Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert called the meeting to order at 4:35 PM.

The Consent Agenda review was re-scheduled for the May Fair Board meeting. The addition of an agenda item (A) under Old Business to include a report on plantings and landscaping by Sheila Day. An announcement; June 10 day for the Poker Ride at Flying M. to be added to the Minutes.

1.Fair Organization's Report: Bill McKinley and Paige Payne give report. McKinley said that almost all Personal Services; Professional Services and Food Concession contracts are out and are being received back at this time. There has been some reorganization of the various service groups that contract with us, and that is expected from year to year. Our task is to "mesh" with the new leadership of these organizations in meeting our objectives and theirs. Volunteers and volunteerism is a growing problem in our industry and most everywhere in general. There just appears to be fewer people with less time to give to philanthropic endeavors. Paige Payne has been working on the Fair books and they plan to go to press May 1st. Payne said that she is still in need of finding superintendents in three departments. She said that she has contacted numerous people in the areas of interest and has been getting much the same answer in that people do not want to put in the hours necessary to organize a department. Land Products, Food Preservation, and Beverages are the areas of need in this regard. Payne said that these

people do not need to have an extensive expertise to function as a superintendent, but do need organizational skills. Payne said that her commercial exhibits contracts are coming in as expected.

- **2.Rodeo Committee:** Gary Price gives report. Price said they are getting contracts back from their sponsors even with the dollar increase this year. The sponsors are supposed to be sending Paige Payne any changes to go into the Fair books. Besides that, everything is going quite well and are just waiting for some good weather to get out and do some work.
- 3.Maintenance Team Report: Albert Flanagan Jr. gives report. Flanagan said that we have reestablished a labor pool and it's working well. Spiesschaert said he agreed and it "shows" on the grounds. McKinley said that Margaret Garza was able to connect with the right people at Restitution, key people that Garza has had good relationships with in the past. McKinley mentioned that he files a report with Restitution supervisors every week giving a status report of the weeks' activities. Flanagan said that we have brought on board one of our temporary employees. Sheila Day mentioned that she had talked to Mike Wold about having a temporary employee on staff about a month before the Fair to make sure all the plants and flowers are watered. Day's comment for attention to watering support will be met by a temporary five hour per day employee that will be hired in addition to the additional five temps traditionally hired prior to Fair.
- 4.Old Business: (A) Sheila Day: Landscape/Planting report. Day mentioned that she had met with the Tualitin Valley Garden Club (TVGC) and that whatever miscommunication there was about their role at the Fair Complex was clarified. And that Day's objective was to enhance the entryways at a reasonable expense, and they (TVGC) had the expertise and we would try to get them the money to do that. Further, that the Fair Complex has not done a very good job in providing greater care for the plantings, especially in the area of "watering". Day said that there are three main areas that she would like TVGC to concentrate on and they would be; 1. The entry way at Cornell and 34th. 2. The area opposite of Arts & Crafts where the large planter bed is, and there remove the accumulated bark dust and backfill with top soil and then put the bark dust back. 3. To create an "eye diversion" at the west gate to shield from the public eye from the dirt and manure to the right at you enter the Fairgrounds. Day said that she asked the Boosters for some funds to accomplish these tasks. The sum was for \$1,000 dollars. Day said she would like to see a year-round effort in keeping up appearance in these areas. Discussion. (B) Policy Resolutions: Rich Vial leads. This is a "clean up" day, with no new resolutions. The only one that may be controversial is the policy related to Rodeo. Discussion/revision/correction.

(B) RFP Progress Report; Bill McKinley gives report. McKinley mentioned that the opening of the packets of the respondents to the RFP took place on March 28<sup>th</sup> with Rich Vial, Ken Leahy, David Lintz (Meadowlark Partners), Larry Eisenberg (County Facilities) and McKinley present. The documents were prepared in order for the selection process to follow on April 7

5.New Business: (A) Bill McKinley reviews the discussion items at the OFA Area Meeting held at our Fairgrounds March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2000. McKinley outlines the OFA strategy for this coming legislative session. The substance being, to find a way to tap lottery funds to help create an impound account that would eventually provide approximately \$50,000 per year to fairs from the interest only, and with a "sunset" of those lottery funds to fairs occurring when that perpetually sustaining figure is reached.

6.General Correspondence: (A) Gail Lodewick letter to Dan Aberg. Lyle Spiesschaert mentions the letter that the 4-H Horse Advisory Group (member), on their own, wrote to Dan Aberg of the Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce requesting money to be dispensed to them if bad weather adversely effects their event due to the displacement of their event, which was due to Air Show scheduling this year. Spiesschaert instructs McKinley to have John Baggott respond to Dan Aberg of the Chamber of Commerce explaining that the Lodewick authored letter does not represent the position of the Fair Board.

Dear Mr. Aberg,

We appreciate the letter that you sent to us in December regarding the Chamber's position about the Airshow.

Unfortunately, now we are requesting your help.

Because the airshow and the Washington County 4-H Horse fair cannot be held simultaneously, the 4-H program has been forced to change the dates of the horse fair to July 14-18.

The horse leadership had considered moving Horse Fair to after regular fair- unfortunately this conflicts with state horse fair and many family vacations so the earlier dates are the only way that horse fair can happen this year.

The effects of this decision have rippled through our program:

- 1) The 4-H wagon train has historically been scheduled to allow the participants to also compete at horse fair, this year will not be the case, the Wagon train and Horse fair will have to be held at the same time-forcing our kids to choose between the two complementary events.
- 2) The 4-H camping program has been changed to July 8-12 to allow those kids to participate at horse camp. However, the horses going to camp usually get more than 2 days to get their energy back before fair.
- 3) The weather in Western Oregon (as you well know) is often still very moist into the first weeks of July; making the main arena at the fairgrounds unusable. This would necessitate a change of venue for the horse fair.
- 4) Moving the dates of Horse Fair has also impacted the organizational members of horse fair. The volunteer that was going to be the Horse Fair Superintendent- Linda VanFleet- now has a scheduling conflict with horse fair, and won't be able to attend. The 4-H Horse program is now scrambling to find another persons(s) to take this leadership role.

Here is where your assistance is needed:

The horse advisory board will need funds to secure and pay for another facility in the event that the Main arena is unusable due to weather. The only local facility that is large enough to handle the number of horse members is McKay Creek Farms. Mt Hood Equestrian Center and the Yamhill County Fairgrounds are two other facilities in the greater Portland area that also meet the needs of the 4-H Fair Program.

If the weather is favorable- the funds that you donate to the 4-H horse program for the wet weather facility change would then be used to purchase more stalls for the fair. The Fair Grounds is still about 30 stalls short of the number needed to safely house the 4-H horse program horses...

As part of a Fairgrounds landscape enhancement project the Fair Board is hoping to improve some of the flower bed areas. Additionally there will be some new areas planted. As you know, the ground holds and keeps water due to the clay soil. In order for plants to grow it is necessary to plant in raised beds.

We would like to request financial assistance from the Fair Boosters, to purchase some needed materials. The biggest cost will be plants, top soil, and landscape blocks. There are 3 main areas of improvement. The top soil would be used for improving the flower beds near the Pioneer Village, in front of the Arts & Crafts building. The blocks will be used to create a planter inside the West entrance near the Cloverleaf building. The third area will be to improve the site at the entrance corner of Cornell and 34th.
