The board suggested the Hobby Hall but Mr Juncken felt that there was too much chance of damage from breaking in and all their equipment is expensive and must at all times be safe. A corner of the L H exhibit building was also suggested but not a good location as it opens up the entire building to possible trouble. No decision reached.

It was suggested that the secretary contact Monte Brooks regarding next years fair regarding entertainment and if possible have him attend the next meeting.
