

FAIR BOARD MEETING.

WEDNESDAY EVENING, JULY 18, 1934.

The Fair Board met in the Chamber of Commerce rooms with President Banks presiding, other members present were Mr. Minton and Mr. Hesse.

After general discussion the following changes were decided upon in the premium list:

In the livestock division that the premium list remain the same with the exception that instead of offering prizes, that ribbons be offered.

In the Grange or community exhibits that the wording be as follows: "A premium of \$360.00 will be placed in a fund to be divided pro rata among the exhibits entered in this class. No exhibit to receive over \$30.00. An exhibit to obtain premium money must score 66 points or more. Exhibits shall be made which best represent the products of its particular grange or community.

Under table linens, Class 6, 45 shall be "crochet". In Class 10, 70 shall be "suit, with first premium of \$1.50 and 2nd \$.75. Same class 71 shall be dress, with first premium \$1.50 and 2nd \$.75. The art division to be cut out entirely except Class 7 which shall be entered under domestic art as Class 11.

The following superintendents were decided upon: Mrs. Vincent; Mrs. McKercher, Mrs. Warrens; Minton for concessions; Banks for cattle and Hesse for other exhibits.

A free gate was agreed upon, and the following were suggestions: Grange Day; Farmers Union Day; and a milking contest.

Mr. Minton was elected as manager at a salary of \$150.00, and mileage for his car of 5¢ per mile.

Mrs. Moore was to receive \$.30 per hour for her work.

Mr. Minton was given check for \$10.00 for stamps and other necessary expenses.

The board then adjourned to meet again upon the call of Manager Minton.
