They were informed they would need a building permit and comply with certain sahitation codes. Since the board to take no action on this, the Secretary was order to call Mr. Lulich and tell him to get in touch with the planning commission, Mr. Heffley.

The county does not have any type of insurance to cover any addidents or injuries nourred during the building kwa of the 4-H Dormitory building so a letter was written and signed by the board to be sent to the Leaders Associatin.

Mr. Danielson reported further plans on the Mink Style Show. This will be held in the Highschool Auditorium Septermber 28, 1963 Saturday night. Tickets will be \$1.50.

The attached proposal was presented to the board from Mr. Dan Mallory in regard to further improvements to the Main Exhibit Building. The board accepted this proposal with the provision that he accept payment later on in the year when racing money is received. (note) - The secretary talked to Mr. Mallory June 6 and he also accepted this arrangement and will work on this as soon as possible.

There is one thing that I would like to call your attention to that would make your Commerdial Exhibit building complete as should be. This is as follows:

- 1. Place 2 x 6 solid blocking between rafters completely around the building as I did on the section that was re-constructed.
- 2. Place screens over louvers at each gable and at the louvered building on top of the center section of the building.

 The screen would keep the birds out as would the blocking.

 The blocking well nailed would add a great deal of structual value to the building.
