

July 12, 1955

The Washington County Fair Board met at the U. S. National Bank with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Al Lindow, representing the Holstein cattle people was present asking what about open class dairy show? It was explained that we do not have money for prizes, which would like to be done, however, after discussion motion was made by Sahnaw that we continue this year's open class dairy show the same as last year with ribbon prizes, and covering the full period of the fair. Motion was seconded by Abts, and carried.

Motion was made by Sahnaw, seconded by Abts and carried that the fair board go on record that for the 1956 fair there will be premium money for open class dairy show.

The committee appointed by Nyberg to have charge of the dairy show will be Palmer Torvend, county agent, as chairman, with a president or representative of each dairy club and the secretary was instructed to notify Mr. Torvend of this decision.

A letter was read from Otto Johnson representing the State Horse-Shoe Pitching Association asking if the fair board would allow \$100.00 to be given them with which they would purchase their own trophies for the tournament. Motion was made by Abts, seconded by Sahnaw and carried that this be done, and the secretary instructed to write them that the money would be forthcoming.

Upon receipt of a letter from the commanding officer of the Sixth Army Pipe Band that the band would be present on Sunday the 28th of August, it was decided that Don Guerber of Washington County and a former member of the band be put on the welcoming committee with Don Cady of the American Legion Drum and Bugle Corps and the secretary instructed to so advise them.
