

FAIR BOARD MEETING

WEDNESDAY NIGHT, JUNE 10, 1931

The Fair Board met in the Chamber rooms Wednesday night, June 10. The masters of the Granges of Washington County had been invited to attend the meeting, but it being the week of the State Grange Assembly there were none of the masters present. Those attending were President Banks, first vice-president Minton, second vice-president Hesse, secretary-manager Moore, treasurer Kraus, and Mr. and Mrs. Strickler, representing the Sherwood Grange, and Chas. E. Wharton.

A general discussion was had in regard to the displays in the Grange booths, but no decisive action was taken. It was decided to call another meeting for Wednesday night, June 17, and to include the masters of the different Granges.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that Mr. Wharton, Mr. Craft and Mr. Root be appointed as a committee to get into communication and confer in regard to a competitive exhibition drill by the different Grange teams on Grange day, Saturday, September 12. Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that Secretary Moore be authorized to place the insurance on all buildings at once. Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that the bill from Nullers for flowers for Mr. Livermore's funeral be paid. Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Kraus, that in the Horticultural Class, Division G, we add "Best plate of Italian Prunes, 10 specimens, - first \$1.00, - second prize \$.50", also "Best 2 pounds dried blackcaps, - first prize \$1.00, - second prize \$.50". Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that the advisory committees be continued again this year. Motion carried
