Motion was made by Abts and seconded by Sahnaw that a check be drawn on the fair account and deposited to the Premium Account to make up the deficit of \$731.71. Motion carried.

It was noted that under Vegetables - Class 5, No. 9, small green pickling cucumbers had been omitted and should be added to the premium list with prizes of .75¢ and .50¢, also under Horticulture- No. 9, Best plate crabapples, 10 specimens were added carrying prizes of .75¢ and .50¢; also under Chickens- Show Class Division F.- Jap Silkies were to be added carrying prizes as listed for other breeds; under Ducks No. 3. Mallard were added with prizes the same as listed for other breeds; also added were rabbits- commercial and pen of young carrying prizes of \$1.00 and .50¢. The above corrections and additions were accepted upon motion made by Sahnaw and seconded by Abts, and carried.

There being no further business coming before the meeting the same stood adjourned.
