MEETING OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY FAIR BOARD JULY 14.1947.

Present: Harry Schmeltzer, chairman; Elmer Guerber, vice chairman, Tony Abts, treasurer and Leon S. Davis, manager.

Meeting called to order by Mr. Schmeltzer and the following resolutions presented;

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that an emergency now exists in Washington County because of the fires which have destroyed the Cornelius Feed & Seed Co. and the Imperial Feed & Grain Co. of Hillsboro during the past year with the consequent loss of essential warehouse space for grains and seeds.AND

WHERE-AS the destruction of these warehouses and the shortage of material for reconstruction have left the county without sufficient facilities for storage and shipment of grains and seed crops now in harvest, AND

WHERE-AS the Washington County Fair Board and Washington County has a warehouse situated on the Oregon Electric tracks on the new fair grounds property which would be useful for receiving and shipment of grains and seeds and storage because of its location of a spur track, AND

WHERE-AS the Fair Board with all members present unanimously feels that the full interest of the public, and the farmers who have been dependent on the Cornelius and Hills boro facilities for warehousing and shipment of crops, will be better served as a group.

BE-IT-HEREBY RESOLVED that the warehouse be immediately abandoned for all other purposes and that it be offered for lease to the Imperial #eed & Grain Co. as a means of relieving the warehousing situation at the earliest possible moment.

Motion made by Elmer Guerber and seconded by Tony Abts that the resolution be adopted. Motion unanimously passed.

Motion then made by Abts and seconded by Guerber that the warehouse be offered to the Imperial Feed & Grain Co. for a period of two years, with lease renewable at end of two years, for the sum of \$25 payable monthly. Lease to be effective as of A ugust 1,1947 and subject to cancellation in case of sale. Motion put by Schmeltzer and passed.
