WASHINGTON COUNTY FAIR BOARD

MEETING.

July 6, 1935.

The Fair Board met in the Chamber of Commerce rooms Saturday, July 6, at 1:45 P.M. President Minton presided, and all members of the board were present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. Minton reported that the state fair would open on Saturday, August 31. This might cause the loss of some of the concessionists, especially that of the pony man. Mr. Minton had called up Mr. White and talked with him, and also with the assistant fair manager, and they had said they would admit the 4H club stock up to noon on Monday, September 2. After a discussion in regard to changing the date it was decided to make no change.

Mr. Plass, of the Farmers Union, was present. He stated that he had 8 Farmers Unions that would have booths, which with the 9 Granges would make 17 booths in all.

Mr. Minton brought in a bill for \$5.00 for membership in the Oregon Fair Secretaries' Association for 1935, also a bill for \$1.90 for telephone fees. Moved and carried that these bills be paid.

Discussion followed in regard to having a colt show at the Fair, and the necessary stalls for horses. No decision.

Moved by Hesse, seconded by Banks, that 100 bumper signs be ordered from the Washington County News-Times for the coming Fair. Motion carried.

Mr. Minton suggested that the Board donate \$100.00 for putting in the exhibit for Pomona Grange, or whoever had it in charge, at the Pacific International Live Stock Exposition. Moved, seconded and carried that an appropriation for this amount be made.

On motion the meeting adjourned upon the call of the President.
