COUNTY FAIR BOARD MIETING.

MAY 8, 1933.

The Fair Board met in the Chamber of Commerce rooms Monday afternoon, May 8. There were present - Minton, Hesse, Banks, County Judge Don Templeton, and Commissioners Kirkman and Lewis.

Judge Templeton announced that he had re-appointed Mr. Minton as a member of the Fair Board for the three year term.

The first business was the election of officers which resulted as follows: president, H. T. Hesse; first vice-president, R. M. Banks; second vice-president, C. D. Minton; Ed. L. Moore, secretary.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Judge Templeton stated that the assistant county agent had asked him if the Fair Board would be willing to allow the 4H Club \$600.00 in premiums for their Fair. After discussion it was moved by Minton, seconded by Banks, that \$600.00 be approved for premiums for the 4H Club, and \$100.00 for the Future Farmers of America for premiums on exhibits, both fairs to be held in connection with each other on the Fair grounds at Hillsboro. Motion carried.

Judge Templeton brought in a report from County Agent Cyrus for the premiums for exhibits at the Manufacturers and Land Products show last fall, and asked if the Fair Board would advance \$200.00 this year for the same purpose. Moved by Minton, seconded by Banks, that a premium for \$200.00 for a County exhibit at the Manufacturers and Land Products department of the Pacific International Show be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Banks, that an appropriation for \$300.00 be made for a County Poultry and Products show, this show to be held later this fall, and to be under the management of the Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce. Motion carried. This appropriation was approved by County Judge Templeton and Commissioners Kirkman and Lewis.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Banks, that a warrant for \$200.00 be drawn in favor of the County Agent for premium money for the exhibits at the Pacific International Show last fall. Motion carried.

No further business appearing the Board adjourned.
