Washington County Fair met in the office of the secretary with all members present.

Mr. Abts reported not much chance of city running water to new Fair Grounds as he had discussed the matter with them in regards to moving to the new grounds. A general discussion of the move of the buildings followed.

Mr. Abts moved to proceed with preparation to move to new grounds as soon as possible, seconded by Mr. Nyberg and passed.

Mr. Guerber moved to put lots owned by Fair Board on 8th and Maple up for sale. Seconded by Clayton Nyberg and passed.

Mr. Nyberg moved bids be invited on moving any or all Fair buildings to new grounds. Seconded by Mr. Abts and passed.

Mr. Guerber moved to accept offer of Mr. _____ to dig well free of charge and acceptable to Public Health Department, with Fair Board furnishing casing. Seconded by Mr. Nyberg and passed.

Time cards for Wilbur Zuver and Stanley Marugg were presented by secretary. After discussion it was decided to table these as no one had hired them.

Secretary presented claim of Mrs. C. Lincoln for a prize on pop corn which she reported the farm crop superintendent, Mrs. Shearer had told her she had won. The judges sheets on this department were examined and found to have awarded the prizes to Mr. & Mrs. Peters. The Board decided to table this matter also as it would be difficult to trace an error if there had been one in the clerking of the judge's sheets.

Letter from Bradford-Strietweiser Motors was read as ^{being} reduction in their space rent as it was more this year than last. Board decided there could be no reduction as all automobile people had paid the same rate.
