Facing record-breaking catastrophes state-wide, California's network of 76 fairgounds answered the call to service admirably. With 24 fairgrounds serving as evacuation centers, fire camps, and/or animal shelters in 2017, the continued need for these community resources became undeniably evident.

REFUGE FOR ALL

During the wine country fires, the Department of Developmental Services oversaw the relocation of individuals with developmental disabilities to the Dixon May Fairgrounds.



To successfully accomplish such a delicate and important task takes cooperation between numerous government agencies. City, County, and State officials came together to facilitate the transition and ensure every possible need was met. The East Bay Incident Management Team coordinated with local law enforcement and the Army National Guard to provide security and manual labor in the construction and maintenance of the site.




