Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls the meeting to order at 4:30 PM with introductions of Board, Staff and Guests.

**1.Consent Agenda:** Margaret Garza gives the report. Garza reviews, comments and explains the Fair Complex financial position for the of month of January.

Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls for a motion to accept the consent agenda, Rich Vial so moves, Kathy Christy seconds, the motion carries.

2.Rodeo Committee Report: Cody Feinauer gives the report. Feinauer thanks all those that attended the queen's coronation dance. Feinauer said they did fairly well and did not have any exact figures at hand yet. It took about \$600 to put on the dance and he estimated that they made around \$1,500 to \$2,000, between the door (gate) concession, and the silent auction. We need to pay the bills and the remainder goes into the queen's fund. Beyond that we have been working on planning and what kind of improvements that are going to be done out there (rodeo grounds). There is still some organizational stuff that I'm working out with Margaret (Garza). Spiesschaert speaking for those that attended the coronation dance gives thanks for the invitation and said that it was a super

event. Feinauer mentions that there were more Fair Board members there (4) than Rodeo Committee members. Spiesschaert said in talking to Margaret (Garza) and Bill (McKinley) that we are trying to shore up various communication areas, and really would like to thank you and your group for the cooperation in getting that done. Feinauer said that since McKinley is going to be staying for the Associates Meeting anyway that before the meeting on Monday they could meet with Garza, McKinley and himself and any other Rodeo Committee Directors that can make it before our Associates Meeting. Spiesschaert said that was a great idea.

3.Booster Report: Dave Russell gives report. The Boosters are going to have their first meeting of the year tonight. They will generally be reorganizing after being on "vacation" for three meetings. They are going to be sending out news notices to "whip up a bit of a frenzy" among the members to get busy and work. Russell said if the Board has any requests that they think the Booster might want to take on let us know. Spiesschaert said that he thinks we do have a couple of those and you will be hearing from us. They have to do with our "hospitality area" for one. Kathy Christy said she had heard of a "program" that the Fair presents to groups, or was it the Boosters? Spiesschaert mentioned that Garza gave a presentation at the Livestock Association annual dinner on Saturday night, Garza gave an update. Rich Vial was there. Garza said she did something with Kiwana's in September of last year, and also a Rotary presentation in Aloha.

3a.John Baggott Extension Agent OSU. Spiesschaert asks if Baggott had any additions from our last meeting. Baggott discusses Horse Leadership issues that he was hearing "mixed messages" in that they do not see the Fair as "anti-horse" but then from their minutes did not feel as if they were apart of the Fair. Baggott said that he did not want the Fair (Board) to get the wrong impression from their comments. Spiesschaert said that he asked McKinley and Payne to meet with the appropriate persons and a Fair Board member, one of us to look ahead to Fair 2001. Spiesschaert believes that it is the wish of the Fair Board to have youth participation to be closer to the Fair dates than farther away. And that McKinley and Payne would be addressing fulfilling both Fair and Horse Fair / Extension's needs in that regard. Baggott said that would be great. The biggest concerns Baggott sees is scheduling-wise and to not cause a problem in terms of "change-over", and if it's doable that's great. Spiesschaert in discussions with McKinley and Payne said "this" needs to be decided by early spring. We really didn't say what "this" meant. But that your people at Horse Fair and we know when the 4-H Horse Fair dates are for 2001. Baggott said that will help in the planning for next year.

4.Maintenance Report: Kelly Goodin gives report. Goodin mentions and thanks the Fair Board for the new "toys" (capital expenditures). Goodin goes down the list of items. Spiesschaert mentions that the Fair Board is supporting the maintenance staff in getting these new pieces of equipment and tools in order for them to get the job done better. But along with that we need to provide a good storage place for the equipment. We haven't solved that yet, so we would ask you to be as careful as you can and try to take good care of this stuff. Like we got a good deal on the dividers, but they sit out in damp buildings. Goodin said they are in the Rabbit Barn, but under a tarp. Spiesschaert said that's the kind of stuff I'm talking about. We ought to cover stuff so we don't have bird manure on it. Hopefully down the road we will have a place for it. Vial mentioned that he was approached by a livestock exhibitor about an issue that came up last summer about the heat in the beef barn and if it was possible to put wind driven turbines on top of the ridgeline. McKinley said that he and Goodin have been discussing that issue and that it was on the critique list of last year. We believe we have a solution to the heat problem in deploying a sprinkler array at the ridge top to cool the barn. Vial asks about time line to get it done. McKinley said, before Fair. Goodin endorses the sprinkler system as a good place to start. Spiesschaert said such a solution has worked well in the small animal building. Vail said then the exhibitors are seeing that we are at least trying to do something. Spiesschaert mentioned that Vial, Day and himself had committed some ideas to writing and submitted them to McKinley and Payne. And they have really made tremendous progress on those things that they could, and they didn't disregard anything, some things they didn't understand and some things you just can't do anything about. Vial also thought that when the conditions are just right between wet and dry, we take a heavy roller out in the exhibitor camping area on the south side of the fence, so that we can "even out" the high spots and low spots. This could be less expensive than the remedy that we have talked about. Leahy mentioned that he walked the area with Spiesschaert and Mike (Wold) and thought that the best way to solve the problem out there is to "tile" it, connecting the low points and get a positive draining going. Vial said that's probably true. Leahy said when the weather will allow that to happen, just let us know. Vial said he's thinking, roll it this year, and next come in with the tile right after Fair. Spiesschaert said that he thought that was a good idea, especially if we do some hand spotting some of the deeper holes with bark dust or something. Day asks about the pooling in the front driveway as we enter the grounds. No further discussion on this topic

<u>5.Old Business:</u> (A) Policy Manual Update. Rich Vial gives update and explanation. The 100 series of the proposed Administrative Rules is: <u>General Fair Board Administration</u>. The 200 series is: <u>County Fair Operations</u>. The 300 series is: Operation of Fair Complex. The 400 series deals with: Rodeo.

### Rich Vial moves the adoption of Administrative Resolution 101, Sheila Day seconds the motion, discussion, with amendment, the motion carries.

Vial discusses rule #201 which was the resolution of the Fair date. Spiesschaert suggests that we provide the language of the proposed resolution to interested organizations i.e. Boosters, Rodeo, Staff, and Extension Service. Garza suggested FFA. Spiesschaert says that we're kind of looking to John (Baggott) to help with the youth and expects him to represent the youth divisions of the Fair, or at least in a general way. Spiesschaert asks if there is an FFA representative. Garza said Rolland Aschim, Vial discusses the Rodeo Resolution, Vial suggests that the Rodeo Committee "thrash" over the language we are submitting, then they (Rodeo Committee) return with comments to the language and Feinauer will discuss the issues and comments the Committee brought to us. Then we go to a later meeting to discuss options. Kathy Christy asks if it would be beneficial for the Boosters to be involved in that there used to be Booster on the Rodeo Committee. Vial thought that was a great idea. Vial suggests that the cover memo be sent to all interested parties and have them comment. It would save us (Board) a lot of time. Vial said, take for example in the 300 series, "peddlers and solicitors" parking policy. A lot of those the Booster will be key in helping us think through what those policies should be. Vial said that he will continue to propose two or three (policies) every meeting. The interested parties should write and Fair Staff should write the first drafts for these. Vial said that we can create an index in the front as to what we have already done. Garza asks in clarification if the memo should perhaps go to those groups outside the immediate Fair interest like the Chamber of Commerce? Vial said any group that may provide "meaningful input" should be considered. Garza, in the form of a public notice? Vial thought that might be too cumbersome, and may in fact really slow the process down. Spiesschaert said that we should be a bit cautious about how many people we ask. They are going to give us feedback and then what are we going to do with all that stuff? Vial said we make note of it. Garza said that at least they had an opportunity to contribute. Spiesschaert asks of Vial, "you do not see this as all "encompassing", but rather our "framework". Vial says that's right, a framework, and should come just under our mission statement. Garza said that Christy suggested that we share it with the County Board of Commissioners and with County legal. (B) PGE request for Easement Update. Margaret Garza gives report. Garza expresses her frustration with the process. Garza outlines the Easement issue of PGE trying to get additional power to Intel via a route that would infringe on Fair Complex property. It seemed prudent that our objective should be to be compensated financially for the granting of an easement. Their route would be down 28th street. In consultation with county counsel Allan Rappleyea, he suggested that we have an appraisal done on the proposed

affected property. Garza said that she has been trying to meet with Larry Strong with the County Appraisal Department to come out and view the property with her. It's been like "pulling teeth", because I haven't been able to get him here. She tried a second person in the County with equal results. Christy suggests a call to Larry Eisenburg. Dave Russell said that Eisenburg may have a direct knowledge on the value of the easement property in question. Garza also mentioned a conversation with Peggy Krause with the Port of Portland who is the individual that handles similar easements with PGE or PP&L. She gave Garza a copy of the easement agreement that they use to their benefit. Krause did suggest that an appraisal be done and ask for related reimbursements for the easement. Spiessshaert mentions not to forget the Grant Street extension and that the vaults not be placed in the way. And that any future movement of the vaults would be incumbent on PGE and or guarantee to greater power service in the future related to growth at the Fair Complex. Spiesschaert said that isn't this kind of agreement the most likely compensation for easement rights, rather than financial compensation? Leahy asks what the timing on this is. Garza said that they would like to do the project as early as spring. Spiesschaert mentions but with Fair Board approval. Garza said, that is understood. Day asks if we are causing them (PGE) any delay and that every other party to the easement has their agreement except us? Garza said we are not holding up the process. Discussion. (C) Report on OFA. Bill McKinley gives report. McKinley reported that Paige Payne, Lisa Dupre', Mary Putzler and himself attended the convention in Eugene. Next convention will be at Jantzen Beach. McKinley is a member of the Legislative Committee. And in that this, not being a legislative year, the hot topic was the potential effects of term limits will have on legislative issues dear to Oregon Fairs. Several legislators friendly to Fairs will be leaving because of term limits. Also discussed was the Oregon Fairs Foundation in which McKinley discussed the concerns of the Fair Board in giving the appearance that the Foundation was going back and starting at square one, when in fact that was not the case. Much work has been done including discussions with various foundations such as the Ford Foundation. McKinley said that Paige Payne and Mary Putzler worked hard with others to put most of the Showcase talent presentations together. McKinley said he was a panel member dealing with Rodeo issues along with Bob Traverso of Clakamas County and the PRCA publicity representative. The PRCA representative was very knowledgeable and provided much valued information in putting on a first rate event. Kathy Christy asked McKinley if there was any discussion about volunteers. McKinley said "yes". Traverso talked of the "double-edged" sword of volunteerism in that you get all that enthusiasm but often times personal agendas to boot. Sorting these issues out is a challenge. Christy asked if they "encouraged" the use of volunteers. McKinley said yes, and was especially encouraged at the smaller

fairs and rodeos. Spiesschaert said that Day and himself attended a conference at NFR on insurance and volunteers. And it was very helpful. Spiesschaert said it is a dilemma for everybody. The insurance people said that you cannot afford to insure these volunteers adequately. Spiesschaert said that he heard that the PRCA and the stock contractors are beginning to specify where volunteers were to be used and where not in terms of "exposure". Feinauer said that we will not have the bullfights this years and he's happy about it. Day asked about the "hospitality" items we donate to the Oregon Fairs Association, and if we host a "party" or something. Garza, said no, and explained that they were Fair items that are used in a silent auction and that are placed for display at OFA. (D) Report on WFA. Report given by Margaret Garza. Garza said we attended the general sessions every day with high-powered speakers addressing industry matters. McKinley was active in meeting with trade show representatives. Garza and McKinley discussed main stage entertainment with industry representatives and met with other fair related managers and executives. Spiesschaert mentions the "bear" act we have coming to the Fair and that we need to inform the livestock people in that some animals could be spooked

Re: Purchasing Procedures

This memo is a follow-up to our conversation on Monday, Jan. 31, 2000. After our discussion about the new purchasing procedures, I have designed this procedures list for you to review with your other directors as well as your Associate Members at the next Rodeo Committee meeting on Feb. 7th, 2000.

- 1. Only designated personnel are authorized to request purchase orders. These individuals include. Gary McVey, Brian Anderson, Mike Baker, Larry Bellamy, Gary Price, Laurie Benton, and Cody Feinauer. We have also designated Kelly Neal as an authorized user. Please talk with Cody if you have any questions on the authorized user list.
- 2. The key to this procedure operating properly is for everyone to PLAN AHEAD! If you know there is a project coming up that will require purchase orders being issued (i.e. tee-shirt printing, lumber purchases, painting, Queen expenses, Fair supplies, etc.) please don't wait until the day of, to request approval. Please give me as much lead time as possible. We realize that emergencies come up, but if these new procedures are not followed, you may be jeopardizing the Fair Complex's' ability to reimburse you for your expenses.
- 3. After requesting a purchase order, I will fax, e-mail (once available), mail, or leave for pick-up a copy of this purchase order. It will have an assigned number as well as the initials of the person making the request (i.e. 001-2000CF), the name of the vendor being utilized, and a brief description of the item(s) being purchased and cost. Please have this information readily available when you request the purchase order. Upon issuance, I will leave a copy of the purchase order in the Rodeo mailbox for Cody's record keeping.
- 4. If you are ordering items from out-of-state or out-of-town companies and they are being delivered, these items must be delivered directly to the Fair Complex office. You are more than welcome to let me know to expect this delivery and leave a contact number so I can phone you

as soon as it arrives. Upon pick-up, the package needs to be inspected and the packing slip left with the Fair Office.

- 5. Once deliveries are received, and packing slips are matched with specific purchase orders, they will be cleared and bills will be paid as normal. This procedural change is to become effective on Tuesday, February 8, 2000. I can be reached at 648-1416 if you have any questions, or you may also contact Cody directly.
- 6. Travel arrangements for Rodeo events such as NFR will be handled out of the Fair Complex office through the purchase order process as well. This will be discussed in further detail at a later date to finalize. Travel arrangements will be handled for the five committee directors authorized to attend in Las Vegas. Please talk with Cody if you have any suggestions.

When new procedures are put into place, we know that the best intentions don't always work exactly as planned. As circumstances arise, we will work out the bugs, but these procedures are to protect the Fair Complex staff, Rodeo Committee members, and everyone involved with the Fair & Rodeo. If you have any suggestions or input, we are always open to ideas. Please let me know.

Once again I am writing to you about the foundation. After the convention it appears that a number of people still have questions. Perhaps I have been unclear with a number of ideas and the activities that the board has taken. I apologize for this and resolve these questions and move on to the funding of this project.

#### What the board has done:

- Established a set of by–laws
- · Selected a mission, purpose and marketing package
- Filed and received 501(c)(3) status
- Registered with the State of Oregon as a non-profit organization
- Set up a bank account to receive funds
- Determined size of foundation as a goal for present funding \$20 million, each fair to receive equal amount close to present funding Funds to be used by each fair as the fair board directs (operations, buildings, etc)
- Allowed individual fairs to contribute for their fair

Reasons for this decision: (Oregon Fairs Foundation is not a part of the Oregon Fairs Association so OFA cannot assess each fair an amount to pay into the foundation.)

Faster funds for growth of the foundation

Each fair does not have to set up non-profit status

More interest to the foundation

#### What can fairs do to help themselves:

- Set aside some from operating budget
- Collect a percentage of gate
- Add a percentage to gate for foundation
- Have a fundraiser at grounds for foundation
- Find a match in community for what fair has donated

#### What needs to be done soon:

- Develop a larger board of people outside of fair industry
- Develop desire to see this through to full funding
- Gain extra funds to establish a grant program Capital Improvements Major repairs
- Obtain grant for fundraiser to find the funds we need

I hope this information has helped answer some questions. People will be happy to attend meetings to explain further or meet with potential donors. This is one of the reasons that Charles Bennett spoke at the convention. I want to thank all of you for your past support and continued help in the future. This is a monstrous task and will be accomplished, but we do need your help.
