FAIR BOARD MEETING.

June 1, 1935.

This man suggested that Mr. Minton might get some whippet races. Mr. Minton contacted a whippet man in Portland who thought he could hardly do anything about it as many of the dogs were in Canada. Mr. Minton would see this man again.
