The Fair Board met at the Commercial Bank with Nyberg, Abts and Ball present.

Mrs./Green a representative of Gale Grange was present to reserve space for that grange.

Representatives of the Christian Science Church were also present, being Mr. & Mrs. John Kimmel, 8304 S. W. Cashmur Lane, Portland, and Mrs. Fields of Hillsboro, asking for space at the fair.

The Forest Grove Garden Club had previously suggested that no premiums in money, be made in the Garden Section and that they be allowed money for beautification, however, after discussion the fair board felt that money premiums should still be awarded and that allowance would be made for the beautification of flower section. Motion was made by Abts and seconded by Nyberg that premiums as previously allowed still stand. Motion carried.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Motion made by Abts and seconded by Nyberg and carried that the following bill be allowed:

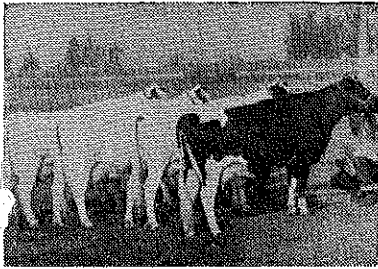
Baker's Auto Service- Gas. \$4.70

Also, the secretary was instructed to write Hillsboro Grange who had constructed a building for restaurant purposes to see if they would be willing to use the quonset hut for their restaurant and tear down the other building as it was becoming in a bad state of repair.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned to meet on June 9th and that the advisory committee be requested to be present.
