He worked for the Tobyhanna Army Depot as an electronics technician specialist.for 35 years. During that time he traveled to many foreign countries.


He was a member of Pocono Lodge #780 F&AM, the VFW and the American Legion. He was a veteran of the Army and served in Viet Nam.
