Thank You Cards

The WTF&R is incredibly fortunate to have generous award, premium, and cash prize sponsors and donors. Individuals, ranches, businesses, and associations selflessly give their resources to the WTF&R Livestock Shows. In order to receive your award, you *must* write a "Thank You" card to the individual, ranch, business, or association. The WTF&R will provide blank "Thank You" cards and cover the postage expense. At the conclusion of your class, if you have won an award, visit the Livestock Office located in the First Financial Pavilion, and write your "Thank You" card(s). Envelopes will be handled by the Livestock Secretary and the WTF&R will cover postage expenses. The WTF&R appreciates your understanding and shares your gratitude for the individuals, ranches, businesses, and associations that are dedicated to the growth of the agricultural industry.

Premiums

Beginning in 2023, exhibitors will no longer be presented premium cash vouchers. The Accounting and Sponsorship Coordinator of the Expo Center of Taylor County and the Livestock Secretary will pre-package envelopes before the show with a placing ribbon and the cash value of that placing. These envelopes will be sealed, labeled, and given directly to the Superintendent on the day of the show. At the conclusion of placings, the Superintendent and their volunteers will hand the sealed envelope to exhibitors. The WTF&R believes that this new method of payouts will encourage accountability and improve the efficiency of the Livestock Shows. The allocated premium amount for placings will be outlined in the 2023 West Texas Fair & Rodeo Premium Book.

Calf Scramble

The Calf Scramble is open to FFA and 4-H members in the following counties: Taylor, Nolan, Fisher, Jones, Shackleford, Callahan, Coleman, Runnels, Coke, Eastland, Brown, Sterling, Mitchell, and Scurry. Please note the addition of 5 counties. Here at the WTF&R, we believe that the youth of Texas should have access to higher education. We hope that expanding our entry eligibility for the Scholarship Calf Scramble will provide more students with the opportunity to pursue higher education at a junior college, trade school, or four-year university. Beyond the Ring Junior Livestock Association

All eligible Jr. Livestock Shows are sanctioned by Beyond the Ring Junior Livestock Association. Eligible breeds include Jr. Steers, Youth Market Lambs, Youth Meat Goats, and all Jr. Heifer exhibitors. Placings will be recorded by the Livestock Secretary and sent to BTRJLA at the conclusion of the WTF&R Livestock Shows to be filed with BTRJLA.

Jr. Steer Show

The Jr Steer Show is implementing a 17-Breed Classification system for 2023. Steers must weigh a minimum of 700 pounds to be eligible to show. There will be a 5% tolerance on both sides of the minimum weight. There will be *no* Prospect or Progress divisions – steers will be classified by breed and weight. Weight breaks will be made appropriately by the Jr. Steer Superintendent and the Livestock Secretary. For a full outline of the Jr. Steer Show, see the special rule sheet in the Premium Book. As a result of this new format, Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion prize monies has increased. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion steers will still be hair tested. Once test results have been filed with the Livestock Secretary, the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion steers will still be hair tested. Jr. Hereford Heifer Show

To encourage overall breed growth and membership, the Jr. Horned Hereford Heifer Show and Jr. Polled Hereford Heifer Show have been combined into a single show – the Jr. Hereford Heifer Show. For a full outline of the Jr. Hereford Heifer Show, see the special rule sheet in the Premium Book. This combination is relevant with the Texas Hereford Association show practices and allows Jr. Hereford Heifer exhibitors to be eligible for larger premium amounts and encourages competition for the overall betterment of the Hereford breed. The Jr. Hereford Heifer Show has been approved by the Texas Hereford Association and the Jr. Hereford Superintendent. Registered Horned and Polled Hereford Heifers are eligible to show in the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Jr. Hereford Heifer Show.

Open Poultry

The new entry deadline for Open Poultry exhibitors is August 19th, 2023. This deadline has been implemented to encourage healthier, higher quality birds at the WTF&R Open Poultry Show.

Jr. and Open Llama

There is a new division for the Jr. and Open Llama Show – Sub Junior 7 & Under. This division is open to youth aged 7 and under. Classes will include Showmanship, Obstacle, and Public Relations. Prizes for Sub Junior 7 & Under exhibitors will be Premium B. For a full outline of the new division, see the special rule sheet in the Premium Book.

Open Beefmaster

The new show start time is 10:00 a.m. The WTF&R has made this change to allow Beefmaster exhibitors to travel home safely at the conclusion of the Open Beefmaster Show.

Pre-Junior and Junior Miniature Herefords

There is a new Showmanship division for 2023. Pre Jr. exhibitors will compete in the PeeWee Showmanship Division. Junior exhibitors will compete in Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Showmanship. Showmanship class breaks will be made according to exhibitor age. For a complete outline of the Showmanship divisions, see the special rule sheet in the Premium Book.



RVs, MOVE-IN, AND PARKING

RV Reservations: To make an RV reservation, call (325) 677-4376 or visit the West Texas Fair & Rodeo website, www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. Vehicles with RV reservations may enter through Gate 5 (Loop 322 Access Road). All vehicles parking in RV spots must be within the designated RV spot. Livestock exhibitor RVs will be placed in the RV lot South of First Financial Pavilion.
Move-In: Exhibitors will be allowed to move in one day prior to show day. Please use Gate 3 & 5 ONLY. Specific arrival and move-in information can be found in the special rule sheets.
Parking: No Parking Passes will be given for the first weekend. Only vehicles hauling livestock will be given a parking pass for Weekend 2 and/or 3. Livestock parking will be available on the North end of Taylor Telecom Arena. Overflow parking will be in the public parking lot. All Livestock parking must enter through Gate 3 (Expo Drive).

MOVE-OUT AND RELEASES

Releases are digital in 2023. A QR code will be sent to the email provided upon entry. Wi-Fi is available in the Guitar Arena and First Financial Pavilion. No release will be considered until ONE hour after the conclusion of your show. A release is required in order to load out. Please do not try to pack up, move equipment, or load animals before the conclusion of your breed show. The WTF&R grounds are very busy. Prioritize you and your animal's safety during move-out times. If your release email is not loading, step out from the cover of the barn to get a clear signal. In the case that this does not work, contact the

Livestock Secretary for assistance.

CATTLE STALLING INFORMATION

Breeding Cattle:

SUBMITTED WITH ONLINE ENTRY

The West Texas Fair & Rodeo can make no guarantees on stalling requests. Stalling requests are utilized for *who* you would like to stall with, *not* your location in the barn. If you are requesting to stall cattle entered in both the Junior and Open shows with a specific group in the Open show, please allow *one* person to submit the form indicating the number of head stalled together and a list of exhibitor names. Only one request per show string is required. If you are requesting to stall by breed instead of with your chapter or county, please have your AST/CEA submit a letter on official letterhead notifying the Livestock Secretary of your request by email, mholder@expoctc.com.

Junior Steers:

SUBMITTED WITH ONLINE ENTRY

All steer entries will be pre-stalled. AST/CEAs may submit a stalling request for Junior Steer entries if they need to be stalled near another chapter or county. Location in the barn and individual requests will *not* be considered. AST/CEAs must submit stalling requests by email, mholder@expoctc.com.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS Junior & Open Entry Deadline: August 1, 2023

The Livestock Secretary's Office is located in the Northwest corner of the First Financial Pavilion. Stalling and releases will be handled from this office. Shavings, straw, RV hookups will be sold at the Cashiers office located in the Guitar Arena.

Administration of Rules and Regulations

The West Texas Fair & Rodeo (WTF&R) reserves to its Executive Committee and /or its designated representatives referred to as the "Management" the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with the show, and the right to amend or add to these rules within its sole discretion. An exhibitor who violates any of the following rules may forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Executive Committee may order. Special rules are published in each department or category where necessary. If there is a conflict between the special department rules and these General Livestock Rules & Regulations, the special rules will govern. Each exhibitor is responsible for inquiry about and obtaining a copy of any such special rules where applicable in his/her category of exhibition.

Statement of Liability

RULE 1: All livestock exhibits will be under the control and direction of the Management, but the WTF&R will in no case be

responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Each exhibitor will be solely and individually responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, occasioned by or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him or her and for its description as given in the catalog, and shall indemnify the WTF&R against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as damage or injury to any person or property, caused by the exhibitor, or any of the animals exhibited by him or her or in any way connected with such exhibition.

Eligibility for Entry

RULE 2: Competition is open to the world unless otherwise stated in the special rules governing a particular department.

- **RULE 3:** All animals in the breeding classes must be recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breed. Exhibitors must produce certificates of registry at the request of the Management or Superintendent in charge. No pending registrations will be accepted. Original Registration paperwork must be presented at check in.
- **RULE 4:** All animals entered singular or in groups, must be the legal property of the exhibitor. All entries must be made in the name of the owner/exhibitor. Firms and partnerships entering animals for competition must be in legal existence at the time of making entry, and in all cases must be bona fide. Exhibitors must have owned all animals entered at least 30 days prior to the date of exhibition.
- **RULE 5:** No exhibitor will be allowed to show more than one entry for herds or groups except in Get-of-Sire and Produce-of-Dam classes and then only if entries are by different sire or out of different dams. No open exhibitor will be allowed to show more than two animals in an individual class unless otherwise announced in writing.
- **RULE 6:** Diseased animals are barred entry (at all times) into the WTF&R area or grounds. Superintendents are instructed and authorized to refuse unloading privileges to animals showing any signs of disease.
- **RULE 7:** Barren animals will not be eligible in breeding classes. An affidavit that the animal is a breeder must be furnished upon request.
- **RULE 8:** To be eligible for entry, exhibitors and their livestock must meet and adhere to the requirements of Special Rules listed under the appropriate department(s).
- RULE 9: Any exhibitor found in violation of any of the livestock show rules may be forever barred from showing at the WTF&R or any livestock show held under the auspices of the WTF&R. THE WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CANCEL ANY OPEN OR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW WHERE LESS THAN FIVE (5) EXHIBITORS OR TWENTY-FIVE ANIMALS ARE ENTERED. Entry deadline is <u>August</u> <u>1*</u> without penalty. If sufficient numbers have not been entered by <u>August 5</u>, the exhibitors entered will be notified by phone and ENTRY FEES will be refunded.

Procedures for Entry

RULE 10: Entries must be submitted online at www.wtexasliv.fairwire.com for all entries except Rabbits, Poultry and Llamas. Once online entries are completed and submitted it is important to print the receipt for your records. Payment for entries should be made online with a debit/credit card. However, if you are a County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher and need to submit payment through the US Postal Service, please print the receipt with all exhibitors information and send payment along with the receipt for each exhibitor entered. The Breeding Livestock Entry Worksheet and the Market Animal Entry Worksheet can be found on our website at www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. The individual Entry Receipt may be printed out upon completing the online process. If submitting entries and payment online, no documents need to be mailed in. If submitting paper entries (Rabbit, Poultry, and Llama entries only) please complete entry form pertaining to that division and registration forms with original signature and mail with payment of one check payable to the West Texas Fair & Rodeo. These entry forms may be found on our website www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. Online, mail and all other forms of the submission of livestock entries, either by the exhibitor or by anyone acting for the exhibitor, constitutes an unconditional agreement to abide and be completely bound by these and all rules and regulations issued by the management. For further information, consult www.westtexasfairrodeo.com

- **RULE 11:** In all cases, the Management reserves the right to reject, accept or accept conditionally, an application for entry. No one, except designated officials, will be allowed to see the entry forms until after the awards are made. All entry forms will remain the property of and in the custody of the WTF&R Office.
- **RULE 12:** All entries in group classes must be shown in their respective single classes. Animals to comprise a competitive group need not be named in application for entry, but exhibitors shall indicate in which group class they expect to compete.
- **RULE 13:** Animals entered in the Junior shows may also be shown in the Open shows. An Open show entry must be completed online in addition to the Junior entry and fees for both must be paid by the deadline. Junior exhibitors, also defined as a "youth" entry and someone age 21 or younger at the time of show, must comply with all rules and regulations of the Open shows. Exhibitors will be issued a weeklong pass which covers admission for both Junior and Open shows.
- RULE 14: Erroneous entries may request to be transferred to their proper classes prior to judging. However, the Management will determine each matter upon its merits. Strict adherence is paid to entry deadlines. All entries must be submitted by their respective deadline dates if submitting a Rabbit, Poultry, or Llama entry, which are the only divisions accepted with a paper entry form, the postmark must be dated no later than the official deadline for that division to be accepted. Entries postmarked or hand delivered to the office after the deadline will be required to pay the late fee. A \$100.00 per head late fee will be charged after the deadline unless entering Open Boer Goat, which has a late fee of \$15.00, and Jr and Open Llama, which has a late fee of \$25.00. Absolutely noentries will be accepted after August 5*, unless otherwise stated in Special Division Rules.
- **RULE 15:** To be accepted, the correct ENTRY FEE(s) must accompany applications for entry as stated in the special rules of each division. There is no charge for group classes in Cattle and Sheep departments.
- **RULE 16:** No refunds will be made after entries close. Substitutions may be made within the breed with the Management's approval, however a \$5.00 per head fee may be charged.
- **RULE 17:** Rabbit, Poultry, and Llama entry applications must be made out on forms provided by the WTF&R. These forms are found online at www.westtexasfairrodeo.com and should be mailed to:

RULE 18: Grounds Passes good for the duration of the fair will be issued to the exhibitors based on the schedule listed below. Exhibitors will receive their allocated passes upon entry at Gate 6/H.

A charge of \$10.00 for reissuing a grounds pass will be made if passes are lost. Grounds passes are good at any walk-through gate at the WTF&R. A signature will be required in order to receive passes. Ag Teachers/County Agents may NOT pick up passes for their students/exhibitors. Family members may purchase a general admission pass good for that day only. Additional livestock grounds passes may be purchased for \$15.00 each to be used by family members of the exhibitor(s). Regular gate admission fees are listed below: Adults: \$8 Weekdays

Adults: \$8 Weekdays \$11 Weekends Students K-college: \$4 Under age 5: Free **RULE 19:** Vehicle passes will be required for exhibitors, Ag Teachers and County Extension Agents in order to park in the exhibitors' parking lot. ASTs and CEAs will be issued one vehicle pass that will be good all week. **ONLY VEHICLES HAULING LIVESTOCK WILL BE ISSUED VEHICLE PASSES**. All other vehicles must park in the public parking area which is free of charge. Security will affix the pass to the windshield at the time of entry, and it is non-transferable. The pass must remain affixed to the windshield or the exhibitor will lose parking privileges. You will be required to sign for your passes. No trailers will be parked in the exhibitor's lot. There will be a special parking area for large trucks and trailers.

Judges and Judging Procedures

- **RULE 20:** Policies for selecting judges and determining judging systems rest solely with the Management.
- RULE 21: Judges will be familiar with all rules, regulations, and procedures of the WTF&R.
- **RULE 22:** The decision of the judges will be final in all cases. No appeal will be considered except in the case of one submitted in the form of a written request and payment of protest fee of \$100.00.
- **RULE 23:** If an exhibitor or his representative in any way interferes with the Judges or shows disrespect to any Judge, Show Official, or to the WTF&R, the Management may withhold from such exhibitor any premium monies that may have been awarded or take any other steps deemed appropriate by Management.
- RULE 24: No one will be allowed to act as judge in the show in which he or she exhibits.
- **RULE 25:** All animals properly entered in any show class and passed by the sifting committee appointed by Management as eligible for competition must be brought into the show ring for competition. Each entry will be assigned a number in the official catalog, and exhibitors will receive cards with numbers to correspond with the catalog numbers. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor while the animal is being shown. Exhibitors refusing, for any cause not approved by Management, to lead out entered animals for parade or for competition in the show ring and/or refusing to show their animal at such times and places as may be directed and/or refusing to furnish information concerning their stock as may be requested by the Management, will not only forfeit any prizes previously won, but may be required to remove their stock from the WTF&R grounds immediately.
- **RULE 26:** Judging will not be delayed for animals entering the arena late. Any exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time may be barred from competition in the class. Protests that the judge overlooked exhibits will not be considered.

Eligibility for Exhibition and Competition

- **RULE 27:** Committees to sift livestock may be appointed in such departments as the Management deems advisable. It is the duty of the sifting committee to pass upon the eligibility of animals for show purposes before judging begins. These committees shall be empowered and required to eliminate from the Show any animal which, in their judgment, is not qualified to compete.
- **RULE 28:** The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal or show they deem unsuitable or objectionable, and to return any money already paid for space or stalls. Management will not be required to furnish reasons for such actions; the return of the exhibitor's money exonerates the WTF&R from any claim by the exhibitor.
- **RULE 29:** Exhibitors not cooperating with security personnel or officials of the WTF&R in all matters of policy, including parking, will have their entries cancelled and will be ordered to remove their exhibit from the grounds immediately.
- **RULE 30:** The showing of unethically fitted livestock or livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered is prohibited. Unethical fitting consists of any method altering the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body. Animals showing, in the opinion of the judge, signs of having been operated on or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults in conformation or with intent to deceive, relative to the animal's soundness, will be disqualified.
- **RULE 31:** Any animal that becomes wild or unruly at any time may be eliminated from competition at the discretion of the Management and will be ordered to be removed from the grounds immediately.

Care of Animals, Stalls, and Pens

- **RULE 32:** The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited. Mistreatment of animals by owners or handlers is strictly forbidden. Show management may disqualify exhibitor and appropriate measures may be taken.
- **RULE 33:** All stalls, pens, and exhibition places must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse matter disposed of as directed by the Management. Exhibitors are required to keep their tack area, stalls, aisles, and exhibits in an organized, orderly, and clean condition at all times.
- **RULE 34:** There will be no straw used for bedding cattle or llamas in the exhibition barn. Straw may be used in the tie-out areas. Pine shavings will be provided for cattle stalls. No bedding will be provided for sheep and swine pens. Sheep and swine exhibitors may provide their own bedding or may purchase bedding from the WTF&R livestock office. Straw may be used for breeding sheep.
- **RULE 35:** Livestock exhibitors are permitted to display a sign over their exhibit advertising their own herd. This sign shall be of a reasonable size, in the opinion of Management, so as not to obstruct the view of other exhibitor's signs or exhibits of livestock. The Management reserves the right to have objectionable signs removed.

- RULE 36: Trimming chutes will not be allowed down main aisles. Chutes must be kept in designated areas only. Any Chutes Not In A Designated Area Will Be Moved. This Will Be Enforced.
- **RULE 37:** Floor fans and Port-A-Coolers will <u>NOT</u> be allowed in the First Financial Pavilion, formerly known as the Livestock Barn. Fans must be hung from above. Limit one fan per animal.
- **RULE 38:** The Management reserves the right to reassign any space, stall, or pen not occupied on or before the required arrival time. No exhibitor or concessionaire will be allowed to sublet or sell any space, privilege, stall, pen, or coop without the written permission of the Management.

Composite Rules and Regulations

- **RULE 39:** Dogs will not be allowed in the Show Barn or Buildings, except for dogs accompanying visually or physically impaired individuals which must be kept on a leash at all times.
- **RULE 40:** Nurse cows will not be allowed on the show grounds in accordance to the rules of the I.A.F.E. and the American Breed Association.
- **RULE 41:** Anyone desiring to exhibit cattle not entered in official livestock classes must request and receive special permission from the Management. ALL REGULATION HEALTH RULES WILL APPLY. Exhibit space will be issued only if room permits. No additional animals may be brought on the grounds.
- **RULE 42:** Any animal on exhibition may not be removed from the grounds prior to its release time without a special order given by the Livestock Department. Releases will be given once the accounting has been completed after each show, which normally takes one hour. Steer releases will be given at 1:00 p.m. if exhibitor has finished showing. All livestock must have an approved release form in order to be removed from the grounds. Gate personnel will prohibit removal of any livestock or exhibit without a written release. Any violation of this rule will cause forfeiture of all premiums earned by exhibitor. Vehicle tag numbers will be required for a release.
- **RULE 43:** Any equipment brought in to be used in a stall or other space by an exhibitor must comply with and be used in compliance with all federal, state, and municipal occupational safety and health regulations.
- RULE 44: Exhibitors will not be allowed to bring portable scales into the building.
- RULE 45: No demonstrations, trophies, decorations, portals, fountains, signs, banners, advertising matter or exhibits of any kind will be allowed in the aisles or public passageways or attached to the Show building's walls, posts, or doors.
 - **RULE 46:** All livestock for exhibition are subject and governed by the Rules and Regulations of the Texas Animal Health Commission and the West Texas Fair & Rodeo. Official health certificates covering all entries shall be presented to gate personnel upon arrival. The **only** exceptions to this rule are Open Breeding Sheep, Jr. Steers, and Youth Jackpot Swine.
- **RULE 47:** Premiums will be paid by cash immediately after placings are called for each show. An envelope will be presented to exhibitors containing the cash value of their placing and their placing ribbon.

Protests

- **RULE 48:** Protests must be in writing and be accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly and in writing the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Management immediately after occasion for such protest. No protest will be accepted for consideration if not submitted in writing and within 12 hours of the action upon which the protest is based.
- **RULE 49:** No complaint or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article will be considered by the Management.
- **RULE 50:** The right of an exhibitor to appeal the decision of the judge to the Board will be only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit or when it is charged that the decision of the judge has been influenced or interfered with.
- RULE 51: All questions of dispute shall be referred to the Board of Directors of the WTF&R, whose decision shall be final.

Attention West Texas Fair & Rodeo Livestock Exhibitors

The WTF&R is incredibly fortunate to have generous award, premium, and cash prize sponsors and donors. Individuals, ranches, businesses, and associations selflessly give their resources to the WTF&R Livestock Shows. In order to receive your award, you <u>must</u> write a "Thank You" card to the individual, ranch, business, or association. The WTF&R will provide blank "Thank You" cards and cover the postage expense. At the conclusion of your class, visit the Livestock Office, located in the First Financial Pavilion, and write your "Thank You" card. Envelopes and postage will be handled by the Livestock Secretary. The WTF&R appreciates your understanding and shares your gratitude for the individuals, ranches, businesses, and associations that are dedicated to the growth of our industry.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW *All General Rules and Regulations will apply to JUNIOR shows*

RULE 1: All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the General Livestock Rules published in this premium list and to these Special Rules. In the event of any conflict between these Special Rules and the General Rules, the provisions of these Special Rules shall prevail.

RULE 2: Participation in the junior livestock division is limited to members of a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter within the state of their residence and who have continuously, personally fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of an approved sponsor, County Extension Agent (CEA) or Agriculture Science Teacher (AST). To be eligible, boys or girls must be in the third grade or nine years old but not more than 19 years old on January 1, of the year of the WTF&R entered. Exception is Junior Beefmaster and Junior Brangus, where exhibitors may be age 21 or under.

RULE 3: Application for Entry

All entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be made by the CEA or AST under whose supervision the animals were fed. The CEA or AST must certify on the entry form that the animal and the owner(s) are eligible under the rules of this show. It is the responsibility of the CEA or AST to read all rules and check each entry form carefully before signing it. If entries are not correctly submitted they will be returned. Entries must be submitted online by the CEA or AST at www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. Once online entries are completed and submitted it is important to print off the receipt and a summary sheet of all exhibitors entered. CEA's and AST's must submit an Exhibitor Summary Form or Individual Entry Receipt with original signatures from the exhibitor, the exhibitor's parent and/or guardian, and the CEA or AST overseeing the project. The Exhibitor Summary Form can be found on our website at www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. The individual Entry Receipt may be printed out upon completing the online process along with the Summary Sheet at www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. All entries submitted must have original signatures-photocopied or faxed signatures will NOT be accepted. Copying the entries before submitting them for personal records will be allowed. All entries must be made together and paid by one check payable to the West Texas Fair & Rodeo, and sent in by the county agent or vocational agriculture teacher with the entry forms. Entries submitted by individual club members will not be accepted. Payment must be in the form of a school check, 4-H club check or money order. Personal checks will not be accepted for any entries.

RULE 4: Junior exhibitors may enter no more than two entries per class in the junior beef heifers and three head per class in breeding sheep. Junior exhibitors may only enter two steers in the steer show.

RULE 5: Exhibitors must own their animals at the beginning of and throughout the feeding period and must feed, care for and exhibit animals entered without any aid or assistance during the entire feeding period except from CEA, AST, other junior exhibitors, or approved sponsors within their state. The feeding and fitting period shall begin no later than July 1 for steers, Junior beef heifers, and not later than August 1 for breeding sheep. Animals entered must be registered in the records of their respective breed associations in the name of the exhibitor on or before the date of possession required. Date of sale between breeder and exhibitor is not acceptable. Original registration paperwork must be presented at check in.

RULE 6: An entry in the Junior Livestock Show must be exhibited by the owner, except when an exhibitor/owner has more than one entry in one class or cannot be present to show his or her own animal due to illness, etc. In these cases, a substitute approved by show management may show for the exhibitor.

RULE 7: Junior exhibitors may enter the Open Show classes. Open show entry forms must be filled out and the appropriate entry fees paid in addition to the Junior entries by the entry deadline.

RULE 8: All eligible shows have been sanctioned by Beyond the Ring Junior Livestock Association.



RULE 9: All entries will be stalled by the FFA Chapter or County 4-H Club unless one of the following applies:

a. For steers only: All stalling requests must be submitted in writing on school or extension letterhead, and signed by the AST or CEA, in order to be considered. These requests are for what group you would like to be stalled with; not the location within the barn.

b. Jr. Heifer Cattle: Please state your preference to stall your cattle together as a chapter or to be stalled separately by breed. This preference must be submitted in writing on school or extension letterhead, and signed by the AST or CEA, in order to be considered. If a written request is not received by the WTF&R, stall assignments will be by breed. These requests are for what group you would like to be stalled with; not the location within the barn.

c. After the animals have been stalled, they shall not be moved to any other part of the barn except on the consent of either the livestock show management or the superintendent of the department. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to keep pens or stalls clean and in a presentable condition at all times. Feed and water buckets are not to be left unattended and must be

removed immediately following feeding or watering. Failure to comply with this rule can result in forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or removal of animal from show.

RULE 10: Passes will be issued according to the schedule as listed in the General Livestock Rules and Regulations. Junior exhibitors will be issued one (1) Youth Exhibitor Pass. If exhibitor is entitled to more than one pass according to the schedule, then the additional passes will be Adult Exhibitor Pass, which is good for adults and youths. CEAs and ASTs will NOT be allowed to pick up passes for their junior exhibitors. All CEAs and ASTs directly responsible for junior exhibitors and attending the WTF&R will receive a Livestock pass and a vehicle pass. Other vehicle passes will be issued at time of arrival at each livestock entry gate ONLY TO VEHICLES HAULING LIVESTOCK. Security will affix the vehicle pass to the windshield. The pass must remain affixed to the windshield or the exhibitor will lose their parking privileges. All other vehicles must park in the public parking area. Livestock Passes are good at any walk-through gate.

Arrival of Steers Will Be Enforced. All Steers Will Be Stalled According To Stall Chart. Only One (1) Fan Per Animal Allowed. No Floor Fans or Port-A-Cools Will Be Allowed. GENERATORS ALLOWED, OUTSIDE THE BUILDING, except in areas designated as "NO GENERATORS".



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HERDSMAN AWARDS

The West Texas Fair & Rodeo will award special prizes in the Open Cattle Departments and the Junior Beefmaster show to the herdsmen or exhibitors in charge of livestock exhibits. First Place winners will receive \$25.00.

A committee will make inspections to determine the winner. The following points will be considered:

- 1. Orderliness and cleanliness of quarters, stalls and animals.
- 2. Promptness in having stalls or pens cleaned by 8 AM each day.
- 3. Systematic and neat arrangement of traps, feed and forage, and keeping same out of alleys.
- 4. Promptness in removing blankets or covers from livestock by 8:00 a.m. each day and leaving them off until 8:00 p.m.
- 5. Personal appearance of herdsmen and helpers.
- 6. Observation of all rules and regulations.
- 7. Cooperating with show officials in promoting the livestock show in general.
- 8. Cooperating with other exhibitors and exhibiting an attitude of good sportsmanship in general. AN AWARD WILL BE GIVEN TO EACH WINNER.

ANIMAL HEALTH SUMMARY OF REQUIREMENTS

TEXAS ANIMAL HEALTH COMMISSION

The following summary is a condensed version of the Texas Animal Health Commission regulations. The regulations will supersede this summary if there is a dispute between the two. For more information contact the Texas Animal Health Commission by calling (512)719-0777 (24 hours) or 1(800)550-8242, or by writing the TAHC, P.O. Box 12966, Austin, TX 78711-2966.

The West Texas Fair & Rodeo is an open, interstate show, accepting entries of livestock from within Texas, other states, and other countries. The Swine Show and Poultry Show are restricted to in state entries only.

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection

The certificate must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations or treatments required by the Commission were completed. For certain diseases, a specific statement may be required indicating disease free status. The certificate is required to accompany animals and fowl entering the State of Texas and Fair Park as stated in the following summary of entry requirements.

THE CERTIFICATE IS VALID FOR 45 DAYS FOR EQUINE AND 30 DAYS FOR ALL OTHER SPECIES.

Prior Entry Permit Entry permits are required as noted in the following summary of entry requirements. Permits may be obtained by calling (512)719-0777 (24 hours) or 1(800)550-8242, or by writing TAHC, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, TX 78711-2966. The permit for entry is not required when livestock and ratites enter for the exhibition and return to the state of origin. All poultry entering Texas must be permitted.

CATTLE (beef & dairy) Texas Origin Breeding Cattle (not including Steers)

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.

2. All dairy cattle must be identified with official ID and recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Out-of-State Origin Cattle

1. Must meet the same requirements as Texas Origin Breeding Cattle.

2. **Negative tuberculosis (TB) test** within 60 days for all sexually intact dairy cattle that are 2 months of age or older or originate from an accredited tuberculosis free herd. In addition, all sexually intact dairy cattle originating from a state or area with anything less than a tuberculosis free state status shall be tested negative for tuberculosis in accordance with the appropriate requirements for states or areas for that status, prior to entry with results of the test recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection. Beef cattle from Accredited Free States or Zones do not require tuberculosis (TB) testing. Cattle from a tuberculosis free herd with a certificate of veterinary inspection stating the accreditation number and herd anniversary test date or suckling calves from a negative dam to not require testing.

3. **Negative brucellosis test** is required within 30 days prior to entry or be from a class free state, area or certified free herd. Brucellosis vaccination is required for female cattle between 4 to 12 months of age or be from a class free state, area or certified free herd.

4. All bulls entering Texas for the purpose of participating at fairs, shows, exhibitions and/or rodeos, which are (12) months of age or older and capable of breeding may enter the state without testing or certification for trichomoniasis, but shall obtain a permit prior to entry into the state. Bulls permitted for entry into the State of Texas under the provisions of this subsection shall not be commingled with female cattle or used for breeding. Bulls that stay in the state more than sixty (60) days must be tested negative for trichomoniasis with an official culture test or official Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test.

5. **The Permit for Entry** is not required when cattle enter for exhibition and return to the state of origin, except for exhibition bulls that do not meet TAHC's Trich entry requirements.

STEERS

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.

EQUINE

Texas Origin Equine

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, issued within 45 (forty-five) days or a current, valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card, issued within 6 (six) months.

2. Negative equine infectious anemia (EIA) test (also known as "Coggins Test") within 12 (twelve) months. In state origin equine: foals, under eight months of age, nursing a negative dam are exempt from testing. Test document must be in hand or test results and related information must be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Out of State Origin Equine

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, issued within 30 (thirty) days or a current, valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card, issued within 6 (six) months.

2. Negative equine infectious anemia (EIA) test (also known as "Coggins Test") within 12 (twelve) months. Test document must be in hand or test results and related information must be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

GOATS

Texas Origin Goats & Out of State Origin Goats

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, within 30 (thirty) days.

2. Texas - All sexually intact exhibition goats must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry, except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers.

3. Out of State – All exhibition goats must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry, except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers.

LLAMAS

Refer to Exotic Livestock and Ratites (Camelidae)

POULTRY

Texas Origin Poultry

1. **Negative pullorum-typhoid test** within 30 (thirty) days or from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP).

2. Poultry must originate from areas where reportable avian diseases are not known to have been active within the last 30 (thirty) days.

Out of State Origin Poultry

1. NO OUT OF STATE POULTRY ENTRIES PERMITTED.

SHEEP

Texas Origin Sheep

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 (thirty) days.

2. All sexually intact exhibition sheep must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry.

Out of State Origin Sheep

1. Must meet the same requirements as for Texas Origin Sheep.

2. All exhibition sheep must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry.

3. **Negative ELISA brucella ovis test** within 30 (thirty) days for all breeding rams 6 months of age or older. Each ram shall be individually identified with an individual ear tag or registration tattoo. This number, along with the test results and name of the approved laboratory and date of test, shall be entered on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

SWINE

Texas Origin Swine

1. Only Texas hogs will be admitted to the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Swine Show. Since only Texas hogs will be shown, a health certificate is not required.

EXOTIC LIVESTOCK AND RATITES

Exotic Livestock are defined as grass-eating or plant-eating, single hooved or cloven-hooved mammals that are not indigenous to this state and are known as ungulates, including animals from the swine, horse, tapir, camel, llama,

rhinoceros, elephant, deer, and antelope families. **Camelidae** are defined as members of the family of animals which include camel, llamas, and vicunas. The domestic members of the genus lama include the llama, alpaca, and guanaco.

Texas Origin Camelidae

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS:** All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Rules, and the Special Rules of this department.
- 2. **HEALTH PAPERS:** A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (issued within the last 30 days) is required and must be presented upon arrival to the gate to be allowed on grounds.
- 3. **REGISTRATION:** Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Any animal, upon Check-In, that does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo, freeze brand, hot brand) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed/branded and rechecked at the show.
- 4. **EXHIBITORS:** Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- 5. COW/CALF PAIRS: (any female shown with a calf at side) The calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.
- 6. UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS: Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or the use of ANY false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally; steroids, growth stimulants, or artificially filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.
- 7. **FITTING:** This is a Blow-and-Go show.
- 8. CLASSES: Separate classes for bred-and-owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

ANGUS ASSOCIATION

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Blvd., St. Joseph, Missouri 64506, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown the previous year. A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the Junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show. To be eligible for Association premiums the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the Junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class. Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating direction with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org. Effective July 1, 2007, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, and individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS:** All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Rules, and the Special Rules of this department. JBBA Rules will be recognized over WTF&R Rules!
- 2. **HEALTH PAPERS:** Official Interstate Health Certificates must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time cattle arrive on the show premises. Each heifer must be tested for TB and Bands in accordance with state and federal regulations. Such tests must be made by a federally-accredited laboratory.
- 3. **EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY:** Open ONLY to members of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association (JBBA). Exhibitors must be aged 21 and under.
- 4. AGE ELIGIBILTIY: Exhibitors must be a minimum of six (6) years old on January 1 of the year of the show.
- 5. **HEIFER ELIGIBILITY:** Heifers tow (2) years and older on the day shown whose calf has died cannot be shown.
- 6. **OWNERSHIP**: Each exhibitor should have continually and personally fed and cared for their heifer(s) under the direct supervision of a CEA, AST, and/or his/her parents. All heifers must have been owned by the entrant a minimum of 60 days prior to the show. Evidence of ownership is indicated by the date of sale on the registration papers.
- 7. **EXHIBITION:** Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless he/she has two entries in the same class, whereupon another bonafide JBBA member may show one of the entries. In a pairs class, the cow must be exhibited by the owner. Entries may be done by the exhibitor.
- 8. **EXHIBITOR SUBSTITUTION:** Any JBBA exhibitor who is a qualified entrant to show and cannot (due to illness or injury while attending the show) may have their entry shown by another bonafide JBBA exhibitor.
- 9. ANIMAL SUBSTITUTION: Substitutions will be allowed up to Check-In time. There will be a substitution fee of \$5 per animal.
- 10. ENTRY LIMITATION: There is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- 11. **REGISTRATION:** Original BBU Certificate of Breeding (NOT copies) on each animal shown, including any calf-at-side, must be presented to a representative of the show at the time cattle arrive. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves under 30 days of age must be represented. Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at Check-In.
- 12. **PEDIGREE:** All heifers must be registered Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred Dam, second cross dam, or otherwise stated in the BBU by-laws. All heifers shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and brands on the animal match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- 13. **IDENTIFICATION**: All heifers shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and brands or tattoos on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- 14. **JOINT OWNERSHIP:** Joint ownership, when both owners are JBBA members, will be accepted. However, animals must be entered and exhibited in the name of one of the owners. Joint ownership, consisting of parent-youth, combination of adult and youth, will not be eligible. The major shows may require single ownership.
- 15. **DATE OF BIRTH:** Heifers that do not show the day of the month of birth on the BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.

16. CLASSES: A class may be split at the discretion of the show official/coordinator. Every effort will be made to split the class on a monthly basis.

17. **FITTING:** Animals shall be shown with their hair coats laying downward in a natural state that is flat to the entire body, which includes the legs as well as the tail. Furthermore, no animals shall be shown that has any foreign object(s) glued to or otherwise attached or its natural hair color altered in a manner so as to change its conformation or appearance.

18. PREG-CHECK: All heifers two (2) years old and older on the day shown must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the heifer may show open. Heifers that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificates of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.

19. SHOW DISMISSAL: Any heifer that, in the opinion of the designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be heifers exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic or physical defects.

Any uncontrollable heifer will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge.

20. REMOVAL FROM GROUNDS: Failure to comply with these rules or to cooperate with the show and breed officials shall be grounds for removal.

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS:** All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Rules, and the Special Rules of this department.
- 2. **HEALTH PAPERS:** A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (within the last 30 days) must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time cattle arrive on the show premises.
- 3. **ELIGIBILITY:** Open ONLY to members of the International Junior Brangus Breeders Association (IJBBA) or the Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association (TJBBA). Exhibitors must have reached their 7th birthday, prior to January 1 of the calendar year of the show, and have NOT reached their 22nd birthday, prior to January 1 of the calendar year of the show.
- 4. ENTRY LIMITATION: There is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- 5. REGISTRATION: Animals must be registered with the International Brangus Breeders Association to be eligible to compete in this show. The original registration certificate for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging. The animal MUST be purebred Brangus.
- ENTRIES: The registration number, permanent animal identification number (brand or tattoo), birthdate, and sire of each animal entered in an individual class must be listed on the entry form.
- 7. **RELEASES:** No animal will be allowed to leave the grounds without a proper release.
- 8. **GROOMING:** Prior to Check-In, head of breeding animals must be clipped of all hair (including top knots) and be free of scurs and/or slick spots. This is a Blow-and-Go show.
- 9. DISQUALIFICATION: Any animal found to have scurs, slick spots, or evidence of incisions (surgical or otherwise) in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel, or dewlap will be disqualified. Any animal, upon Check-In, which does not have a legible tattoo or brand corresponding to it's registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo or brand, animals cannot be re-tattooed and re-checked at the show.
- 10. **PERCENTAGE DISPUTE:** Any Brangus animal recorded in the IBBA registry that has a "Parentage Dispute" listed in its first 3 generation pedigree is ineligible for participation in Brangus shows and exhibitions. If the dispute is resolved, the listing will be removed from the pedigree and show eligibility restored.
- 11. **UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS:** In IBBA-approved shows, no animal may be show that has been artificially filled with any amount of liquid at anytime once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The fitter or ranch entity involved with an animal being artificially filled will be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids orally if needed without disqualifying animals from exhibition. No animal may be shown that has had any foreign objects glued or otherwise attached in a manner so as to alter its conformation or change its appearance. Tail ties and hair nets used pm the tail and switch are the only exception.
- 12. **COMPLIANCE:** All IBBA and IJBBA members will abide by the show rules as adopted. In addition, any show, fair, event, or display in which Brangus cattle participate should follow these rules as adopted by the IBBA. All Brangus entries are subject to the provision of a rule of the IBBA titled "Inspection of Exhibits." Entries that have not complied with all of the above rules will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies, or year-end points in the IBBA's Show Sire of the Year, Show Bull of the Year, and Show Heifer of the Year awards.

IBBA INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

1. CLASSIFICATION & PEDIGREE: The IBBA and its representatives have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited Brangus animals. Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all show rules as adopted by IBBA.

2. **COMPLIANCE:** Each exhibitor shall submit his or her registered Brangus cattle to such tests and examinations as requested and/or required by the IBBA, its authorized representatives, or those of the relevant show.

3. **CONSIDERATION:** For, and in consideration of, the opportunity to participate in any Brangus function, each exhibitor hereby releases the IBBA, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits, and judgments past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decisions there from.

4.**DENTAL INSPECTION:** All entries may be classified for judging on an age basis and should be entered in class according to age. Teeth may be inspected by a veterinarian designated by IBBA in order to determine whether dental development is within allowable limits for the class entered. If the veterinarian determines that, in his or her opinion, dental development exceeds maximum allowable limits, the animal shall be moved to an older class as determined by the

veterinarian and shall remain in that class until determined otherwise by subsequent mouthing or favorable appeal to the IBBA Executive Committee. If it is not possible to move an animal, the animal may not be exhibited in such show. 5. **DISPUTES:** Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any such test, exam or show rule enforcement as applied to his or her animal shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the Rules of the IBBA. 6.**APPEALS:** An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or IBBA-designated association representatives under sections 1 and 4 of the "Inspection of Exhibits" may be made to the Executive Committee of the IBBA if the following requirements are satisfied: 1) The appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party, and 2) the appealing party files the written appeal with the IBBA Executive Committee as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated association representative Sociation representative shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party, and the veterinarian or designated association representative whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that are relevant to the matter, following which the Executive Committee shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.

SPECIAL RULES

1. **ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY:** A) To be eligible to exhibit, the youth must be at least 3 years of age and no older than 20 years of age. B) If less than 25 animals are entered in the Pre-Junior and Junior divisions individually, these two shows will combine. All classes will still be held. C) Steers and heifers must be registered with the AHA and meet height restrictions in order to participate. C1) Maximum height to be shown in these classes is 45"(inches) on mature females and 48" (inches) on mature bulls and steers. Those exceeding height restrictions will be disqualified.

2. **RULES AND REGULATIONS:** General Rules and Regulations of individual shows apply to this division as well as those listed.

3. **OWNERSHIP:** A) Ownership of prospect steers must be established by July 1, 2023. B) Ownership of market steers must be established by May 1, 2023. C) Ownership of heifers must be established by July 1, 2023. D) Animals MUST be in the name of the exhibitor

4. **POSESSION, CARE & FEEDING:** A) Animals entered must be in the possession of the exhibitor no later than the above dates. The exhibitor is responsible for the general custody, care, and feeding of their animals when possible, or to help when it is not possible to care of the animal unassisted. Family members and fellow participants may help with these tasks. B) All animals in this division MUST be completely broke to lead for the safety of the exhibitor and others in the show ring. Animals not deemed fit will be removed from the show ring and disqualified from the competition.

5. **FITTING OF ANIMALS:** A) All animals will be fitted and presented in a proper condition for a beef show. Exhibitors are encouraged to help in any way that is safe and possible for them to do, but no endanger themselves, their animals, or others in the process. B) Alteration of conformation and structure by prohibited substance or unethical fitting is prohibited. Any violation of this rule will result in immediate disqualification without recourse. C) The injection, use, or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State, or Local law or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State, or Local law will result in immediate disqualification without recourse. D) Any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injection or ingested material no conductive to the continued health or marketability of beef carcasses or for deception will result in immediate disqualification without recourse. E) Every participant, in consideration of their entry being accepted by the show, specifically represents that no animal entered is misrepresented in any way except trimming of feet and blocking of hair. F) This is a non-fit, Blow-and-Go show only. The use of paint, glue, or other adhesives is prohibited.

6. **OFFICIAL WEIGHT & HEIGHT**: The weight and height recorded at time of check in will be the official weight and height of the animal.

7. **CHECK WEIGHT & HEIGHT**: Show management reserves the right at its discretion to check the weight and height of any animal.

- 8. **SHOWING OF ANIMALS:** A) Pre-Junior participants, ages 3-8, may have help in the ring. B) All participants may have parental, sibling, or other participant accompaniment in the show ring. C) All participants are to handle the majority of the showing and the use of a show stick. Assistants may help in the control of the animal only and will not assist with setting up the animal.
- 9. **SHOW HARNESS**: All exhibitors are required to wear a show number harness for each animal shown in a class. These harnesses hold the number in plain sight.
- 10. **SHOWMANSHIP**: A) Any exhibitor who shows unassisted may compete in this class. B) Animals must be owned and entered by the participant to show in this class.
- 11. **SAFETY:** A) The purpose for these divisions is to offer the opportunity to young cattlemen and women to participate in cow shows despite their lack of age required to show in Junior/Youth shows. In many cases, these young people have spent hours at the barn with their parents and siblings working "show calves". To go to a show and not be allowed to participate can be boring and tiresome for those with less than developed attention spans. Although the rules and regulations have been set, Safety is the most important factor in this event. We want these young agriculturalists to enjoy their showing days, from the beginning on up, so please, make sure the children and animals are prepared to participate. Animals can be unpredictable, but the more time the exhibitor spends with the animal prior to the show, the better you can expect it to cooperate when the surroundings change.
- 12. **ANIMAL HEALTH:** Animals entered must be within the guidelines of the Livestock Health Requirements. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days is required and must be presented upon arrival, at Gate 6/H, to be allowed onto the grounds. Brand inspections are required from areas within Brand Inspection Areas. Please carefully check the guidelines for each show, as they are similar but somewhat different.

5. ANIMAL ELIGILITY: The skin color of all animals must be BLACK, except those animals having birth marks or white hairs on black skin. All animals must be polled (free of horns or scars).

6. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION: All animals must have a legible ear tattoo for identification. The tattoo must correspond w/tattoo # on the official certificate. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

7. UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS: Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

8. EXHIBITORS: Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

9. DNA PARENTAGE VERIFICATION: Each animal may be subjected to a DNA test to verify ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE as covered under Assoc. Rules Part 3, Sec. XI, Rule 2(a).

10. CHAMPION PREMIUMS: The Fair Association/ Am. Angus Assoc. does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in Championship Classes.

11. COMBINING CLASSES: If less than 50 head are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of Show Officials.

5. **RING ASSISTANCE:** Only one (1) person per animal is permitted in the show arena during the exhibition of individual classes, with exceptions made by one of the following: a.) A physical or mental disability that prevents the proper handling of the animal without assistance or, b.) a handler has a physical injury (sprained ankle, broken arm, etc.) that requires assistance. Any request for an assistant shall be presented to an attending BPG Director or Officer before the beginning of the show for a ruling. In the event that an assistant is required and approved, the assistant shall provide the least amount of interference as possible for the handler to properly display the animal and shall not interfere with any other entrant or otherwise block the path or view of the Judge.

6. **REGISTRATION:** All cattle must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United.

7. **ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION:** All animal tattoos may be checked for legibility and must match the registration papers for that animal. Animals with illegible tattoos or incorrect papers will not be allowed to show.

8. ANIMAL ELIGIBILTY: Heifers exhibited at 24 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy or be nursing their natural calf-at side (under 6months of age).

9. SHOW EQUIPMENT: All bulls 12 months and older must be led with a nose lead at all times.

10. GROUP CLASSES: Animals entered in group classes, must have been shown in an individual class.

11. **FITTING:** All animals must be shown with their hair coats lying flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible. Those few areas such as the legs, tailhead and portions of the topline of the animal which may not naturally lay flat against the body must be trimmed to be flush with adjacent portions of the hair coat. Hair may not be trained or pulled upwards or forwards. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: All entires will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the Special Rules of this -----department

2. **HEALTH PAPERS:** A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, within 30 (thirty) days, must be presented upon arrival at the gate to be allowed on the grounds.

3. **CHECK IN:** All exhibitors must bring registration papers and check in with the show superintendent by 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 9, otherwise goats will not be included on class sheets and will not be allowed to show. If an emergency or uncontrollable circumstance occurs and you are unable to be checked in by 4:00 p.m. please contact the livestock office at 325-795-6704 at your earliest convenience to notify them of your expected arrival time.

4. ENTRY LIMITATION: The Open Boer Goat Show is open to all exhibitors. There is no limit to the number of animals that can be entered in a class by an exhibitor.

5. **REGISTRATION:** All goats over 6 months of age, must be registered in the Herdbook of a recognized association. The recognized association is ABGA only. Original registration papers are required and will be subject to inspection by the Superintendent. A stamped copy or faxed duplicate application is required on all animals under three months of age. 6. **OWNERSHIP:** Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration document or agent for the owner.

7. ANIMAL IDENTIFCATION: All goats must have legible tattoo(s) or other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. The top 6 in the class plus Champion and Reserve tattoos must be read as placings are recorded. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.

8. **ANIMAL AGE:** Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate will be used to determine the class divisions. The show date will be the base date in computing all ages.

9. **BLOOD PERCENTAGE:** All animals must be registered purebred, fullblood, or percentage blood Boer goats. Percentage doe classes are for goats 50% to 87.5% Boer; Fullblood classes are for does that are 15/16 blood (93.7%) and higher, and 31/32 blood (96.8%) and higher for bucks. Progeny of fresh does will NOT be allowed in the ring. At the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, goats may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging. The Champion and Reserve classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show.

10. **UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS:** Any goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from the show in any of the breeding classes. Artificial coloring will be a disqualification. Illegible tattoos or tattoos inconsistent with registration papers will result in disqualification.

11. HORNS: Animals with natural horns or disbudded or dehorned may be shown.

12. **RELEASES:** Animals must have a release form issued by the Superintendent to leave the grounds. Release forms must be signed by the exhibitor and superintendent.

13. ENTRIES: Entries close August 1; late entries will be accepted until August 5 with an additional \$100 per head fee. No entries will be allowed after August 5. Incomplete entries will not be accepted.

- 2. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current (within 30 days) is required and must be presented at the gate upon arrival to be allowed on grounds.
- 3. Entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the AHA Board of Directors and are subject to supervision of the show.
- 4. Maximum height to be shown in these classes is 45" (inches) on mature females and 48" (inches) on mature bulls and steers. Those exceeding height requirement will be disqualified.
- 5. All horned and polled Miniature Hereford cattle will show together.
- 6. Any animal without legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
- 7. Cow/Calf classes: Any cow, regardless of age, with a calf at side must show in the Cow/Calf classes. Calves must not exceed 270 days of age at the day of judging and must be nursing. Cow/Calf classes do not compete for Grand Champion Heifer.
- 8. Any person to be found misrepresenting their entries or not abiding by show rules may be disqualified from the show and not permitted to show.
- 9. All animals must be entered in the Open Show with the name that appears on the AHA Registration paper. If you are a Pre-Junior or Junior exhibitor, you may also enter the same animal in the Open Show.

SPECIAL MEET

OFFICIAL ABA SHOW RULES

Any poultry association, club, or society that is an associate member of the American Bantam Association may host a show and offer the special prizes furnished by the association if it holds its show in accordance with the Rules of the American Bantam Association subject to the

following provisions:

I. JUDGING REQUIREMENTS:

All ABA meets must follow rules as outlined in Article 16 of ABA Constitution and By-Laws.

A. State, Provincial and Special meets:

All judges who judge bantams must be ABA members, and at least one third must be licensed ABA judges with a minimum of one.

B. District Meets

All judges who judge bantams must be ABA members with at least half of them licensed ABA judges.

C. Semi-Annual and Annual Meets:

All judges who judge bantam chicken classes shall have a Bantam Chicken Specialty license or a General license. All Judges who judge the bantam Champions shall have a current ABA General license. All judges must be ABA members in good standing. No Judge shall exhibit and judge birds in the same bantam classification.

II. EXHIBIT REQUIREMENTS:

A. Only breeds and varieties admitted to the ABA Bantam Standard may compete for Association special prizes and awards.

B. Only members of the ABA in good standing are eligible to receive the special prizes and awards of the association.

III. SHOW ROOM RECOMMENDATIONS

A. Sanitation;

1. Show coops and cups must be made of such material that they can be kept sanitary.

2. Litter shall be of adequate quality and quantity.

3. Ventilation shall be appropriate for the season and free of drafts.

4. Participation in a swap section associated with a show should be limited to exhibitors at the show.

5. Swap participants should be limited to a certain number of birds per cage/coop to insure overcrowding is not a problem.6. An officer of the show or designee should inspect the swap/sale section to insure that obviously disease birds or animals are removed immediately.

B. Water and feed: Exhibitor's and show management must insure adequate care, feed and water are provided all birds on the premises. Show Management is encouraged to additionally have all water cups filled before the show hall is open.

C. Caging: Shall be adequate size for the type, size, and sex of the bird being shown.

D. **Display areas:** Shall be adequately illuminated for viewing or judging.

IV. SUGGESTION TO SHOW MANAGEMENT:

A. The show management shall guard against contagious poultry diseases and shall immediately remove any bird showing symptoms of disease.

B. Aisle ways shall be of adequate width for comfortable viewing and judging. Cages shall be no higher than double decked.

C. During judging the Aisle ways should be blocked from spectator movement.

D. The show secretary shall complete the ABA show report form and forward it to the ABA within 90 days after the show.E. Management shall determine the currency of membership and licensing of the judges. If in doubt they shall check with the ABA secretary.

F. Special awards, as offered by the ABA shall be listed in the premium book.

G. The ABA Bantam Standard shall be used in judging bantams

V. SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS FOR ABA MEMBERS ONLY:

A. Master Exhibitor Program: When a member, over any period of years, accumulates twenty starred wins (defined as best or reserve in a class of 100 or more birds), he or she becomes an ABA Master Exhibitor.

B. Master Breeder Program: When a member, over any period of years (but not less than 5), accumulates 20 starred wins in one variety, he or she becomes an ABA Master Breeder.

C. Citation of Merit Program: When a member, over any period of years, accumulates 5 starred wins in one variety, he or she is awarded a Citation of Merit.

VI. STATE AND FEDERAL REGULATIONS

Some State and Federal laws regulate the possession and propagation of two breeds of bantam ducks. The ABA recommends that both individual members and the management of shows hosting ABA meets ensure that they comply with any federal or state regulations which apply to any type of bantam duck.

VII. PROTEST OF AWARDS:

Protests may be entertained in case of apparent dishonesty on the part of a judge, or apparent carelessness that has resulted in the placing of a disqualified specimen. The protest must be in writing and presented to the local show chairman as soon as possible and before the awards are handed out, accompanied by a twenty five dollar deposit. The local show committee, consisting of three persons from the local association including the show chairman, working closely with the ABA judge or judges at the show, shall make a decision which shall be final. If the protest is sustained, the deposit shall be returned to the protester, otherwise, it becomes the property of the local association.

VIII. NON RECOGNIZED BREEDS OR VARIETIES: Breeds or Varieties not recognized by the ABA. Non recognized varieties may place no higher than BV or RV. Non recognized breeds may place no higher than BB or RB.

IX. POSTING OF SHOW RULES: This copy of show rules must be posted in show hall.

3. ELIGIBILITY: Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA, FCCLA and 4-H members. Contestants from any state other than Texas are not allowed entry. Any contestant violating any rule will be disqualified from the contest. Teams must consist of members from the same county or chapter. One (1) to four (4) members may constitute a team. The three (3) high scores will determine the teams' score. All team members are eligible for individual awards. Contestants will be given time to study their notes in between the class and question period, however, no notes will be allowed while answering questions.

7. SCORING: All contestants must provide their own red Universal A scan sheet, #2 pencil and may bring an unmarked clipboard, steno pad, or manila folder for use during the contest. Forms that are bent or abused will not be scored.

8. TIES: Ties will be broken using species question scores, overall question scores and overall score when breaking ties within species. Ties within questions will be broken by overall score and ties within overall score will be broken by overall questions. Scores tied after application of these tie breakers will be broken by a method determined by contest officials. No duplicate awards will be given.

9. **RESULTS:** The contest results, as announced, will be final.

10. AWARDS: Awards not picked up during presentation will be available in the Livestock Office located in First Financial Pavilion through September 16th, 2023. NO awards will be mailed.
