"An acceptable level of risk or what society says is safe."



Signage/Guest Information

- Where?
 - Website/Mobile App
 - Parking Lots
 - Admission Gates
 - Ticket Booths
 - Printed Materials (Programs, Tickets, Coupons)
 - Carnival Rides/Games
 - Concert Screens or Advertising LED Boards
 - Live Announcement (Arena or Concert Venue)

Signage/Guest Information

- What Info?
 - Prohibited Item List
 - Code of Conduct
 - Contact Info (Guest Services, Security Assistance, 1st Aid, etc.)
 - Safety Info (Required height for ride, use of restraints, etc.)
 - Evacuation procedure or Nearest Exit location

Presentation

- Visual
 - Entry Security Screening (Magnetometers, Bag-check, Wand)
 - High Visibility Security Uniforms (Bright Color)
 - High Visibility Patrol & Area Saturation (Party or Kids Areas)
 - High Visibility Law Enforcement Patrol
 - Law Enforcement Assets (Vehicles, Dogs, Horses, Alcohol Awareness)
 - Identifiable 1st Aid, Security, Law Enforcement locations
 - Surveillance Cameras (Operable or not)
 - *Local Media Stories regarding Security
 - *Gate/Vehicle Barrier(s)

Guest Security Screening at Entrance Gates

- Airport or Courthouse Mindset "Safer on the Other Side"
- Bag Check, Magnetometer, Wand Usage
- High Visibility "Prohibited Item" Signage
- Saturation of Security/Law Enforcement Personnel
- Part Deterrent & Part Catch-All
- Security Theater?

High Visibility Security Operations

Lost/Found Children Reunification

- High Visibility Reunification Area if possible (Signage)
- Must have a process even if not perfect.
- Closest Interaction many staff members will have with Guests.
- Word of an effective process will travel fast.
- Staff Members and reunification area(s) must be comforting throughout.
- Coordinate with on-site Law Enforcement if possible.

Process

Lost/Found Children Reunification Areas of Focus

- Lost Children vs. Found Children
- Staff Training

(Staff must be familiar with proper Radio Usage, Physical Location and Parent/Children Reunification procedures.)

- Electronic Assistance (Voluntary Data Collection)
- Special Needs Guests, Non-English Speaking, Guests with PTSD
- Avoid public announcements if possible.
- Dispatcher must accurately document reporting time, details and reunification time.

Process

OCFEC Lost/Found Children Reunification Process

- Notification Received.
- Reporting party to remain at scene and keep eyes on reporting party.
- Physically hold onto reporting party if need be.
- Radio/Call to Base to report Lost or Found child.
- Dispatcher to halt radio traffic and prepare to receive description of missing child or parent(s).
- Reporting staff member to relay description:

(Name, age, height, ethnicity, hair color, clothing, last seen location)

- Dispatcher relays info to Security & Law Enforcement staff to begin search.
- Dispatcher relays info to Gate & Parking Staff.

Process

OCFEC Lost/Found Children Reunification Process

- If not reunited in 5 minutes, present party shall be escorted to the Lost Children's Booth, Security Office or other central location.
- Staff to remain visible and continue search in area last seen.
- Inquiring party to be brought to Lost Children's Booth for reunification.
- Confirm with both parties that reunification involves correct people prior to releasing a child to an adult.
- If reunification happens successfully, notify dispatcher immediately.

Separated parents and children can be frantic. Do your best to calm those involved and maintain a calm demeanor at all times.

Lost/Found Children Reunification Basics

- Must have a process even if not perfect.
- How will you communicate?
- Who will you communicate with?
- How will you train your staff?
- Who will you train?
- Where will the process be based out of?
- Creative Ideas? (Stickers, Bracelets, Electronic Data, etc.)

Physical Set-Up

- Lighting (Quantity & Placement)
- Reduction of "Dark" areas
- Reduce or limit access to "Behind the Scenes" or "Out of View" areas
- Party Atmosphere proximity to Children's or Kid's area(s)
- Alcohol Sales/Consumption area(s) proximity
- Restrooms strategically placed in Children's area(s)
- Availability of "Family" Restrooms
- Highly visible, easily accessible 1st Aid area(s)
- Sectoring Assignments for Security/Law Enforcement personnel

Deterrents and The Ability to React

Deterrent

de.ter.rent

noun

1. a thing that discourages or is intended to discourage someone from doing something.

Deterrent

- Patron Entry Security Screening
- High Visibility Security & Law Enforcement Personnel
- Security & Law Enforcement Vehicles/Dogs
- Lighting
- Easily Identifiable Areas
- Signage
- Surveillance Cameras (Operable or Not)
- Observation Posts (Staffed or Not)

Deterrent

- Preventative Measures
 - Pre-employment Screening
 - Criminal Background Check
 - Megan's Law Screening (CA PC Section 290.000 to 290.024)
 290 Registrant must remain more than 2,000 feet away from school, park or places where children usually gather.
 - Applies to all Staff, Contractors, Partners, Entertainers, etc.
 - Staff Training Set clear behavioral expectations.
 - "At-will" Seasonal Staff Better off short-staffed than exposed.
 - Publicized Electronic Perimeter (Ankle Monitor)

Reaction

re·ac·tion

noun

1. an action performed or a feeling experienced in response to a situation or event.

Reaction

- Must have Plan/Process
- Staff members assigned to execute plan
- Ability to Communicate
- Management Emergency Notification
- Plain Clothes Security or Law Enforcement Personnel
- Assistance from local LE

(Sex Crimes, Gang Units, UCs, Juvenile Crimes, Explorers, Cadets)
