The Fair Board met in the Chamber rooms, all members being present, President Banks presiding.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. of the Future Farmers was present, and asked the board for permission to transfer the premium money from one division to another if some divisions were not filled, saying he would not ask for more money for their division that originally awarded to them. They wished to make up a full premium list, but did not believe that each division would be filled. Moved by Enschede, seconded by Scott, that this request be granted. Motion carried.

Mr. Murton of the PEP Co., being present asked the pardon of the board for not being able to keep their part of the proposition originally presented regarding a new building, but other counties would ask for buildings if Washington County was given one, and it would run into more money than they could afford, and according to the political setup at present they were not sure they would be in business another year, so could not guarantee any long time contract. Discussion followed regarding repairs to the present buildings, and the carpenter being present, Manager Davis asked Judge Templeton and one of the commissioners to accompany the board down to the grounds to look over the buildings and see if the commissioners would allow money for repairs.
