

FAIR BOARD MEETING,

SATURDAY, JULY 27, 1935.

The Fair Board met in the Chamber rooms Saturday afternoon, July 27, with the following present: President Minton, Hesse, Banks, Cyrus and Francis.

Previous to the meeting Manager Minton outlined some changes he would have to make in the premium list in the 4H club premiums, these changes being satisfactory to the county agent and his assistant they left.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. Minton reported that the Farmers Unions had chosen the B building for their booths, and they wished them on the east side of the central partition. There was about 20 feet in this building that would need to be floored. Moved by Hesse, seconded by Banks, that Manager Minton be authorized to have this floor put in. Motion carried.

President Minton also reported on the music, saying the Bethany Band were going to donate their services to the Farmers Union, and he suggested that the Fair Board pay them for their music on Thursday and Friday \$65.00, and the Forest Grove band would play Saturday and they would be paid \$55.00. President Minton had closed the contracts with these bands on this basis. He had also been approached by Messrs. Dixon and Kuenze, Forest Grove, for the dance for the three nights of the Fair. A contract had been closed with them on the agreement that the Fair Board would furnish the lights, and were to receive 25% of the gross receipts for the three nights.

President Minton then reported that he had made a contract with a showman, Walter Hall. Mr. Hall was to handle the shows (2 shows) and the peanut and popcorn concession, and two or three games of skill. On the concessions the board would receive 25% on the first \$1000 gross taken in, and on the shows 20%. After \$1000 receipts then 20% on the concessions.

The following bills were presented and ordered paid: Oregon Mutual Fire Insurance Company premium, \$43.54; Mrs. Moore, work \$3.30; and refund on office expenses to the Chamber of Commerce, \$1.32; Washington County News-Times for bumper signs, \$8.50.

No further business appearing the board adjourned.
