The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mention was made that the state horshoe pitching playhoff seems to be scheduled for the Washington County Fair, and after discussion and the fact that the fair board are very short of funds, the secretary was instructed to write to Mr. Getchell of the Horseshoe players stating the facts that we did not feel we could offer money prizes, but would be glad to cooperate with them insofar as issuing passes to all participating players.

The 1953 Fair Premium Book was presented and upon motion made by Sahnow and seconded by Abts and carried, the same was approved as completed.

There being no further business the meeting stood adjourned.
