It was noted that during the fair the fair board had verbally agreed that premiums would be allowed on the poultry exhibited and not listed in the premium book, due ~~to~~ mainly to lack of exhibits, therefore, this agreement was put in the form of a motion by Nyberg, seconded by Abts and carried.

Also motion was made by Abts, seconded by Nyberg and carried that \$3.00 premium be allowed in open class under manual arts.

Motion was made by Nyberg, seconded by Abts and carried that the fair board be authorized to borrow \$1500.00 for ninety days. The following resolution was passed:

"BE IT RESOLVED, That the President and Secretary are hereby authorized by the Washington County Fair Board to borrow up to the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred (\$1,500.00) Dollars from the Hillsboro Commercial Branch of the United States National Bank. "

Mention was made by the secretary that the premium fund would be overdrawn in the amount of \$903.40 if all warrants were cashed, Therefore, it would be necessary to transfer from the regular account sufficient monies to make up the deficit. Motion was made by Abts, seconded by Nyberg that we transfer when needed to the premium account, up to the above amount. Motion carried.

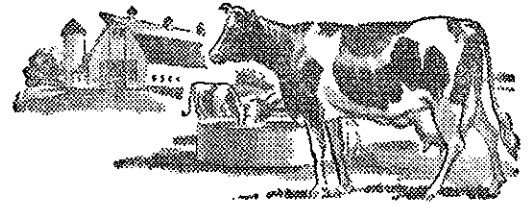
There being no further business the same stood adjourned.
