Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls the meeting to order at 4:30 with introductions of Board Staff and Guests.

1.Consent Agenda: Margaret Garza gives the report; Garza reviews, comments and explains the Fair Complex financial positions for the months of July and August. (no quorum present to accept the consent agenda)

2.Rodeo Report: Cody Feinauer gives the report; Feinauer said he believed that the Rodeo went well and that they (rodeo committee) have not had a formal meeting to evaluate the event yet. They will be having a meeting this coming Monday (Sept 11). The queen contest will be held October 28th. We have three directorships up, the regular two and the position of Lauri Benton who resigned because of her move to Texas. All Board applications have to be in by September 30th. Feinauer said that he is working on contracts for 2001 and it appears that at this year's coming Rodeo, a lot of people want to work for us. Feinauer is getting ready for the convention in Las Vegas and the Circuit Finals in Redmond. It doesn't show it yet, but when all our sponsorship money is in, we should have about \$80,000 this year. The Queen applications have to be in also by September 30th. There were no major injuries of any kind to cowboys or livestock. Garza said it looked as though we had a good Rodeo, Spiesschaert concurred. We still do not

have all the sponsorship money in. Spiesschaert said he thought that we were going to have it all in before the rodeo. Feinauer said he tried to do so. Garza said that the ones that are outstanding are the ones that we have had for years and they have always paid in the past. Spiesschaert said that this is a bad trend to get in to. Garza concurs. Spiesschaert said that the Board decided that if the money is not in, the sponsorship banners at the Rodeo do not fly. Garza suggests to Feinauer that they get the invoices out in a timely manner and that would help. Feinauer said that Gary Price got the invoices out in June. Vial said that he has for two years in a row tired to support the rodeo but nobody contacts him. Feinauer said that he gave Vial's card to his rodeo secretary and he doesn't know what happened after that.

3.4-H Report: John Baggott gives report. We have a new "program" (computer) that we're working with. Premium totals are \$4, 836. We have to eliminate the "no-shows" in the horse show event, and does not have figures for that. The Fair dance went well. The "youth services building" (armory) provides more space for some of the FFA exhibits. The "programming" went real well in there. Kathy Christy asked, "where was the dance"? Baggott said in the armory parking lot. Baggott said that 4-H has generated a ninety three page account of 4-H entries, premiums, etc. Garza asked for a copy of the report. Baggott said yes he would provide one. Vial observed that in the fair overview that the exhibitor 4-H money was way down. Vial assumed that is premium money. Garza said that those numbers have not been transferred into our book yet. Garza made a clarification on those line items. Kathy Christy asked how the Horse Show went. Baggott said, fine. No real problems.

4.Maintanence Report: Albert Flanagan Jr. gives report. The fair went smooth considering all the things that do happen. Vial asks if the Fair Board could have an objective report included in the packet as to what specific projects that have been accomplished, and what the maintenance team is looking to be accomplished in the next month. Garza mentions that insofar as projects are concerned, that they be made in concert with capital outlay. Vial says that probably will concern a six month period or more. And where we have been in the last thirty days and where we are going in the next thirty.

5.Fair 2000 Debriefing: It was suggested by Lyle Spiesschaert that a date should be set to review this year's Fair to assess where the Fair has been and where it is going in terms of goals and objectives. Kathy Christy suggests a full board gathering. Spiesschaert concurs. Cody Feinauer asked to be invited. (collectively) the Board agrees. Discussion. Garza suggests first a fair de-brief and then later in the fall a second broader Fair Complex overview. Kathy Christy suggest the 20th of September for the Fair De-brief / "work session" from 4pm to 8pm which will include representatives of the Rodeo and

Boosters. The format of the meeting is then discussed. The date and hours were then agreed to.

Margaret Garza comments on the National Guard Armory take over of the interim rental operation as of June 1st at the Armory by the Oregon Military Department. Garza mentions that while the Fair staff conducted interim rentals it was our objective not to have three similar events going on at the same time because of the security problems that occur under such an arrangement. With the Oregon Department of Military, their objective is to rent the facility and in particular to those renting for "public dances" without regard to what the Fair Complex is doing. This creates problems. Further, the revenue picture is down with the loss of booking revenue. Gross revenue last year was \$12,674 with us having to pay back \$4,000 because 50% of all base revenue goes back to them, which means that \$8,000 represents what went into our budget. We negotiated \$1,000 rental payment for the use of the Armory for the Fair. Vial asks Garza that he understood that in five in ten years the Armory property reverts back to the Fair. Vial said that it would be nice for them to understand that their use of the Armory is viewed by us as a short term arrangement and that eventually, the Armory will revert back to the Fair Complex for our use. Kathy Christy mentions also that she thought the property reverted back to the Fair Complex. Ken Leahy remembers hearing that the Military would vacate the property in favor of a new facility like Forest Grove. McKinley mentions that in the case of the Salem Armory, the lease with the State Fair was abrogated and the Military Department got essentially into the facilities rental business rather than the military business.

Rich Vial comments that he would like to volunteer to be the Fair Complex representative to the "West Side Economic Alliance", and that he would pay for the membership fees out of his own funds.

Kathy Chrisy moves that Rich Vial be the Fair Complex representative to the West Side Economic Alliance. Ken Leahy seconds, the motion passes.

Vial asks if anything came of the Ken and Vickie Miller fair tour this year. McKinley mentioned that he had talked to the Miller's and thought that their experience might be interesting and useful to hear. Garza suggest to invite them to our next Fair Board meeting.

Vial said that he met with some members of the Clackamas County Fair Board and suggests that we have a combined meeting to share experiences. Vial said that he could arrange a luncheon for a couple of Fair Board members to meet with Clackamas Fair Board members. Discussion. It was decided that the members of the Fair Board would seek out information on their own.

Kathy Christy suggests that after her discussion with Charlie Cameron, the Washington County Administrator, that the Board attend a Board training session, and that Cameron will present a list of facilitators for the Fair Board to chose from. Garza has received this data from the County Administrator's office. To be discussed later.

6.Fair Complex Development: David Lintz gives report. There has been a request by the Board of County Commissioners to have a meeting with the Fair Board to make sure that everyone is on the "same page". Lintz thinks that it's about time to regroup. Time to talk about priorities. Garza said that she had called Tom Brian about such a meeting. A discussion ensued about the various "pieces" of the puzzle. Vial and Leahy suggest that we present a draft in professional form outlining essentially three alternatives; (A) remodel existing, (B) sell and build, and (C) property lease, along with various sub options with supporting "numbers/data" to the Board of County Commissioners. General discussion. Lintz further mentions a need for the project to fit the findings of the July 5th LRS report on the east side of 34th avenue, and part of the Port of Portland property. The report is due back by the end of the month (September 30, 2000).

Rich Vial moves that the Fair Board authorize the payment of \$4,500.00 to LRS to perform the work in providing additional data for the Fair Complex Development project to be completed by the end of September. Kathy Christy seconds the motion. The motion carries.

Kathy Christy mentions that she met with representatives of the Regional Arts Commission and they had some questions about if we had talked to the Convention and Visitor's Bureau about what kind of things we could accommodate. She asked, did we ever do anything with them? Garza said yes that they had a whole list of things. Christy said of course at this stage we are talking conceptual, but down the road, they would like to present some ideas and would like to be on a steering committee at some point.

MAINTANENCE TEAM REPORT OCTOBER 4, 2000

MIKE WOLD: Mike has been helping to do set up, and tear down of Bingo. He has also added left over sand from the Fair to the warm-up arena to help control dust and keep it from packing down so hard, it is about 2" to 3" deep. Mike has also picked up about 40 yards of potting soil from Iwasaki Bros. for the beds, and with a lot more to come. Mike is in the process of receiving bids of repairs of the black top. Iwasaki Bros. has donated 300 flats of winter "pansies" and Mike and Rudy and the restitution workers are in the process of preparing the ground and planting them. Mike is fertilizing the grounds and mowing grass. He is also trapping gophers and moles with 16 caught at last count. Mike will be working in the near term in assessing the proposed irrigation system for the old gazebo area.

KELLY GOODIN: Kelly has completed a Floral Building roof assessment and has requested and received bids on the restoration of the roof. Kelly has also been working on repair of the Barn doors, roofs, and walls. Kelly closed up the Dairy / Beef barn walkway for boat storage. Kelly has been drying out the considerable waste paint in preparation for disposal. Kelly is preparing the drawings for the ADA related Grandstand improvement to be completed in the near future.

ALBERT FLANAGAN JR. AND SR.: Jr. and Sr. finished up fair clean-up and breakdown, including shade-clothes, panels, barns, grounds, buildings etc. The team has been, as per their monthly routine, setting-up, tearing down, cleaning up of the buildings for interim rental, including bingo every week. Also they are assisting in; mowing, weed-eating, painting and making minor repairs. The team has been the primary supervisors over the restitution workers. The month of October will be much the same as September.

Fair's about due for changes

The Fair Board is intent on increasing attendance but also wants to modernize facilities and entertainment and raise fees

HILLSBORO - With attendance flat and revenues down from last year, those who know it best say the Washington County Fair and Rodeo needs a spur in

the flank.

So wine-tasting, mutton-busting, miniature bulls and "gee whiz" farm equipment could be on the way next year. And boring rodeo clowns and tame carnival rides are on the way out.

During a brainstorming session last week, Fair Board members said they need to make changes to attract the area's 25-year-old high-tech workers to next year's event, which is themed "A Fair for All." They discussed ways to be relevant in the 21st century without losing the county's agricultural heritage.

"We have to keep up with the public," said board president Lyle Spiesschaert. "We just cannot rest on tradition."

The soul-searching comes at the same time the fair is interested in redeveloping its facility. A consultant's report said the county would need to spend \$33.5 million to create a modern fair facility. The board is studying several options, including moving across Northwest 34th Avenue to the east, leasing land from the Port of Portland and possibly leasing its current site for commercial or retail use.

Both discussions have led to the board's pondering the role of the fair in a county where high-tech industry is overshadowing agricultural heritage. There have been no easy answers.

And another difficult decision might be increasing admission from \$6 to \$7 or more, increasing parking fees or charging for special events such as the rodeo. Senior citizens also might no longer get in free.

Fair: Board aims for 65,000, more business sponsorships

At this point, all of the ideas are tentative except one: The board set a goal of increasing paid attendance next year by 20,000 to 65,000.

Board member Richard Vial first wanted to set a goal of 75,000 paid attendance, but backed down after fair staff said that was unrealistic. Instead, he agreed to 65,000 but also wanted business sponsorships to increase by \$25,000 from this year's \$63,250.

Paid attendance was nearly 44,000 this year, compared with 45,000 last year. For the last four years, paid attendance has remained flat, averaging 44,250.

This year, the fair took in about \$636,000, compared with \$783,045 last year. Much of that was due to the lack of a big-name musical act. Last year, teen pop phenomenon Britney Spears performed. Carnival and parking revenues also were down this year.

However, staff expected the lower attendance and revenues and were able to keep expenses down. That left a net income of \$53,873, compared with \$82,217 last year.

"Certainly I would have liked to have greater numbers than we had, but at least we had a positive bottom line," said Margaret Garza, fair complex executive director.

Several factors in addition to the lack of a big-name music act contributed to the low turnout, Garza said. The fair was competing against the Clark County Fair, suffered from following the Rose Festival Airshow by less than two weeks and battled warm temperatures over the weekend that might have kept some people away.

Staff and board members also

complained about this year's carnival. During their work session, they wondered aloud whether their contractor sent some of the better rides to the Deschutes County Fair.

But Ron Burback of Amusement Consulting Services said the Washington County Fair only had to ask for specific rides and he would have provided them.

Some of the successes at this year's fair included a truck pull and demolition derby.

The board discussed whether to spend \$20,000 for an act such as Charley Pride but didn't come to a conclusion, choosing to see what acts are available next year.

Spiesschaert, a farmer, said the fair has to refocus on emerging agricultural industries. That includes wineries, nurseries and waterscaping. A bonsai exhibit, for example, was successful this year.

Vial also thought the fair could attract high-tech workers with large, high-tech farm equipment.

Spiesschaert also said he would like to revive an old tradition and have 10 to 12 covered wagons from the 4-H Wagon Train at the fair.

Cody Feinauer, the rodeo committee chairman, asked the board to extend the two-hour time limit on the rodeo. The board also dis-

cussed adding novelty acts to the rodeo. That could include youngsters riding sheep in mutton bucking, teen-agers riding steers and full-grown Brahman bulls weighing only 500 pounds.

Feinauer also suggested the fair charge \$2 admission to the rodeo, but board members couldn't reach a consensus. Some said the fair prided itself on free admission to special events once fairgoers paid their entrance fee.

But the board did agree on another rodeo tradition.

"The clown acts are getting stale," Spiesschaert said.

Federal bureau eyes Hagg Lake

\$50,000 are earmarked to study establishing a conference-education-community center

HILLSBORO — Henry Hagg Lake, Washington County's recreation playground, is once again under consideration as a site for a conference center.

This time the suggestion comes from the property's owners, the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. As part of a re-evaluation of its properties, the federal agency is going to spend \$50,000 studying whether to build a combination conference center, education center and Scoggins Valley community center along the lake.

The suggestion presents more questions than answers at this early stage, Washington County commissioners were told Tuesday. The viability of the project isn't at all clear, Larry Eisenberg, Washington County's facilities manager, told them. The site, the cost, the size, who would run it and its impact on sewage, water runoff and drinking water all are unknown.

"These are the kinds of questions they're going to answer," Eisenberg said.

Any type of overnight facility would be a first for the park, where camping is forbidden. Since opening in 1974 southwest of Forest Grove, Hagg Lake has been one of the county's most popular summer recreation spots, with more than 20,000 people showing up on sunny summer days to fish, boat, swim, hike and picnic. County officials say annual attendance may one day exceed 1 million.

The 1,100-acre lake was formed in 1974 with construction of Scoggins Dam, built by the Bureau of Reclamation for irrigation and flood control. The county operates the lake and the 2,600-acre. Scoggins Valley Park surrounding it under a 50-year lease from the federal agency.

Commissioners Tuesday had only to agree to cooperate with the study, which will require no money from county coffers. Commissioners seemed intrigued by the idea but were cautious in their reactions.

"It's an opportunity to add value to the greater county and for the residents and the schools," said Tom Brian, the commission chairman.

But "it's not really central to the county's core mission," cautioned Charles D. Cameron, the county administrator.

Several needs could be met by the project, Eisenberg said. The Northwest Regional Education Service District has long coveted a permanent site for its outdoor school program. The Washington County Visitors Association thinks the site is underutilized and would like a convention center. Portland State University, Eisenberg said, needs a home for field research for its new lakes and reservoirs study program. And Scoggins Valley residents need a community center.

This isn't the first time commissioners have talked about a development at Hagg Lake. In 1997, then-Commissioner Kathy Christy and tourism officials discussed developing a conference center or a lodge or an inn at the lake as a way to increase use of the area. But the project never got beyond the discussion stage.

Cameron said that cooperating with a Bureau of Reclamation study is fine, but he expressed discomfort with the idea of using money from the county's general fund.

"That," he said, "is where the incline gets pretty steep."
