The Fair Board met in the U. S. Bank Building with all members present except the secretary, Mary Hadley.

The minutes of the former meeting were not read.

Premium warrant #8564 dated August 28, 1952 to Maryann Peters, being out-dated was ordered to be rewritten and mailed.

Bill Turner from the Argus was present in regard to the fair premium book, and stated the last three books have lost money for the Argus on the basis of printing them for the advertising. He suggested the fair board hire a man to sell the advertising and the Argus would give us a price on the printing of the book.

The board asked that the Argus give us a price on the printing of the premium book, and that they bring the quotation to A. H. Abts who will pass the information on to the board. It was suggested that the advertising be cut to 4 to a page at the rate of \$10.00 each, therefore a page would be \$40.00, also we would get printing rates from The News Times of Forest Grove and Tri-City News of Sherwood, and Abts to check Valley News at Beaverton.

Present were Bill Marsh of Guernsey Cattle Club, Lon Kinnamon Jr., of Guernsey Club; Al Lindow, Holstein, Lennox Blachford and Sandy McDonald of the Jersey Club.

Bill Marsh stated the Guernsey Club is interested in showing at the fair if there are suitable premiums. The Jersey Breeders are meeting Thursday, March 22nd. Lennox Blachford says the Jersey club will show.

It was agreed that the open-class barn should have better lighting and the barn be whitewashed.

Mr. Lindow stated the Holstein people will show, also stated they have a satisfactory judge.

It was decided that a committee be formed with a representative of each breed to work out the program and details, also it was decided and agreed that premiums amounting to \$600.00 be provided for open-class dairy.
