Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert called the meeting to order at 4:30pm. He welcomed everyone and called for additions to the agenda.

Consent Agenda: Barbara requested the Fair Complex Budget under New Business
 (6) be advanced in the agenda to accommodate Ken Leahy and his need to leave early.

Barbara introduced Leah Perkins as the new person hired to assist in the fair coordination. "Her background in computers is excellent and the added knowledge in events, rodeo and farming was certainly a plus. Many applications were received but Leah's skills fit the position perfectly". Leah responded and thanked the Board for the opportunity.

2) Elections: The Chairman opened the nominations for the position of Chairperson explaining they were normally in January but had been postponed because of the delay in Board appointments. Sheila nominated Lyle Spiesschaert. Kathy seconded the motion. Lyle respectively declined stating he had been Chairman for several years and the position does take extra time. He wants to spend more time with his family and pursue some other interests and just take a break from the leadership. Lyle thanked those that have lent their support to him to make a difficult task a bit easier. He offered to be the liaison between the Fair Board and the Board of Commissioners. With

the nominations still open Ken nominated Kathy Christy and Rich Seconded. With no other nominations Rich moved the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast. The ballot was cast with Sheila voting nay. Kathy was seated as Chair and the elections proceeded with the calling for nominations for the Vice-Chairman. Lyle nominated Sheila and Rich seconded. With no further nominations Kathy closed the nominations and Rich motioned a unanimous ballot be cast, motion carried. The nominations, were opened for Treasurer. Lyle nominated Rich, and with no other nominations, moved a unanimous ballot be cast. Motion was carried.

**Budget Overview:** 

Rich Vial moved and Sheila Day seconded to accept the consent agenda, the budget report and to pay the bills as submitted. Motion carried.

6) New Business: Fair Complex Budget—FY 2001/2002 The Chair requested Barbara report on the budget. Barbara explained the transition and her inexperience with the classified employee needs as well as the cash versus the accrual system had slowed down an already late process. She praised the County and Ellen Cooper in particular for the help she received. However, the timeframe was very short and she apologized to the Board for the little time they had to examine the document. Explanation and discussion took place concerning revenues and justifications of the sources and amounts. Cody reported on the loss of one \$15,000 sponsorship and the uncertainly of another \$15,000. Since those two sponsorships were dedicated to the Rodeo, Sheila asked Cody if the Rodeo was prepared to reduce their budget? He responded quoting Resolution # 401, stating the Rodeo was responsible for 30 per cent of their budget however, they would certainly try to recruit more sponsorship. Cody reminded the Fair Board the Rodeo was responsible for those two sponsorships originally. Rich asked for and was given details on several line item expenditures. There were questions on the Development line item (#) 514 now that the Task Force has received grant monies, although the budgeted amount may be in excess of the Fair's obligation is decided to leave it as listed. Rich Vial moved to adopt the budget as proposed which includes modifications to the Revenue Enhancement Proposal Motion of January 3rd 2001. Ken seconded and the motion carried with Lyle Spiesschaert not voting. The Revenue Enhancement Proposal will be reviewed another year when funding is more stable.

Maintenance Report: Barbara reported there had been several meetings and the crew had been very helpful bringing her up to speed. JJ, the electrician is scheduled to retire on April 27<sup>th</sup>. We will not replace him until after the fair and the crew understands that. They have been going over fair schedules and seasonal help. The current project is removing the manure (last year's) and spreading it on the rodeo pasture in preparation for reseeding. She reported Mike had had surgery and had been off for a week or so. The events have also kept them busy.

<u>Fair Manager's Report:</u> Barbara reported on meetings with the Maintenance Crew concerning surplus equipment and cleaning up of the bone yard as well as several projects proposed. A list of property to be declared surplus will be discussed at the next Board meeting. Other meetings were with County Counsel, Alan Rappleyea (just to



introduce himself), Terry Amato on sponsorships, Greg Flakus over food booths, Judy Reiber concerning the talent show. Lyle interjected the staff should not judge the show, and Barbara agreed. He recommended we use community leaders through out the County. Lyle recommended the Forrest Grove Mayor. The interviewing and hiring process to fill the office position was time consuming but appears to be well worth it with the person (Leah) that was hired. Barbara advised the Board about the meetings she and Ken had attended with Steve Rohan, Community Corrections concerning the restitution workers used on the grounds. She reported on the meeting with Rick Van Beveren, who does the beer service at fair time. The beer consumption is down and Rick suggested the removal of one station. A meeting with the 4-H horse Superintendents provided Barbara with information about the 4-H horse fair. There is a concern about the one-day turn around between the horse fair and the "big" fair. Ken asked about the agriculture displays, she replied Lyle had already made a first contact and he and she would follow up. Members of the Board also questioned the waterscapes and ponds. Discussion followed. Rich advised the need for venting the FFA barn especially considering this maybe a hot dry fair season. For several years the temperature in that barn has been a problem. They have tried water but it did not helped. He also noted there were divots and potholes that needed to be filled. Ken said he would have dirt brought in if it was needed. Lyle called attention to the plantings, especially the entrance by the cloverleaf Bldg. He felt they were very nice and congratulated the staff.

**Rodeo Report:** Cody spoke briefly about the sponsorships. The committee picked the drill team, The "Fly Girls". There are several former queens in the group. The Star Light parade is scheduled for Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup> and he invited the Board to ride on the float. Poker Ride is May 19<sup>th</sup>. Cody called the Boards attention to the two resolutions. One will allow the Committee to charge yearly dues.

**Fair Boosters:** Bill Duerden verified the Boosters would not be doing any parking over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

4-H Report: John Baggott was not in attendance.

3.Old Business: (A) In County Commissioner Tom Brian's absence Lyle read a written report from him concerning the Development Task Force. Commissioner Brian explained a scheduling conflict did not allow him to attend the Fair Board. He stated he was anxious to get started and everything was moving ahead. Last Friday the Regional Investment Board approved \$50,000.00 to assist with the cost of the Task Force work. There were some last minute concerns but the funding was approved. He will have meetings with staff and prospective Task Force members this next week. By the end of next week he will send the Fair Board a draft list of members and work plan for review and comments. Commissioner Brian would like to announce the Task Force members, the funding, and the work plan at the same time. He wrote, "it is important to do it right and get results. The Board of Commissioners is firmly committed to make this happen".

The report also stated he would like to attend the next Fair Board meeting. Ken and Rich are scheduled to meet with Commissioner Brian in the next few days to discuss the development and the task force.

- 7. General Correspondence: The Kathy acknowledged the letter Lyle had sent to Mr. Horner regarding his retirement from the draft horse organization. Rich questioned who would be leading that group. Lyle announced Molly Clausen would be in charge. Lyle will do the announcing for them during the driving show they do at the rodeo. ### **Rodeo Committee Policy #201**

### A. Associate Member in Good Standing Criteria

- 1. An associate member in good standing must adhere to the following criteria:
  - a. Associate member must attend 50% of monthly meetings unless excused by committee director.
  - b. Associate member must attend 50% of work parties unless excused by committee director.
  - c. Associate member must be active in at least one (1) sub-committee.
  - d. Associate member must be current with annual dues.
  - e. Associate member must demonstrate appropriate conduct at all times while representing the fair and rodeo.
- 2. Washington County Fair & Rodeo Gold Card members are exempt from the above criteria and are always considered Members in Good Standing.
- 3. All rodeo directors and associate members in good standing shall annual dues of (\$10) each. Annual dues shall be paid to the Treasurer by the first regularly scheduled meeting in October. Members who have not paid by this time will not be eligible to vote at the election in November.
  - a. Annual dues shall be earmarked "Rodeo Proceeds" and deposited in the Fair's general fund.

Manager's Report: April 26, 2001

This month has been productive though somewhat intense. With the budget out of the way, my time has been spent in training Leah and focusing on the fair. Fortunately Leah is a quick study and very self-sufficient.

Most of the contracts with our suppliers, i.e. sound and soft drinks, etc. were easily extended for one year. I do have one that presents a problem, the portable toilets. Ron Johns has been the provider for many years. They have given excellent service and are locally owned. The problem is Bill McKinley had advised a competitor the contract was up this year and they expressed interest in providing a bid. I did send out a request for proposals to three companies and as predicted the out of state, Honey Buckets under bid all other proposals. (They do have an office in Salem.) They have been involved in a lawsuit for trespassing and other charges, (for going into competitors units and removing paper/soap/etc. then placing a sticker that claims the unit was inspected and found to be unacceptable). The Judge dismissed the case, yesterday, with the statement the case needed to be conducted in Washington State as both companies were based there, even though the occurrences were happening in Oregon. I do not care for the person incharge; he is abrasive and difficult to speak to however he is low bidder. When I take into consideration the value of the extras, (ads in the fair exhibitors handbook and the hand washing units, etc.) there is only a \$500.00 + difference. I guess I'm sympathetic to the local business that's been here for anything the fair might need opposed to the out-ofstate "big guy" that's taking over. Ron Johns' proposal was as stripped down as it could bee so I'm sure there is no room for any negotiation on a lesser cost on anything. It should be a multi year contract. I am speaking with the County to see what our options are, if any.

GROUNDS: We are all working on fair and projects that the Board has listed as objectives. The corner beautification project is coming along, with the curbing and walkways being poured. A fountain, flowers and placement of benches will make this area a peaceful retreat and beautiful focal point. The cost is in materials and will come out of capital improvements. The concrete was not discounted; however, every thing else will be donated or discounted. The major components are moveable, when or if need be. Many people at the events have commented positively even though the project was far from complete. Two pine trees were removed, not because of the project but because of insect damage. I did get another opinion and the trees would have shed most of their needles by fair time so it was prudent to remove them at this time. I understand another pine was taken out a few years ago with the same affliction. Flower barrels and beds will be planted about the second week of May.

I am disappointed in the progress of the pasture grass. Mike tells me it was good seed and that his method of planting was right. I'm hopeful the grass will take off with this warm weather. It should have been planted last fall. We probably would not have tried to work on it until this fall if the pasture had not been used as a dumpsite.

VENDORS: The food booths have been confirmed with some changes. The food will all be in the "food Court" area. The exception will be the coffee; it will remain in the same

spot and "Dipping Dots" a new product will be in the Exhibit Hall. If we receive any interesting food applications we would consider maybe three more quality booths with different menus.

The Main Exhibit Hall is full, some of the vendors have not yet paid but the checks and contracts are dribbling in slowly.

OUTSIDE VENDORS: Leah and I are working on the outside vendor spaces and placement of entertainment areas. It requires a lot of measuring and time outdoors; thank goodness the weather has been cooperating. As soon as that is done contacts should be remade with the implement dealers and the nurseries, etc. for a space commitment. At some date we should get an accurate map of the grounds that shows the trees, power, structures, etc.

We are still a little light on vendors but as soon as the sun comes out people that use fairs as a show place remember it's coming up, hopefully that will be the case. There are more than what I consider the normal amount of last year's vendors that will not be returning.

There will be changes in the ground layout, non-too dramatic and certainly for the betterment of the fair but enough for people to recognize a positive difference. Much will depend on the space required for the entertainment, Racing Pigs, and Extreme Team motorcycle. Everything revolves around the electrical needs and location of our power sources.

MEETINGS: \* I met with the County Risk Manager and two representatives of the Marsh Company to discuss the liability policy carried by CCIS.

- \*Molly Clausen, Draft Horse Superintendent, came in to discuss their role at fair as exhibitors and entertainers and her role as superintendent. They will continue to do a good job for us.
- \*Lt. Henderson, Washington County Sheriffs Dept., Art Berry, Grounds Security and I met to go over security. We will meet again next week with Lt., Schmerber, Hillsboro Police and Premier Security to finalize plans for the fair.
- \*The Key Account Manager and Director of Sales from Pepsi confirmed our verbal arrangement of extending the contract for one year, with the understanding the soft drink contract would go out to bid next year. The good news is they will, of course hold all products and services to last year's price level and will raise the sponsorship to \$4,000.00 from the \$2,550 of last year. We also negotiated some additional sponsorship co-ops and tags.
- \*Clerks. I met with them with a great deal of trepidation. They had been described as the "untouchables", the "we've always done it this way" group. I was also told, not to expect them to change because they had been here from the beginning and like the song "they did it their way". Everytime I had asked a question pertaining to entries or exhibitor's premiums or judging, the staff told me, "Oh, the clerks do that". Not for one minute did I believe the clerks do everything that I was being told and the fact they did it by hand and not computers, was even more unbelievable. What I found was a delightful group of dedicated ladies that are active, progressive and willing to do whatever it takes, and in fact, have been doing just that longer than any of us have or will do. This group is truly the backbone of the fair. Our meeting was informative and very positive. We will

institute some changes but because of the short time frame will not convert to a computer program this year, however in the fall/winter they were interested in working with it, looking for an implementation for the 2002 fair.

\*Connie King the Fire Prevention/Education Officer for Hillsboro Fire Department met with Leah and me on the display and vendor space they needed. That should be an excellent area with information and activities for both youth and adults.

\*There are always other unscheduled meetings with Superintendents, entertainers and vendors. Later this week I will meet with the Wagon Master for the wagon train display and reunion.

PROJECTS: There is one electrical project and I will send that to you under separate cover.
