Current Meeting Schedule

Unless otherwise noted, Fair Board Meetings are held the first Wednesday of every month at 4:30 p.m. at the Washington County Fair Complex, 873 N.E. 34th Avenue, Hillsboro, Oregon 97124.

Regular Business Meetings

Regular business meetings are the time during which the Fair Board will consider the items published in their Board Agenda at the times noted above.

Generally, Board Meetings are scheduled to last no longer than two hours. At the discretion of the Board Chair, agenda items may be deferred to a later date if more discussion or consideration is required.

Quorum

To take formal action on any agenda item, at least four (4) Board members must be present. Once a quorum is established, at least a majority of these members present must vote in the affirmative to move an action or motion. The Board can still conduct business and discuss agenda items without a quorum present. However, no formal action can take place until a quorum of the Board is in attendance.

Once the Regular Business Meeting Begins

The Fair Board's formal meetings typically include the following elements:

Re: 2010 County Fair Report

Here is some information regarding this year's event.

Weather – The weather was very nice and mild for the entire event

Attendance – Total attendance through the turnstiles at the two entrance gates was 85,405 which is 2% up from 2009. Thursday's attendance was the largest Thursday on record and Sunday attendance was disappointing. The breakdown by day is:

Thursday – 15,209 – 91% up over 2009 Friday – 16,522 – 15% up over 2009 Saturday – 26,798 – 18% up over 2009 Sunday – 26,876 – 30% down over 2009

Fairtime Revenues – Revenues are still trickling in as well as bills to pay. Carnival was up 16% over 2009 and will exceed budget by 6%, Food & Beverage percentages were up 3% over 2009 and will be exceed budget by 20%. Commercial Booth sales were up 6% over 2009 and will come in right at budget. Parking Revenue is up 5% over 2009 and will exceeded budget by 5%. Camping fees are down 9% and Livestock Entry fees are down 30%. Sponsorship is severely down and will come in 38% under budget.

Arena Events – During the Fair the arena had 3590 GA seats. This number is determined by 18" per person. The average fair attendee tends to take up more than 18", so it's difficult to put that many people in, as they don't want to sit that close to their neighbor. Here is how the numbers turned out:
