Fair Board Travel Policy. Further, as part of the Fair Board Travel Policy, all actual expenses shall be reimbursed and mileage paid to and from fair-related events, such as conventions. Further, the County Fair Board per diem meal allowance will follow the Washington County per diem meal allowance. Spiesschaert seconds it, the motion passes.

- 7.B OFA Convention: Garza says Speisschaert and Day have indicated an interest in attending the OFA Convention in January and the information was passed out. Garza asks for quick decisions from anyone still thinking about attending.
- 7.C Audit Response to Bob Davis: Garza says there were 2 items she responded to Davis about and copies of the response are distributed to board members. One item was in response to the accounting system. Garza says she informed Davis that the Fair Complex was moving forward in working with Jones and Roth on the new accounting software. The second item was in reference to the Fair Complex Local Government Income Pool Account (LGIP). Garza says the County had wanted the Fair Complex to put those dollars into the County fund. Garza says she did some research and spoke with Lane County, which had faced a similar situation, and the Attorney General's opinion was that once the money was distributed from the County to the Fair Board, the Board has full authority to make decisions regarding those funds and how they're used. Garza says she has the actual copy of the opinion from the Department of Justice if Board members want to look at it more closely. Says she has not heard anything at this point from Bob Davis. Wade says Washington County Counsel has backed the Attorney General's opinion. Garza and Wade comment that they haven't heard anything about the annual County audit, and no one came in October. Wade comments that an individual audit report is never given to each county department. Lintz requests to find out how much it would cost the Fair Complex to have it's own audit done. Says it might be wise to have an independent audit done for the Fair Board's own protection.

7-D Additional Old Business: Christy asked about letter from Committee for Citizen Involvement presented at the November 4, 1998 Board meeting by Linda Gray. Says she was approached by a Committee member who said they hadn't received a response yet. Wade says the intent was to attend an earlier meeting but he was told the agenda was full, so plans are to have a representative of the Fair Complex at their next meeting in January of 1999.

Garza says in one additional bit of old business, she has the year-end report from the Fair Boosters if any board member would like to see it. Sheila Day comments that a Fair Booster mentioned to her they don't feel that the Fair board supports them, and members don't attend booster meetings like they used to. Garza says Wade has suggested that, with his departure, some of the Fair Board members may want to become more involved with the boosters, showing some support of their activities. Wade says, reading from his departure interview, that the board members should become booster members and attend meetings whenever possible, and should realize the importance of the group to the success of the Fair Complex. He says as an effort is made to gain public support for the development programs, the boosters are a tremendous asset and through them, they can help develop public hearings, and when the Fair Complex presents public programs to groups like the CPOs the boosters can go along, and their mere presence can answer a lot of concerned questions.

Leahy says he thinks if one Fair Board member could attend the meetings, on a rotating basis, that would be helpful. Christy suggests the board members look at their calendars and at the next meeting, sign up for attending future booster meetings.

8. Announcements: Leahy says Christy will run out John Thomas' term as Chairman. Says she is aware of all of the issues, including the development and will be an asset to the board. Spiesschaert asks whose term on the board is expiring. Garza says it's Lintz's term that expires.

Leahy calls for a motion for adjournment, Kathy Christy so moves, Lyle Spiessschaert seconds, motion passes. Meeting adjourned at 6:20 PM.

Washington County Rodeo Directors Meeting December 7, 1998

In Attendance: Cody F., Gary P., Laurie B., Larry B., Gary M., Mike B. and Brian A. Arny W. was absent and excused. Minutes were taken by Connie P.

Meeting was held at the Washington County Fairplex Cloverleaf Building and called to order at 7:00 PM by Cody F.

Cody informed the directors that the Fair Board had received a contract signed by Leisel Harris for \$4000 to be our clown for next years rodeo. Unfortunately, Rooster Kersten has already been signed for \$3200, by Cody, in Las Vegas. Cody will speak to Bill McKinley on the Fair Board about this matter, as Cody's signature was not on the document. It was thought that unless Leisel could find another rodeo in this part of the country that we may have two clowns.

All other rodeo contracts are signed.

Cody announced that John Thomas had passed away and that Ken Layhe will replace him as Fair Board chairman.

The Dodge contract has gone up \$159.00 from last year. There was some discussion as to how to involve the Dodge people more in the rodeo and get them coming to meetings.

The Coors proposal was sent to Mt. Hood Beverages. There was some discussion as to the benefits of our rodeo being a Coors Shoot-out Rodeo to draw more cowboys.

The same three bullfighters will be in attendance next year. They are Danny Newman, Loyd Ketchum, Rowdy Barry.

Cody announced that the rodeo will run from Wednesday night through Saturday night for the next two years, foregoing the previous Sunday matinee. Cody also brought up the idea of printing up and giving out a rodeo program complete with day sheets. He showed an example of one, with four pages, which could be printed at a cost of \$1000. per page to sponsors. We would pay half and the sponsors would pay half of the cost of printing. The program would be given out to all rodeo attendees.

Cody said there is a real need for sponsor hospitality and that we need to organize a committee to start working on this immediately. He suggested those people might be Connie Price, Julie Finauer, Laurie Benton and Kate Gregory.

Meeting was held at the Washington County Fairplex Cloverleaf Building and called to order at 7:30 PM. by Cody F.

Cody presented the award that was given by John Growney to the Washington County Rodeo in Las Vegas. The award was given for the rodeo "Most likely to add a few inches to the waistline". He likes the way we feed um!

Cody announced that John Thomas had passed away and that he had sent flowers from the rodeo board and attended the service. Ken Layhe is taking over as chairman of the Fair Board.

There was some discussion on the Las Vegas convention. Gary McVey was told by some that we need to promote our rodeo more. He picked up a committee guide that had suggestions on how to do that. He also said that there was a kit to be had with ideas. Gary also said that we need to invite sponsors to the convention but that this year we failed to invite them in due time. He also reiterated that everyone on the board and associate board is responsible to find rodeo sponsors, no matter how large or small. We need a \$20,000 main sponsor for next year if Power Rents bows out. One problem, Cody said, is that there are not many events left to be sponsored.

Jeff liked the Rodeo convention packet and thought it would be a good idea for our sponsors to get the same kind of thing. Also, couldn't we shuttle sponsors to the rodeo with the sponsors name on the side of the bus? At the very least if we invite sponsors to the next Las Vegas convention that we should chauffeur them and give them special treatment.

John noticed at John Growney's party that other rodeos had banners or easels with pictures of their rodeo on them for display. We could do the same thing to let people know who we are.

Cody introduced the idea of giving out a rodeo program complete with day sheets. He showed an example of one, with four pages, which could be printed at a cost of \$1000 per page to sponsors. We would split the cost of printing. The program would be given out to all rodeo attendees. Anyone who wants to be on this committee please volunteer.

Margrit was also told we need to promote ourselves better and that we need to up our advertising budget and that we spend more on our queen than we do our advertising budget. She suggested we use our queen in more ways.

Cody announced that the rodeo will run from Wednesday night through Saturday night for the next two years, foregoing the Sunday matince. He said that the draft horses will be on Saturday with the possibility of a crash-up derby on Sunday.

Margrit mentioned John Growney's idea of bringing people behind the scenes of the rodeo to show them how the animals are treated. The problem might be getting them out before barbecue time. There was some talk of doing it during the day so that there was no conflict and exiting them out the back so that they were not in the barbecue area. We need to talk to John for some ideas.

The Columbia River Circuit Finals will be held in Redmond, Oregon for the next three years, in conjunction with the Columbia River Convention, Nov. 11-13th, 1999-2001.

There was some discussion as to whether we are in competition with other rodeos in our area on the same weekend of the summer. The consensus was that we have an advantage because we offer the cowboys day money and have more added money. That is what keeps them coming to our rodeo.

We need to concentrate on sharing information and ideas with other rodcos.

Angela attended the circuit meeting on Thursday at the convention. She said the PRCA is giving \$50-\$60,000 to each circuit rodeo. Since 1997, statistically, the PRCA has lost 23 small rodeos.

Cody said be prepared next meeting to get with your committee to discuss what you learned at the convention and start work on it.
