

August 4, 1943.

Washington County Fair Board met August 4, 1943 in the Commercial National Bank with all members present including the secretary. Mr. Svinth and Mr. Torvend also attended.

Mr. Torvend reported having contacted Mr. Guerber and Mr. Christensen regarding housing the imported Mexican laborers in the Fair Building. Due to the shortage of farm workers the Fair board decided to allow the Government to use the Fair buildings to house the workers brought in to help out in the emergency. After much discussion it was decided to use only the barns for Fair purposes this year and to have the 4-H, F.F.A. and Flower show exhibits in the City Auditorium.

Motion made and seconded to allow a 4-H Garden club exhibit as a whole to be added to the premium book with premiums amounting to \$12--\$8--\$5. Premiums to be used as scholarships for summer school. Passed.

Motion made to have Mutt Dog show under sponsorship of Rotary club the last afternoon of the Fair. Passed.

Motion made to adjourn.
