He stated he would bring in his 6 horse hitch and he is sure Joe VanDyke will also bring his in for \$200.00 for both. Mr. VanDuke had stated previously he would attend the Fair at no cost to the Board. The Board and Dr. McGough thanked him for his interest and this will be brought before the rodeo committee and he will be informed of the final descision,

Mr. Ball was advised to obtain the cost of erecting the totem pole,
