

June 8, 1954

The Washington County Fair Board met at the office on the fair grounds with Nyberg, Sahnow and Rohwer present.

Weaver Clark was again present asking about cutting the grass and hay, and stated he had put sawdust around all the trees. He was instructed to cut the hay.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. Fisher from Gaston and Mrs. Walters of West Slope were present relative to garden building, and stated that the building costs as previously reported were so great that the Garden Clubs couldn't begin to raise half enough. It was decided to get estimates of a building 50 x 90 - one with posts for supports and one with trusses.

Motion was made by Sahnow and seconded by Nyberg and carried that the bill of -

be paid.

A letter was read from the Horseshoe Pitchers Association in response to previous action taken by the board that there could be no money prizes this year, but would give 12 trophies, however the Pitchers Association were asking for \$200.00 in prize money. The secretary was again instructed to write them regretting we did not have money available for prizes, but would still give the 12 trophies.

Relative to open-class dairy show - Mr. Nyberg appointed the following to take charge of the show at the 1954 fair:

The secretary was instructed to so notify them, also there would be ribbon prizes, but no money was available.

There being no further business the same stood adjourned.
