Motion was made by Abts and seconded by Nyberg that the lists as attached hereto in the amount of \$47.00 for 4-H Agricultural Division Classes and \$21.25 for 4-H Home Economics Division Classes be allowed. Motion carried.

Motion made by Abts, seconded by Nyberg, and carried that we make arrangements for horseshoe tournament.

Mr. Ted Rohwer of Forest Grove, employed as publicity man as of June 2nd, reported that he had been covering the county trying to stir up interest, and hoped that a county-wide parade could be worked out. Advertising was also discussed.

Mr. Harris Hansen and Hilda Highbe of Beaverton were introduced, representing the 4-H Leaders' Association and reported that a committee had been picked to find a place for supplying food for 4-H'rs and the youth organizations in order that they might get a well-balanced meal at a nominal cost.

Mrs. Highbe reported in some localities meal cards are used and punched, and this system has been self-supporting with arrangements made with some party to cook the meals. They also suggested that some of the supplies might be donated and credited to the party donating, for meals etc. After some discussion the Board favored this idea but thought it best to investigate the requirements of the Health Department, etc., and hold the matter over until the next meeting.
