#### WASHINGTON COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

# TRAINING

The Board authorized Hesse to attend a PCC lecture class on November 8, 1984 regarding Hiring, Evaluating and Firing. The Board also authorized Hesse to attend a Western Fairs Manager's Conference November 7-9 in San Francisco. She will obtain a program for the January 27-30, 1985 Convention in Monterey, California.

## WINTER REPAIRS

Ron McAuley, Operations Superintendent, reported a list of jobs to be completed by winter. They included, repair water line in livestock barns, rebuild drinking fountains, repair livestock racks, build storage compound behind shop, remodel main exhibit building kitchen, level show rings and seed with grass.

# HOTEL/MOTEL TAX

Larry Sprecher gave a brief history of the Washington County Visitors Association and their current position regarding the hotel/motel tax increase. The WCVA supports the Fair Board receiving 1% dedicated funds. An agreement was presented which stated if either the WCVA or Fair Board should receive a dedicated 2%, they will share 50% of the funds to the other party.

MOTION: MOVED BY LLOYD BARON, SECONDED BY JEANNE LEESON, THAT CHAIRMAN MARGARET SPRECHER SIGN THE ABOVE DESCRIBED AGREEMENT.

# FAIR BOARD FAIR RECOMMENDATIONS

Jeanne Leeson made the following suggestions: the Chamber Luncheon be served on time (even though the Fair Board is not directly responsible, they still receive complaints); the hole in the Sheriff's Building be repaired; drinking fountains repaired; possibly putting in a sink for food demonstrators. It was suggested that the Home-Ec section be moved to the North End of the Main Exhibit Building so demonstrators can use the kitchen area.

Lloyd Baron reported there needed to be improvement in the Land Products division. Printing the premium book earlier and visiting the farm bureau were two of the suggestions to help improve the division. Baron stated there was a potential for berries. It would require purchasing or renting a cooler and he was looking into the cost of a used cooler. Baron stated that it is simply too early in the year for some produce.

John Love suggested there was an extended roof from the ticket gate at the grandstand arena.

Margaret Sprecher said she would like Johnny Limbo & the Lugnuts two nights and suggested scheduling them on a different night than the Destruction Derby. She also suggested having the Destruction Derby on two different nights. She stated the carnival was a dissappointment and the Board discussed the possibility of contracting a different carnival. Because of the limited number of carnivals it would mean moving the fair ahead or behind a week. Moving the fair dates would affect the current stock contractor, and the Land Products division. Having Davis Amusement upgrade some of their rides and keep the fair dates the same was another suggestion.

Sprecher also suggested two-way radios for the Operations Superintendent and the office in case of any problems or emergencies.

#### FAIR DATES

No decision as to 1985 fair dates. Hesse will check into the possibility of Umatilla County moving their dates and other possible carnival operators being available August 6 - 10, 1985. If necessary, she will travel to Hermiston to meet with the Umatilla County Fair Board.

#### PLANNING SESSION

Fair Board planning session will be Monday, October 8, at 4:30 p.m. Dinner will be provided for the Fair Board.

## DIRECTOR'S EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

Chairman Sprecher recommended the job title be changed to Executive Director, and she also recommended the Board reexamine salary at the next Fair Board meeting.

MOTION: MOVED BY LLOYD BARON, SECONDED BY JEANNE LEESON, TO CHANGE THE TITLE TO EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, TO EMPLOY HESSE AS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, OCTOBER 1, 1984 to SEPTEMBER 30, 1985, AND TO FURTHER EXAMINE THE SUGGESTED SALARY INCREASE OF \$127 PER MONTH AT THE OCTOBER BOARD MEETING. MOTION CARRIED.

#### WESTLAND INVESTMENT

Hesse briefly presented a letter dated August 30, 1984 regarding development of the fairgrounds "surplus" property. Hesse stated there needs to be more guidlines to follow regarding proposals received for development. She will contact county counsel and request county assistance. We need to find out if the county has a broker policy.

Next Fair Board meeting will be Wednesday, October 10, 1984 at 4:30 p.m. at the fairgrounds office.
