The Washington County Fair Board met in the lounge room of the U. S. National Bank with all members, except Mr. Lindow, present.

Election of officers were the first order of business, and Mr. Abts nominated Merton Sahnow, the same was seconded by Ed Ball and the secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Sahnow as President. Motion carried.

Merton SahnowyappointedcEddeBall to act as temporary chairman and motion was made by Sahnow, seconded by Abts that Al. Lindow be elected as vice-president. There being no further nominations the secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Lindow as vice-president. Motion carried.

Merton Sahnow returned to the chair.

Merton Sahnow made a motion that A. H. Abts be elected to serve as Treasurer. Motion seconded by Ball. The secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Abts. Motion carried.

The matter of the premium book was brought up by the secretary and it was felt by the board that the News-Times had done a very fine job and if they were interested in printing it again for the advertising the job would be awarded to them. The Secretary was instructed to contact them.

Also the board agreed the same supervisors were efficient in each of their capacities and that they should be contacted to find out if they would be willing to assume the same responsibilities as previously. Also it was felt that the Floral Department would better operate if there was a supervisor to take charge. After discussing the matter it was felt that Mrs. Addie Fisher of Gaston would be very acceptable if she would consent to XXXXX take the responsibility. The secretary was instructed to contact her.

A letter was read from the Tualatin Valley Rabbit Breeder's Association asking if the board had available a small mocrophone which they might use during their show. The Secretary was instructed to inform them we did have and that they might use same providing they would take care of the charge of setting same up which probably would be around \$5.00.

Robert Hockersmith interested in securing a contract for hot-rod racing at the fair grounds was present, having taken over from Ruecker and Wilson. He was asked to take care of interest accrued at the First National Bank on the loan for building the grandstand. He said he had a check for \$297.32 and would turn it over to the First National Bank. The matter of a new contract was to be taken up at the next meeting on February 4.

Mr. Jake Kemmer of Bloha was present representing the Pomona Grange and asked to have a date set for the Granges and Farm Unions to meet with the fair board as they had not been too well satisfied with the themes of the fair. They would be given an opportunity to meet with the board at their February meeting and discuss their situation then.

Edward J. Bail was appointed by the board as manager at the same salary of \$100. per month. Mary Hadley was appointed secretary at a salary of \$75.00 per month.

The matter of insurance on office items, including steel desk, 1 4-drawer file, 1 2-drawer file, typewriter, adding machine, etc., was brought up by the secretary and she was instructed by the board to look into the matter.
