The Washington County Sheriffs Reserve met again with the board to see what the possibilities were on constructing a building for their use. The Board agreed they would be happy to go \$1500.00 in debt to construct the building next fall if the fair board's finances look reasonably good at that time.

The fair board agreed to supply a booth free to the reserve for a display and also for use as a first aid station.

Mr. Abts reported on the various items he had checked as follows:

a - The camp group people had not returned to see about using the fair grounds.

b - The Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce will spark the various talent shows.

c - The County Court will do something about black topping the circle at the fair grounds.

d - The 4H leaders are interested in selling the fair buttons throughout the county.

Harris Hansen suggested a score board to help spark the drive on fair buttons.

All button sales to be concluded and reported by August 15th.

Motion made by Earl Simantel, seconded by Al Lindow to pay \$5.00 for the funeral piece sent to Mary Hadley in the name of the Fair Board.

Motion by Tony Abts, seconded by Al Lindow to hire Harris Hansen Jr. as the assistant fair manager as of June 1st, at the rate of \$250.00 per month plus mileage. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Booth prices agreed on by the fair board for the '59 show will be \$25.00 for 10' frontage.

Motion made by Tony Abts seconded by Earl Simantel to adopt the attached resolution - to borrow an amount not to exceed \$5000.00.
