THANK YOU

The Board noted a thank you letter from retired Fair Board Chairman Chuck Colegrove.

BUDGET

Hesse handed out the 1984-85 budget as submitted to the county and asked the Fair Board to review the budget for discussion at the next Fair Board meeting.

EVENTS

The Board reviewed a list of public events on the fairgrounds from April to September. The list has been submitted to "Posh" magazine, a local magazine for publicity of Washington County events. Sprecher will use the event list for cable television publicity.

RODEO

Speer reported that Rodeo Committee member Jim Russo's wife is critically ill; Hesse will send a card to her.

OPERATIONS SUPT.

Hesse received about 50 applications for the Operations Superintendent position. Hesse briefly interviewed all the applicants and screened it down to four. Baron and Leeson will help with the interviewing on March 12, 1:30 p.m. Dyche has taken a job at a dairy, and Hesse is drawing up a caretaker's agreement for the trailer space, water, garbage, and sewer expenses.

PREMIUM BOOK Hesse has contracted with University Publishing for publishing the 1984 Premium Book and fair program. University Publishing has in turn contracted with The Time Publications for printing the premium book and program. There have been several challenges with high pressure ad sales, and they have been good to cool the fires.

PICK-UP TRUCK Hesse suggested the Board step up the purchase of a used pick-up for fy 1983-84. The Board reviewed the capital/outlay expenditures year-to-date, and Hesse does not anticipate over expending the capital budget. Speer suggested buying a new truck, and Love suggested buying from a fleet sale.

The Board approved the purchase of a truck this fiscal year. Hesse will consult with the new Operations Superintendent about the kind of truck needed.

RIC ECTION

The Unified Sewerage Agency has loaned Dick Fitzgerald, licensed electrician, to accomplish the following: inspection of existing fairgrounds electrical status, analysis of each building, written recommendation on needs, projected cost analysis of upgrading. The master development plan will be utilized in making recommendations for current and future needs.

OFA

There is an Oregon Fairs Association area meeting March 15, 10 a.m. at Polk County Fairgrounds.

Hesse will be attending the OFA Board of Directors meeting and Management Meeting April 1-3 in Bend.

HOTEL/ MOTEL TAX Larry Sprecher is chairman of the Washington County Visitors Association task force for a 2 percent increase in the hotel/motel tax; I percent to WCVA and I percent to the fairgrounds. WCVA and the Fair Board agree to try for an increase.

MASTER PLAN Chairman Sprecher reported she talked with Chuck Cameron, Assistant County Administrator, before the Board of Commissioners work session February 28, and he said there would be "no formal, massive staff report." A five-year sunset clause and funding was discussed at the work session. Section 6 (the sunset clause) and quite bare and severe. Sprecher called Stilwell for clarification and suggested a statement was needed such as "unless after review of the situation, the Board of Commissioners shall agree to its (the ordinance) extension." Stilwell then polled the Commissioners and said three out of five won't budge and wanted Section 6 as written -- "Due to the uncertainty of County finances, this Ordinance shall be repealed effective March 1, 1989."

The Fair Baord feels it is important to maintain a good working relationship with the Commissioners and to move ahead on the master plan; therefore, the Board agreed to accept the ordinance as written.

Hesse contacted Cameron about getting County technical assistance to move ahead on the comprehensive plan and zone change. Cameron told Hesse to work with Rick Daniels, Land Use and Transportation Department.

The Board discussed appointing a task force to advise and assist the Fair Board and County in developing an economically and environmentally sound proposal for development of 13.4 acres of fairgrounds property.

MOTION: MOVED BY HOMER SPEER, SECONDED BY JEANNE LEESON AUTHORIZING DIRECTOR HESSE TO APPOINT A FIVE MEMBER TASK FORCE TO ASSIST IN DEVELOPMENT OF THE 13.4 ACRES OF PROPERTY AS DESIGNATED IN THE MASTER PLAN. MOTION CARRIED.

The Fair Board gave Hesse suggestions for the task force, and Hesse will seek suggestions from the Board of Commissioners.

Sprecher offered the services of a consultant friend who is quite knowledgeable on municipal leasing. Perhaps the consultant can meet with the Fair Board and task force. The Board reviewed the steps necessary to get a comprehensive plan and zone change. The Fair Board agreed to begin implementing the master plan.

RODEO

The Fair Board reviewed the Rodeo Committee's proposal to put up a VIP or Queen's box between the holding pens and hazers box. The Committee has received a donation from Floyd Koffel for the material to build the box.

MOTION: MOVED BY HOMER SPEER, SECONDED BY JOHN LOVE TO APPROVE CONSTRUCTION OF A QUEEN'S BOX IN THE ARENA AREA USING FLOYD KOFFEL'S DONATION. MOTION CARRIED.

The Fair and Rodeo Court Queen's coronation and dance will be April 21 in the Cloverleaf Community Building. The Board reviewed the February 6 Rodeo Committee minutes. Love reported there is some misunderstanding in the Rodeo Committee about rodeo funding and budget. Hesse will set up a meeting with Rodeo Committee Chairman Rocky Williams, Love and herself to clear up any problems.

NEW BUSINESS MOTION: MOVED BY HOMER SPEER, SECONDED BY JOHN LOVE TO PUBLICLY SUPPORT AND URGE OTHERS SUPPORT FOR THE COUNTY TAX BASE AS IT IS FAVORABLE FOR THE FAIR-GROUNDS. MOTION CARRIED.

NEXT MEETING The next regular meeting of the Fair Board will be April 4, 1984, at 4:30 p.m. in the Fairgrounds office.
