minutes - Jashington County Fair Board - September 9, 1970

The regular monthly meeting of the Washington County Fair Board was held in the fair office on September 9, 1970 with Chairman Jossy presiding. Those present were mcGough, Adams, Scott, Balland Shearer. Guests: Harry Coulson, Pomona Grange and Joe VanDyke, Horse Superintendent.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. Coulson met with the Board to discuss further, their decision regarding Sunset Grange's disqualification. He felt they had been punished enough by having the \$100.00 premium withheld and should be allowed to put in the State Fair booth in 1971. He stated other Grangers in the county are dissatisfied with the Board's decision and if it stands, they will not participate in the fair. Dr. McGough moved to maintain the \$100.00 fine and not declare who goes to the State Fair. Mr. Scott seconded. Motion carried. The Board advised Mr. Coulson the decision now lies with Pomona Grange on who they call the winner. A letter will be sent to all 1970 exhibitiors in this division explaining the

Mr. VanDyke requested draft horses remain in the halter classes and that the Board discuss another pulling contest or driving contest. He stated he would not participate in the pulling contest if it were held in the small arena after the experience of the run-away team. The Board agreed there is no reason this could not be held in the main arena on the Saturday of the fair. He also felt he would need \$50.00 per team expense money in order to get the participants. This to be considered at budget time. Making the horses at halter a point show was discussed. He was advised to look into the costs, etc. of this and report back to the Board. A plowing contest will be held in the spring and plans are underway for this. Mr. Adams, Dr. McGough and Mr. VanDyke will meet to get all show events coordinated for rhe horse shows, rodeo-horse show, and other horse oriented shows.

The 1971 show dates were tentatively set for August 3 through 7.
