- 100 - Poster showing leaf "critters"
- 105 - Experiment with soil samples
- 110 - Forest touch box
- 115 - Make a bird feeder
- 120 - Display of renewable and nonrenewable materials
- 125 - Project Book

Trees + Me = Forestry (no more than 5 entries per project)

- 200 - Draw your favorite tree and mount the drawing on poster board. Draw products and benefits we enjoy from this tree.
- 205 - Report on jobs related to the forest.
- 210 - Display and label leaves, twigs or branch cross section from six or more tree species.
- 215 - Poster: Make road map or key to identify 6 tree species from a collection of leaves. Use one main group – coniferous or deciduous. Construct map to identify leaves and attach to leaf collection. Identify characteristics used to distinguish each leaf.
- 220 - Draw a yard map showing the location of your home and the trees around it. Name trees, and mount a leaf, twig, or seed from each tree and glue next to the drawing.
- 225 - Mount or display a seed collection of 8 species. Group according to how the seeds travel. Display each species' seed cut in half to show the inside.
- 230 - Poster showing the death of a particular tree and what happens to a log as it decomposes, or other topic.
- 235 - Display of cross section of a tree stem. Stem should be at least 20 years growth. Talk about this tree's "life story."
- 240 - Display illustrating wildlife found in at least two different forest types. Identify tree species and at least two wildlife species found in that forest type.
