The fair board met at 8:00 p.m., at the office with all members, except Mr. Ball, present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Lindow, seconded by Mr. Abts., and carried that the following bills be allowed:

Hillsboro Office Supply - - - - - - 1.58

Mr. Frank Schulmerick was present suggesting that it would be very interesting to have bicycle races during the fair at the race track. The matter was to be left to Assistant Manager, Frank Myers, if he felt it was worthwhile.

Mr. Carl Buckley of Vernonia was present relative to interesting the fair board in his display of driving his six-horse team. The price he gave was \$150.00 for one dry or five days for \$250.00. This matter was also to be finally decided at a later date.

Mrs. Hildeh Highbe and Dollard Gosselin were in attendance relative to the 4-H cook house, to see whether or not it was going to be moved or left at the present location. After some discussion it was decided to leave it at it's present location for this year, but it was noted that at some time later it would need to be located with the other eating concessions.

It was also decided that the condessions located outside formerly paying \$25.00 whould be raised to \$35.00 in order to be put on the same basis as inside booths.

Mr. Herb Mohr was present regarding the relocation of eating concessions and he was authorized by the board to pour a cement slab on which to set them.

The secretary was instructed to write a letter to a representative of The Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ, who had an eating concession and ask if they would be willing to move their present structure to the cement slab, also setting up the proposition of charging them a rental (prevailing each year) this year of \$35.00 which would apply against their price of \$200.00, and the fair board would eventually own all the eating concession buildings.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the same stood adjourned.
