Upload Health Papers prior to arrival!

Upload your Health Papers prior to your arrival to ease the congestion at the gate, streamline your arrival, and unloading process! Upload your valid health papers via the entry portal starting **FRIDAY, AUGUST 14, 2026!**

REMINDERS

- **Grounds Passes are NOT required for Weekend 1 exhibitors.** Grounds Passes will be mailed to the address on file for each exhibitor who is entered in any show for Weekend 2 & 3. Verify that your mailing address is correct when completing entries. Parking Passes will be placed ONLY on vehicles hauling livestock and will be affixed to the windshield upon arrival. **Parking Passes are NOT for sale.** Exhibitors and their families may park at Shotwell Stadium (FREE lot!).
- A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required for all animals entering the grounds **EXCEPT: Junior Market Steers, Open Breeding Sheep, and Youth Swine.** CVIs will be checked upon arrival for Weekend 1 & 2 exhibitors. All poultry are required to have a current Pullorum-Typhoid test and the only accepted birds will be TEXAS poultry.
- Scan a QR code upon arrival to the barn and complete a release form. QR codes will be posted throughout the barns and stall areas. Releases will be given one hour after the completion of the show unless stated otherwise. A release is REQUIRED to pick up your trailer and leave the grounds.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Livestock Secretary's Office is located in the Northwest corner of the First Financial Pavilion. Stalling and releases will be handled from this office. Shavings and Straw will be sold through the main office, please call (325) 795-6707.

Administration of Rules and Regulations

The West Texas Fair & Rodeo (WTF&R) reserves to its Executive Committee and/or its designated representatives referred to as "Management" has the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with the show, and the right to amend or add to these rules within its sole discretion. An exhibitor who violates any of the following rules may forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Executive Committee may order. Special rules are published in each department or category where necessary. If there is a conflict between the special department rules and these General Livestock Rules & Regulations, the special rules will govern. Each exhibitor is responsible for inquiry about and obtaining a copy of any such special rules applicable in his/her category of exhibition.

Statement of Liability

RULE 1: All livestock exhibits will be under the control and direction of Management, but the WTF&R will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Each exhibitor will be solely and individually responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, occasioned by or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him or her and for its description as given in the catalog, and shall indemnify the WTF&R against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as damage or injury to any person or property, caused by the exhibitor, or any of the animals exhibited by him or her or in any way connected with such exhibition.

Eligibility for Entry

RULE 2: Competition is open to the world unless otherwise stated in the special rules governing a particular department.

RULE 3: All animals in the breeding classes must be recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breed. Exhibitors must produce certificates of registry at the request of Management or Superintendent in charge. No pending registrations will be accepted. Original Registration paperwork must be presented at check in.

RULE 4: All animals entered singular or in groups, must be the legal property of the exhibitor. All entries must be made in the name of the owner/exhibitor. Firms and partnerships entering animals for competition must be in legal existence at the time of making entry, and in all cases must be bona fide. Exhibitors must have owned all animals entered at least 30 days prior to the date of exhibition.

RULE 5: No exhibitor will be allowed to show more than one entry for herds or groups except in Get-of-Sire and Produce-of- Dam classes and then only if entries are by different sire or out of different dams. No open exhibitor will be allowed to show more than two animals in an individual class unless otherwise announced in writing.

RULE 6: Diseased animals are barred entry (at all times) into the WTF&R area or grounds. Superintendents are instructed and authorized to refuse unloading privileges to animals showing any signs of disease.

RULE 7: Barren animals will not be eligible in breeding classes. An affidavit that the animal is a breeder must be furnished upon request.

RULE 8: To be eligible for entry, exhibitors and their livestock must meet and adhere to the requirements of Special Rules listed under the appropriate department(s).

RULE 9: Any exhibitor found in violation of any of the livestock show rules may be forever barred from showing at the WTF&R or any livestock show held under the auspices of the WTF&R.

Procedures for Entry

RULE 10: Entries must be submitted online at www.wtexasliv.fairwire.com for all entries except for Poultry. Once online entries are completed and submitted, it is important to print the receipt for your records. Payment for entries should be made online with a debit/credit card. However, if you are a County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher and need to submit payment through the US Postal Service, please mail the printed receipt, each exhibitors completed entry form, and payment. All entry forms can be found on our website at www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. The individual entry receipt may be printed upon completing the online process. When submitting entries and payment online, please mail in completed entry forms. If submitting paper entries (Poultry entries only), please complete entry form pertaining to that division and registration forms with original signature and mail with payment of one check payable to the West Texas Fair & Rodeo. These entry forms may be found on our website www.westtexasfairrodeo.com. Online, mail and all other forms of the submission of livestock entries, either by the exhibitor or by anyone acting for the exhibitor, constitutes an unconditional agreement to abide and be completely bound by these and all rules and regulations issued by the management. RULE 24: No one will be allowed to act as judge in the show in which he or she exhibits.

RULE 25: All animals properly entered in any show class and passed by the sifting committee appointed by Management as eligible for competition must be brought into the show ring for competition. Each entry will be assigned a number in the official catalog, and exhibitors will receive cards with numbers to correspond with the catalog numbers. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor while the animal is being shown. Exhibitors refusing, for any cause not approved by Management, to lead out entered animals for parade or for competition in the show ring and/or refusing to show their animal at such times and places as may be directed and/or refusing to furnish information concerning their stock as may be requested by Management, will not only forfeit any prizes previously won, but may be required to remove their stock from the WTF&R grounds immediately.

RULE 26: Judging will not be delayed for animals entering the arena late. Any exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time may be barred from competition in the class. Protests that the judge overlooked exhibits will not be considered.

Eligibility for Exhibition and Competition

RULE 27: Committees to sift livestock may be appointed in such departments as Management deems advisable. It is the duty of the sifting committee to pass upon the eligibility of animals for show purposes before judging begins. These committees shall be empowered and required to eliminate from the Show any animal which, in their judgment, is not qualified to compete.

RULE 28: Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal or show they deem unsuitable or objectionable, and to return any money already paid for space or stalls. Management will not be required to furnish reasons for such actions; the return of the exhibitor's money exonerates the WTF&R from any claim by the exhibitor.

RULE 29: Exhibitors not cooperating with security personnel or officials of the WTF&R in all matters of policy, including parking, will have their entries cancelled and will be ordered to remove their exhibit from the grounds immediately.

RULE 30: The showing of unethically fitted livestock or livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered is prohibited. Unethical fitting consists of any method altering the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body. Animals showing, in the opinion of the judge, signs of having been operated on or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults in conformation or with intent to deceive, relative to the animal's soundness, will be disqualified. Examples of unethical fitting include but are not limited to: treating any part of the animals body internally or externally with a substance to improve confirmation, surgical alterations, excluding removal of warts or horns, use of injects, striking the animal to cause swelling in depressed areas, use of electrical contrivances, feeding of material not conducive to the animals health, blocking nerves to prevent limping or switching of the tail, the use of diuretics, alcoholic or carbonated beverages administered in feed or as a drench, artificially filling animals by stomach pumping or airing injections.

RULE 31: Any animal that becomes wild or unruly at any time may be eliminated from competition at the discretion of Management and will be ordered to be removed from the grounds immediately.

Care of Animals, Stalls, and Pens

RULE 32: The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited. Mistreatment of animals by owners or handlers is strictly forbidden. Show management may disqualify exhibitor and appropriate measures may be taken.

RULE 33: All stalls, pens, and exhibition places must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse matter disposed of as directed by Management. Exhibitors are required to keep their tack area, stalls, aisles, and exhibits in an organized, orderly, and clean condition at all times.

RULE 34: There will be no straw used for bedding cattle in the exhibition barn. Straw may be used in the tie-out areas. Cedar fiber will be provided for cattle stalls. Bedding will be provided for sheep and swine pens. Sheep and swine exhibitors may provide their own bedding or may purchase bedding from the WTF&R livestock office. Straw may be used for breeding sheep.

RULE 35: Livestock exhibitors are permitted to display a sign over their exhibit advertising their own herd. This sign shall be of a reasonable size, in the opinion of Management, so as not to obstruct the view of other exhibitors' signs or exhibits of livestock. Management reserves the right to have objectionable signs removed.

RULE 36: Trimming chutes will not be allowed down main aisles. Chutes must be kept in designated areas only.

ANY CHUTES NOT IN A DESIGNATED AREA WILL BE MOVED. THIS WILL BE ENFORCED.

RULE 37: Floor fans and Port-A-Coolers will NOT be allowed in the First Financial Pavilion, formerly known as the "Livestock Barn." Fans must be hung from above. Limit one fan per animal.

RULE 38: Management reserves the right to reassign any space, stall, or pen not occupied on or before the required arrival time. No exhibitor or concessionaire will be allowed to sublet or sell any space, privilege, stall, pen, or coop without the written permission of Management.

Composite Rules and Regulations

RULE 39: Dogs will not be allowed in the Show Barn or Buildings, except for dogs accompanying visually or physically impaired individuals which must be kept on a leash at all times.

RULE 40: Nurse cows will not be allowed on the show grounds in accordance to the rules of the I.A.F.E. and the American Breed Association.

RULE 41: Anyone desiring to exhibit cattle not entered in official livestock classes must request and receive special permission from Management. ALL REGULATION HEALTH RULES WILL APPLY. Exhibit space will be issued only if room permits. No additional animals may be brought on the grounds.

RULE 42: Any animal on exhibition may not be removed from the grounds prior to its release time without a special order given by the Livestock Department. Releases will be given once the accounting has been completed after each show, which normally takes one hour. Steer releases will be given at 1:00 p.m. if exhibitor has finished showing. All livestock must have an approved release form in order to be removed from the grounds. Gate personnel will prohibit removal of any livestock or exhibit without a written release. Any violation of this rule will cause forfeiture of all premiums earned by exhibitor. Vehicle tag numbers will be required for a release.

RULE 43: Any equipment brought in to be used in a stall or other space by an exhibitor must comply with and be used in compliance with all federal, state, and municipal occupational safety and health regulations.

RULE 44: Exhibitors will not be allowed to bring portable scales into the building.

RULE 45: No demonstrations, trophies, decorations, portals, fountains, signs, banners, advertising matter or exhibits of any kind will be allowed in the aisles or public passageways or attached to the Show building's walls, posts, or doors.

RULE 46: All livestock for exhibition are subject and governed by the Rules and Regulations of the Texas Animal Health Commission and the West Texas Fair & Rodeo. Official health certificates covering all entries shall be presented to gate personnel upon arrival. The only exceptions to this rule are Open Breeding Sheep, Jr. Steers, and Youth Swine.

RULE 47: Premiums will be paid by cash immediately after placings are called for each show. An envelope will be presented to exhibitors containing the cash value of their placing and their placing ribbon.

RULE 48: THE WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CANCEL ANY OPEN OR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW WHERE LESS THAN FIVE (5) EXHIBITORS OR TWENTY-FIVE ANIMALS ARE ENTERED. Entry deadline is August 21 without penalty. If sufficient numbers (25 head) have not been entered by August 28, the exhibitors entered will be notified by phone and ENTRY FEES will be refunded.

Protests

RULE 49: Protests must be in writing and be accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly and in writing the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to Management immediately after occasion for such protest. No protest will be accepted for consideration if not submitted in writing and within 12 hours of the action upon which the protest is based.

RULE 50: No complaint or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article will be considered by Management.

RULE 51: The right of an exhibitor to appeal the decision of the judge to the Board will be only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit or when it is charged that the decision of the judge has been influenced or interfered with.

RULE 52: All questions of dispute shall be referred to the Board of Directors of the WTF&R, whose decision shall be final.

HERDSMAN AWARDS

The West Texas Fair & Rodeo will award special prizes in the Open Cattle Departments and the Junior Beefmaster show to the herdsman or exhibitors in charge of livestock exhibits. First Place winners will receive \$25.00. A committee will make inspections to determine the winner. The following points will be considered:

1. Orderliness and cleanliness of quarters, stalls and animals.
2. Promptness in having stalls or pens cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day.
3. Systematic and neat arrangement of traps, feed and forage, and keeping same out of alleys.
4. Promptness in removing blankets or covers from livestock by 8:00 a.m. each day and leaving them off until 8:00 p.m.
5. Personal appearance of herdsman and helpers.
6. Observation of all rules and regulations.
7. Cooperating with show officials in promoting the livestock show in general.
8. Cooperating with other exhibitors and exhibiting an attitude of good sportsmanship in general.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

All General Rules and Regulations will apply to Junior Shows

RULE 1: All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the General Livestock Rules published in this premium list and to these Special Rules. In the event of any conflict between these Special Rules and the General Rules, the provisions of these Special Rules shall prevail.

RULE 2: Participation in the junior livestock division is limited to members of a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter within the state of their residence and who have continuously, personally fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of an approved sponsor, County Extension Agent (CEA) or Agriculture Science Teacher (AST). To be eligible, boys or girls must be in the third grade of the year of the WTF&R entered; or nine years old but not more than 19 years old (on January 1) of the year of the WTF&R entered. The only exception is Junior Beefmaster and Junior Boer Goats where exhibitors may be age 21 or under.

Application for Entry

RULE 3: All entries, with the exception of the Junior Market Steer Show, in the Junior Livestock Show can be entered by the exhibitor or their respective parent or guardian. The Junior Market Steer Show must be entered by a CEA/AST. Any and all entries made online by a CEA/AST must be accompanied by USPS mailed and completed original paper entry forms and online entry receipt. If submitting payment via USPS mail, please include the online entry receipt with payment. It is recommended you make copies of your exhibitors entry forms and online entry receipts for your records.

RULE 4: Junior exhibitors may enter no more than two entries per class in the Junior Beef Heifers and three head per class in Open Breeding Sheep. Junior exhibitors may only enter two head in the Junior Market Steer Show.

RULE 5: Exhibitors must own their animals at the beginning of and throughout the feeding period and must feed, care for and exhibit animals entered without any aid or assistance during the entire feeding period except from CEA, AST, other junior exhibitors, or approved sponsors within their state. The feeding and fitting period shall begin no later than July 1 for Junior Market Steers, Junior Beef Heifers, and not later than August 1 for Open Breeding Sheep. Animals entered must be registered in the records of their respective breed associations in the name of the exhibitor on or before the date of possession required. Date of sale between breeder and exhibitor is not acceptable. Original registration paperwork must be presented at check in.

RULE 6: An entry in the Junior Livestock Show must be exhibited by the owner, except when an exhibitor/owner has more than one entry in one class or cannot be present to show his or her own animal due to illness, etc. In these cases, a substitute approved by show management may show for the exhibitor.

RULE 7: Junior exhibitors may enter the Open Show classes. Open show entry forms must be filled out and the appropriate entry fees paid in addition to the Junior entries by the entry deadline.

RULE 8: All entries will be stalled by the FFA Chapter or County 4-H Club unless one of the following applies:

a. For steers only: All stalling requests must be submitted with each individual entry. These requests are for what group you would like to be stalled with; not the location within the barn.

b. Jr. Heifer Cattle: Please state your preference to stall your cattle together as a chapter or to be stalled separately by breed. This preference must be submitted with the individual entry. These requests are for what group you would like to be stalled with; not the location within the barn.

After the animals have been stalled, they shall not be moved to any other part of the barn except on the consent of either the livestock show management or the superintendent of the department. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to always keep the pens or stalls clean and in a presentable condition. Feed and water buckets are not to be left unattended and must be removed immediately following feeding or watering. Failure to comply with this rule can result in forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or removal of animal from show.

RULE 9: Passes will be issued according to the schedule as listed in the General Livestock Rules and Regulations. If exhibitors purchase more passes than what's given according to the schedule, then the additional passes will be mailed along with the automatic passes. CEAs and ASTs will NOT be allowed to pick up passes for their junior exhibitors. All CEAs and ASTs directly responsible for junior exhibitors and attending the WTF&R will receive a Livestock pass and a vehicle pass. Other vehicle passes will be issued at time of arrival at each livestock entry gate **ONLY TO VEHICLES HAULING LIVESTOCK**. Security will affix the vehicle pass to the windshield. The pass must remain affixed to the windshield, or the exhibitor will lose their parking privileges. All other vehicles must park in the public parking area. Livestock Passes are good at any walk-through gate.

The following summary is a condensed version of the Texas Animal Health Commission regulations. The regulations will supersede this summary if there is a dispute between the two. For more information contact the Texas Animal Health Commission by calling (512) 719-0777 (24 hours) or 1 (800) 550-8242, or by writing the TAHC, P.O. Box 12966, Austin, TX 78711-2966. The West Texas Fair & Rodeo is an open, interstate show, accepting entries of livestock from within Texas, other states, and other countries. The Youth Swine Show, Open Breeding Sheep Show, Junior Market Steer Show, and Open Poultry Show are restricted to in-state entries only. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection – The certificate must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations or treatments required by the Commission were completed. For certain diseases, a specific statement may be required indicating disease free status. The certificate is required to accompany animals and fowl entering the West Texas Fair & Rodeo grounds as stated in the following summary of entry requirements. **THE CERTIFICATE IS VALID FOR 45 DAYS FOR EQUINE AND 30 DAYS FOR ALL OTHER SPECIES.** Prior Entry Permits are required as noted in the following summary of entry requirements. Permits may be obtained by calling (512) 719-0777 (24 hours) or 1 (800) 550-8242, or by writing TAHC, P.O. Box 12966, Austin, TX 78711-2966. The permit for entry is not required when livestock and ratites enter for exhibition and return to the state of origin. All poultry entering Texas must be permitted.

CATTLE (beef & dairy)

Junior Market Steers (In-State (Texas) Steers ONLY)

1. A CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION IS NOT REQUIRED FOR CATTLE SHOWN IN THE JUNIOR MARKET STEER SHOW AT THE WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO.

Texas Origin Breeding Cattle (not including Steers)

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
2. All dairy cattle must be identified with official ID and recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Out-of-State Origin Cattle

1. Must meet the same requirements as Texas Origin Breeding Cattle.
2. Negative tuberculosis (TB) test within 60 days for all sexually intact dairy cattle that are 2 months of age or older or originate from an accredited tuberculosis free herd. In addition, all sexually intact dairy cattle originating from a state or area with anything less than a tuberculosis free state status shall be tested negative for tuberculosis in accordance with the appropriate requirements for states or areas for that status, prior to entry with results of the test recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection. Beef cattle from Accredited Free States or Zones do not require tuberculosis (TB) testing. Cattle from a tuberculosis free herd with a certificate of veterinary inspection stating the accreditation number and herd anniversary test date or suckling calves from a negative dam to not require testing.
3. Negative brucellosis test is required within 30 days prior to entry or be from a class free state, area or certified free herd. Brucellosis vaccination is required for female cattle between 4 to 12 months of age or be from a class free state, area or certified free herd.
4. All bulls entering Texas for the purpose of participating at fairs, shows, exhibitions and/or rodeos, which are (12) months of age or older and capable of breeding may enter the state without testing or certification for trichomoniasis, but shall obtain a permit prior to entry into the state. Bulls permitted for entry into the State of Texas under the provisions of this subsection shall not be commingled with female cattle or used for breeding. Bulls that stay in the state more than sixty (60) days must be tested negative for trichomoniasis with an official culture test or official Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test.
5. The Permit for Entry is not required when cattle enter for exhibition and return to the state of origin, except for exhibition bulls that do not meet TAHC's Trich entry requirements.

EQUINE

Texas Origin Equine

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, issued within 45 (forty-five) days or a current, valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card, issued within 6 (six) months.
2. Negative equine infectious anemia (EIA) test (also known as "Coggins Test") within 12 (twelve) months. In state origin equine: foals, under eight months of age, nursing a negative dam are exempt from testing. Test document must be in hand or test results and related information must be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Out of State Origin Equine

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, issued within 30 (thirty) days or a current, valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card, issued within 6 (six) months.
2. Negative equine infectious anemia (EIA) test (also known as “Coggins Test”) within 12 (twelve) months. Test document must be in hand or test results and related information must be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

GOATS

Texas Origin Goats & Out of State Origin Goats

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, within 30 (thirty) days.
2. Texas - All sexually intact exhibition goats must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry, except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers.
3. Out of State – All exhibition goats must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry, except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers.

POULTRY

Texas Origin Poultry

1. Negative pullorum-typhoid test within 30 (thirty) days or from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum- Typhoid Program or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP).
2. Poultry must originate from areas where reportable avian diseases are not known to have been active within the last 30 (thirty) days.

SHEEP

Texas Origin Sheep

1. Only Texas sheep will be admitted to the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Open Breeding Sheep Show. Since only Texas sheep will be shown, a health certificate is not required.

SWINE

Texas Origin Swine

2. Only Texas hogs will be admitted to the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Youth Swine Show. Since only Texas hogs will be shown, a health certificate is not required.

EXOTIC LIVESTOCK AND RATITES

Exotic Livestock are defined as grass-eating or plant-eating, single hooved or cloven-hooved mammals that are not indigenous to this state and are known as ungulates, including animals from the swine, horse, tapir, camel, llama, rhinoceros, elephant, deer, and antelope families. Camelidae are defined as members of the family of animals which include camel, llamas, and vicunas. The domestic members of the genus lama include the llama, alpaca, and guanaco.

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.

These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating direction with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 811. Effective July 1, 2007, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, and individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.
- 5. EXHIBITORS:** Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring. Exhibitors must be a member of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association to show. Exhibitors must be at least 6 years old on January 1, 2026 but not over the age of 21. Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless they have two entries in the same class, whereupon another bonafide JBBA member may show one of the entries. Entries may be completed online by the exhibitor, and there is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- 6. PEDIGREE:** All heifers must be registered with the Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU Certified purebred dam, second cross dam, or otherwise stated in the BBU bylaws. Heifers will be inspected to ensure that identification numbers and brands/tattoos match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- 7. JOINT OWNERSHIP:** When both owners are JBBA members, joint ownership will be accepted. However, animals must be entered and exhibited in the name of one of the owners. Parent-youth joint ownership will not be eligible.
- 8. PREG-CHECK:** Animals 2 years of age or older on the day shown must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of cows nursing their natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the animal will show open.
- 9. SHOW DISMISSAL/REMOVAL FROM GROUNDS:** Any heifer that, in the opinion of the designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be heifers exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic or physical defects. Any uncontrollable heifer will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge. Failure to comply with these rules or to cooperate with show management shall be grounds for removal.

- 1. RULES/REGULATIONS:** All entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Rules and Regulations, and the Special Rules of this department. ABGA Sanctioned Show Rules will be observed.
- 2. HEALTH PAPERS:** A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, within 30 (thirty) days, must be presented upon arrival at the gate to be allowed on the grounds.
- 3. CHECK IN:** All exhibitors must bring registration papers and check in with the show superintendent by 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 11th, otherwise goats will not be included on class sheets and will not be allowed to show. If an emergency or uncontrollable circumstance occurs and you are unable to be checked in by 4:00 p.m. please contact the Livestock Secretary at (325) 795-6704. Bred and Owned classes must be entered prior to the entry deadline.
- 4. ENTRY LIMITATION:** Exhibitors must be 21 years or under on January 1, 2026 and be an active member of the JABGA or ABGA. Exhibitors must present a current ABGA/JABGA membership card at check-in. Copies or digital copies of cards are acceptable. There is no limit to the number of animals that can be entered in a class by an exhibitor.
- 5. REGISTRATION:** Animals over the age of 3 months must be verified as registered in the ABGA database at the time of show. The recognized association is ABGA only. Original registration papers or registration verification is required and will be subject to inspection by the superintendent and show management.
- 6. OWNERSHIP:** Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration document. Animals must be registered in the Junior exhibitor's name. Multi-owned or farm-owned animals are NOT permitted to show in the Junior Boer Goat Show at the West Texas Fair & Rodeo.
- 7. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION:** All goats must have legible tattoo(s) or other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. The top 6 in the class plus Champion and Reserve tattoos must be read as placings are recorded. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader. Ear tattoos will now be required at the time of entry.
- 8. ANIMAL AGE:** Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate will be used to determine the class divisions. The show date will be the base date in computing all ages.
- 9. BLOOD PERCENTAGE:** All animals must be registered purebred, fullblood, or percentage blood Boer goats. Percentage Doe classes are for goats 50% to 87.5% Boer; Percentage Bucks are defined as 25% and less than 96.875%; Fullblood classes are for does that are 15/16 blood (93.7%) and higher, and 31/32 blood (96.8%) and higher for bucks. Progeny of fresh does will NOT be allowed in the ring. At the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, goats may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging. The Champion and Reserve classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show.
- 10. UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS:** Any goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from the show in any of the breeding classes. Artificial coloring will be a disqualification. Illegible tattoos or tattoos inconsistent with registration papers will result in disqualification.
- 11. HORNS:** Animals with natural horns or disbudded or dehorned may be shown.
- 12. SHOW RING ASSISTANCE:** If the exhibitor is present and able to show, they must show their own animal. If the exhibitor is unable to show, a JABGA member must show in their place. JABGA members with a physical or mental handicap are allowed a heeler and reasonable accommodations will be provided.
- 13. HEELER:** Exhibitors are permitted to have a heeler in the show ring. The heeler must be a JABGA member. Heelers are not permitted to touch the legs or assist with leg placement.

- 1. RULES/REGULATIONS:** All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Rules, and the Special Rules of this department.
- 2. HEALTH PAPERS:** A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (within the last 30 days) must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time cattle arrive on the show premises.
- 3. ELIGIBILITY:** Open to all eligible FFA or 4H members as well as IJBBA or TJBBA members Ages 7-21 as of January 1 of the calendar year of the show. Ages 7-21 Open ONLY to members of the International Junior Brangus Breeders Association (IJBBA) or the Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association (TJBBA).
- 4. ENTRY LIMITATION:** There is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- 5. REGISTRATION:** Animals must be registered with the International Brangus Breeders Association to be eligible to compete in this show. The original registration certificate for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging. The animal MUST be purebred Brangus.
- 6. ENTRIES:** The registration number, permanent animal identification number (brand or tattoo), birthdate, and sire of each animal entered in an individual class must be listed on the entry form.
- 7. RELEASES:** No animal will be allowed to leave the grounds without a proper release.
- 8. GROOMING:** Prior to Check-In, head of breeding animals must be clipped of all hair (including top knots) and be free of scurs and/or slick spots. This is a Blow-and-Go show.
- 9. DISQUALIFICATION:** Any animal found to have scurs, slick spots, or evidence of incisions (surgical or otherwise) in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel, or dewlap will be disqualified. Any animal, upon Check-In, which does not have a legible tattoo or brand corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo or brand, animals cannot be re-tattooed and re-checked at the show.
- 10. PERCENTAGE DISPUTE:** Any Brangus animal recorded in the IBBA registry that has a "Parentage Dispute" listed in its first 3 generation pedigree is ineligible for participation in Brangus shows and exhibitions. If the dispute is resolved, the listing will be removed from the pedigree and show eligibility restored.
- 11. UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS:** In IBBA-approved shows, no animal may be show that has been artificially filled with any amount of liquid at anytime once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The fitter or ranch entity involved with an animal being artificially filled will be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids orally if needed without disqualifying animals from exhibition. No animal may be shown that has had any foreign objects glued or otherwise attached in a manner so as to alter its conformation or change its appearance. Tail ties and hair nets used on the tail and switch are the only exception.

IBBA INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

- 1. CLASSIFICATION & PEDIGREE:** The IBBA and its representatives have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited Brangus animals. Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all show rules as adopted by IBBA.
- 2. COMPLIANCE:** Each exhibitor shall submit his or her registered Brangus cattle to such tests and examinations as requested and/or required by the IBBA, its authorized representatives, or those of the relevant show.
- 3. CONSIDERATION:** For, and in consideration of, the opportunity to participate in any Brangus function, each exhibitor hereby releases the IBBA, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits, and judgments past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decisions there from.
- 4. DENTAL INSPECTION:** All entries may be classified for judging on an age basis and should be entered in class according to age. Teeth may be inspected by a veterinarian designated by IBBA in order to determine whether dental development is within allowable limits for the class entered. If the veterinarian determines that, in his or her opinion, dental development exceeds maximum allowable

limits, the animal shall be moved to an older class as determined by the veterinarian and shall remain in that class until determined otherwise by subsequent mouthing or favorable appeal to the IBBA Executive Committee. If it is not possible to move an animal, the animal may not be exhibited in such show.

5. DISPUTES: Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any such test, exam or show rule enforcement as applied to his or her animal shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the Rules of the IBBA.

6. APPEALS: An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or IBBA-designated association representatives under sections 1 and 4 of the "Inspection of Exhibits" may be made to the Executive Committee of the IBBA if the following requirements are satisfied: 1) The appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party, and 2) the appealing party files the written appeal with the IBBA Executive Committee as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated association representative's decision was made. If an appeal satisfying the foregoing requirements filed with the IBBA Executive Committee, then said committee shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party, and the veterinarian or designated association representative whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that are relevant to the matter, following which the Executive Committee shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.

Percentage bulls are not eligible to be shown. All steers must be at least 46.875% Akaushi. All exhibitors must declare breed composition at the time of entry.
- 4. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION:** All animals must have a legible ear tattoo for identification. The tattoo must correspond with tattoo number on the official certificate. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
- 5. FITTING:** This is a blow and go show. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.
- 6. SHOW DISMISSAL:** All cattle must be halter broke and manageable. Any animal deemed unsafe or uncontrollable will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge. All bulls 12 months of age and older must be shown with a nose ring. Bulls without a nose ring will not be permitted to show.

- 3. REGISTRATION:** All cattle must be from a registered sire and dam. All animals must be registered in the herd book of the American Angus Association. The registration certificate issue date must be prior to the show date. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show.

- 5. DNA PARENTAGE VERIFICATION:** Each animal may be subjected to a DNA test to verify ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE as covered under Assoc. Rules Part 3, Sec. XI, Rule 2(a).
- 6. UNETHICALLY FITTED ANIMALS:** Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a “white towel” or “white glove” test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.
- 7. ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY:** The skin color of all animals must be BLACK, except those animals having birth marks or white hairs on black skin. All animals must be polled (free of horns or scars).
- 8. EXHIBITORS:** Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

- 2. HEALTH PAPERS:** Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days is required and must be presented upon arrival at the gate to be allowed onto the grounds.
- 3. PREMIUM PARTNER:** Beefmaster Promotion Group, 541 State Hwy. 75N, Fairfield, TX 75840, pays some percent of the premiums awarded for this show.
- 4. MEMBERSHIP:** Any individual who has an entry in a BPG approved show must be a member of the Beefmaster Promotion Group and must be at least 6 years of age as of the day of the show.
- 5. RING ASSISTANCE:** Only one (1) person per animal is permitted in the show arena during the exhibition of individual classes, with exceptions made by one of the following: a.) A physical or mental disability that prevents the proper handling of the animal without assistance or, b.) a handler has a physical injury (sprained ankle, broken arm, etc.) that requires assistance. Any request for an assistant shall be presented to an attending BPG Director or Officer before the beginning of the show for a ruling. OFFICIAL ABA SHOW RULES: Any poultry association, club, or society that is an associate member of the American Bantam Association may host a show and offer the special prizes furnished by the association if it holds its show in accordance with the Rules of the American Bantam Association subject to the following provisions: I. JUDGING REQUIREMENTS: All ABA meets must follow rules as outlined in Article 16 of ABA Constitution and By-Laws. A. State, Provincial and Special meets: All judges who judge bantams must be ABA members, and at least one third must be licensed ABA judges with a minimum of one. B. District Meets All judges who judge bantams must be ABA members with at least half of them licensed ABA judges. C. Semi-Annual and Annual Meets: All judges who judge bantam chicken classes shall have a Bantam Chicken Specialty license or a General license. All Judges who judge the bantam Champions shall have a current ABA General license. All judges must be ABA members in good standing. No Judge shall exhibit and judge birds in the same bantam classification. II. EXHIBIT REQUIREMENTS: A. Only breeds and varieties admitted to the ABA Bantam Standard may compete for Association special prizes and awards. B. Only members of the ABA in good standing are eligible to receive the special prizes and awards of the association. III. SHOW ROOM RECOMMENDATIONS A. Sanitation; 1. Show coops and cups must be made of such material that they can be kept sanitary. 2. Litter shall be of adequate quality and quantity. 3. Ventilation shall be appropriate for the season and free of drafts. 4. Participation in a swap section associated with a show should be limited to exhibitors at the show. 5. Swap participants should be limited to a certain number of birds per cage/coop to ensure overcrowding is not a problem. 6. An officer of the show or designee should inspect the swap/sale section to ensure that obviously disease birds or animals are removed immediately. B. Water and feed: Exhibitor's and show management must ensure adequate care, feed and water are provided all birds on the premises. Show Management is encouraged to additionally have all water cups filled

before the show hall is open. C. Caging: Shall be adequate size for the type, size, and sex of the bird being shown. D. Display areas: Shall be adequately illuminated for viewing or judging. IV. SUGGESTION TO SHOW MANAGEMENT: A. The show management shall guard against contagious poultry diseases and shall immediately remove any bird showing symptoms of disease. B. Aisle ways shall be of adequate width for comfortable viewing and judging. Cages shall be no higher than double decked. C. During judging the Aisle ways should be blocked from spectator movement. D. The show secretary shall complete the ABA show report form and forward it to the ABA within 90 days after the show. E. Management shall determine the currency of membership and licensing of the judges. If in doubt they shall check with the ABA secretary. F. Special awards, as offered by the ABA shall be listed in the premium book. G. The ABA Bantam Standard shall be used in judging bantams V. SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS FOR ABA MEMBERS ONLY: A. Master Exhibitor Program: When a member, over any period of years, accumulates twenty starred wins (defined as best or reserve in a class of 100 or more birds), he or she becomes an ABA Master Exhibitor. B. Master Breeder Program: When a member, over any period of years (but not less than 5), accumulates 20 starred wins in one variety, he or she becomes an ABA Master Breeder. C. Citation of Merit Program: When a member, over any period of years, accumulates 5 starred wins in one variety, he or she is awarded a Citation of Merit. VI. STATE AND FEDERAL REGULATIONS Some State and Federal laws regulate the possession and propagation of two breeds of bantam ducks. The ABA recommends that both individual members and the management of shows hosting. ABA meets ensure that they comply with any federal or state regulations which apply to any type of bantam duck. VII. PROTEST OF AWARDS: Protests may be entertained in case of apparent dishonesty on the part of a judge, or apparent carelessness that has resulted in the placing of a disqualified specimen. The protest must be in writing and presented to the local show chairman as soon as possible and before the awards are handed out, accompanied by a twenty-five-dollar deposit. The local show committee, consisting of three persons from the local association including the show chairman, working closely with the ABA judge or judges at the show, shall make a decision which shall be final. If the protest is sustained, the deposit shall be returned to the protester, otherwise, it becomes the property of the local association. VIII. NON-RECOGNIZED BREEDS OR VARIETIES: Breeds or Varieties not recognized by the ABA. Non recognized varieties may place no higher than BV or RV. Non recognized breeds may place no higher than BB or RB. IX. POSTING OF SHOW RULES: This copy of show rules must be posted in show hall. 7. SHOW DISMISSAL: Animals must be kept under control at all times. Should an animal become unmanageable, the show superintendent/West Texas Fair & Rodeo Management shall have the right and responsibility to remove such animal from competition and all entry fees shall be forfeited.

8. SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitutions will only be allowed within each show after the entry deadline.

9. PRODUCE OF DAM/GET OF SIRE: NO Produce of Dam or Get or Sire classes will be presented.

10. HEALTH PAPERS: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days is required and must be presented upon arrival at the gate to be allowed onto the grounds.

HOP INTO THE YOUTH RABBIT SHOW!

FRYER CLASSES are made up of rabbits, exhibited in uniform **pens of 3**, with the intended purpose of going to market. These animals are similar in muscle mass and are typically judged on weight, size, condition, appearance, fur, and fleshing. Consistency and uniformity across your market pen are key to a successful show. All rabbits exhibited in the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Youth Rabbit Show Fryer Classes must be of the American, American Chin, Argente Bruns, Californian, Champagne D'Argent, Cinnamon, Crème D'Argent, New Zealand, Palomino, Satin, and Rex breeds and shown in a pen of 3. Pens must be the same breed and variety but do not have to come from the same litter. Fryer pens will have a combined rabbit weight of no less than 9 pounds. The maximum weight for a fryer pen will be 15 pounds, with a maximum weight per rabbit of 5 pounds.

BREEDING CLASSES are made up of single rabbits, exhibited in their respective age classes, that **exemplify the ideal characteristics of the breed**. These animals are judged on bone structure, conformality, fur, muscle type and condition, any other unique characteristics of the breed. If you breed, own, or show New Zealand, Californian, or Satin rabbits – they will be shown in Breeding Classes #01. through #09. Rabbits in classes #01. - #09. will be divided based on age: Senior Bucks & Does (over 8 months), 6-8 month Bucks & Does, and Junior Bucks & Does (under 6 months).

4 CLASS rabbits are any of the following breeds: American Fuzzy Lop, American Sable, Angora (English, French, or Satin), Belgian Hare, Britannia Petite, Chinchilla (Standard), Dutch, Dwarf, Dwarf Hotot, Dwarf Papillon, English Spot, Florida White, Harlequin, Havana, Himalayan, Holland Lop, Jersey Woolly, Lilac, Lionhead, Mini Lop, Mini Rex, Mini Satin, Netherland Dwarf, Polish, Rhinelander, Silver, Silver Martin, Tan, Thrianta. **4 Class** rabbits are grouped by age and judged as a single entry. Rabbits in this grouping are generally smaller breeds with a mature weight **under 9 pounds**. Rabbits will then be grouped by age: Senior Bucks & Does (over 8 months) and Junior Bucks & Does (under 6 months). If you breed, own, or show any of the above breeds, your rabbits will be entered in the 4 Class Division at the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Youth Rabbit Show.

6 CLASS rabbits are any of the following breeds: American, Angora (Giant), Argent Burn, Beveren, Blanc de Hotot, Champagne d'Argent, Checkered Giant, Chinchilla (American, Giant, Standard), Cinnamon, Crème d'Argent, English Lop, French Lop, Flemish Giant, Giant Lop, Hotot, Palomino, Rex, Silver Fox. **6 Class** rabbits are grouped by age and judged as a single entry. Rabbits in this grouping are generally larger breeds with a mature weight **over 9 pounds**. Rabbits will then be grouped by age: Senior Bucks & Does (over 8 months), 6-8 month Bucks & Does, and Junior Bucks & Does (under 6 months). If you breed, own, or show any of the above breeds, your rabbits will be entered in the 6 Class Division at the West Texas Fair & Rodeo Youth Rabbit Show.

If you have questions about showing rabbits or would like to brush up on Rabbit Showmanship skills, the Livestock Secretary recommends the ARBA Standard of Perfection, the Washington State University Extension 4-H Rabbit Round Robbin Question Guide, and the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Rabbit Project webpage.

SPECIAL RULES

1. RULES/REGULATIONS: All entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to the Special Rules of this department, as interpreted by the superintendents

2. EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY: This division is open to any youth under the age of 18. Exhibitors must be able to exhibit the animal by themselves; unless exhibitor presents a physical handicap, however they must accompany the animal in the ring.

3. TEXAS RESIDENTS ONLY: Health Certificates are not required. Accepted breeds are as follows: Berkshire, Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, Black OPB, White OPB, and Crosses (Herefords and Tamworths). Barrows, gilts, and boars UNDER 100 lbs are eligible to show. SWINE owned and housed in Texas ONLY.

4. ENTRIES: Entries are due August 21, 2026, and must be done online. Entries may be submitted by the exhibitor or CEA/AST. No entries will be accepted after August 28, 2026.

5. WEIGH-IN: Weights must be called in by 6:00 pm on Friday, September 18, 2026. If not able to be on grounds by then, please call (325) 795-6704. Swine must be left in pens by 12:00 am (midnight) if weights are called in.

6. CLASSIFICATION: Exhibitors must indicate on weight card the breed of each entry. All swine will be classified at the time of judging. If the animal is classified out of its original class, it will be disqualified in that class and moved to the proper cross class. The decision of the classifier will be final.

7. ARRIVAL/ENTRANCE: Enter Gate 6/H.

8. SUPERVISION: All swine exhibited shall be under the official's supervision during the duration of the show so far as it pertains to the health and sanitation of the animals and the spread of disease.

9. TACK: Feed, tack boxes, and equipment will be placed in sections as designated by the Superintendents.

10. STALLING: Stalls will be pre-bedded with pine shavings. Pens are available on a first-come, first-served basis. All swine will be stalled in the southwest corner of the First Financial Pavilion.

11. CLASSES/MINIMUM WEIGHT: Classes will be light and heavy weights, minimum of 60 lbs. There will be a 10 lb weigh-back. Boars must be under 100 lbs to show, any boar over 100 lbs will be removed from the show. Pigs weighed out will result in possible disqualification.

12. RELEASE: To leave the grounds after the show, all entries must have a release. Releases will be given at the completion of the Youth Swine Show at the discretion of the Superintendents.

13. FITTING: Foreign material including (but not limited to) painting, powdering, oiling, artificial coloring, or adhesives is prohibited upon arrival on Grounds. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.

Youth Swine Classification Guidelines

Black OPB

- **Poland China**
 - Must Possess Poland China breed character (ears must be down)
 - Must be black with a white face and switch (unless tail is docked). Three of the four legs must be white, may have an occasional splash of white on the body
 - Must not have evidence of belt formation
 - Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment
 - Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering of ears with possible tags are ineligible
- **Spotted Swine**
 - Must be black and white
 - Must possess Spotted breed character
 - Ears cannot be erect
 - Any red tinted or brown spots are ineligible
 - No solid black head from ears forward
 - No distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder
 - Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification

White OPB

- **Chester White**
 - Must possess Chester White breed character (ears must be down and medium size)
 - Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a U.S. minted silver dollar, no colored hair
 - Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are ground for disqualification
- **Landrace**
 - Must be white in color and possess Landrace character (ears must be down)
 - Must NOT allow any color hair other than white
 - Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation
 - Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter

Duroc

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed character (ears must be down and medium size)
- Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal
- Must NOT have any black hair
- Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter
- Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt

Hampshire

- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on a front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body
- Must possess Hampshire breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded)
- Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead
- Must NOT have any red hair

Yorkshire

- Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed character (ears must be erect)
- Must NOT have any colored hair other than white
- Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar
- Must not have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar

Berkshire

- Black and white with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character
- Must have white on face and tail (unless tail is docked). Three of the four legs must be white
- Must NOT have a solid white or solid black face from the ears forward
- Must NOT have a solid black nose (rim of nose)
- White is allowed on the ears, but neither can be entirely white
- An occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

SPECIAL RULES

1. **Rules/Regulations:** Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each contestant agrees to abide by the general rules of the West Texas State Fair & Rodeo Livestock Show and the Special Rules listed. United States Olympic Archery governing body rules will apply with some modifications to meet the objectives of the program or to increase the success rates of youth participating in the program. In this event, Texas 4-H rules and regulations supersede all other rules where differences exist. Contestants, as well as coaches and parents, are encouraged to be familiar with these rules and those related archery governing bodies.
2. **Entry Limitation:** Entries must be made by the contestant's CEA/AST. Each contestants supervising CEA/AST will be held responsible for ensuring the contestant is currently shooting under the direction of a certified coach. Entry applicants not participating in a program under the direction of a certified coach will not be permitted to compete. **LIMIT 40 TOTAL ARCHERS.**
3. **Eligibility:** Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA and 4-H Members. Each contestant is required to return a Youth Liability and Indemnity Form.
4. **Age Divisions: (as of September 1, 2026)**
 - a. Juniors must be at least 8 years old and in the 3rd grade, but no more than the 8th grade.
 - b. Seniors must be in at least the 9th grade, but not older than 19 and in the 12th grade.
5. **Contest Format:**
 - a. **Targets:** This will be a World Archery "18 Meter Indoor Round." It will consist of 60 arrows shot at the 40cm 5 color face. 40 cm Triple faces will be allowed. Target assignments will be given at check in.
 - b. **Classes:** Deadline to change classes is September 1. You will only be able to enter one class and only able to change classes one time. Contestants will compete in one of the below classes based upon what bow they will be shooting with: **COMPOUND, RECURVE, NASP**
 - c. **Contest Preparation:** All contestants are REQUIRED to attend the Archer Orientation prior to the beginning of the contest. If a contestant does not attend the orientation, they will be disqualified from the contest. All equipment will be inspected at the time of check-in.
 - d. **Tournament:** The tournament will begin promptly after the conclusion of orientation.
6. **Equipment:** Contestants must provide their own quivers. All bows must remain cased on the Fairgrounds until equipment inspection. Absolutely no sky drawing is allowed, no exceptions. This will be strictly enforced. Any contestant seen sky drawing will be immediately disqualified. All contestants or persons in charge of property, shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as the West Texas Fair & Rodeo does not undertake to do so and shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property of contestants thereof. All contestants are responsible for security of their own property. The West Texas Fair & Rodeo is not responsible for the acts of a third party.
7. **Range Safety:** The safety of all involved is of paramount importance. All range safety rules will be strictly enforced. Any contestant failing to conform to safety standards will be warned or disqualified from the event. Minor infractions will be noted. Repeated infractions or major safety violations will result in disqualification from the event.
8. **Field and Range Boundaries:** For multiple reasons, control of traffic on and around the range is essential. Please respect these boundaries and the directions of the officials.
9. **Conduct of Contestants:**
 - a. Only contestants and contest officials will be permitted in the contest area during competition.
 - b. If any contestant, in any way, whether in person or by agent, or servant, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows disrespect to them, to the show or competition, they are subject to be penalized. Management may demand a proper apology from the contestant, may exclude them from competition, bar them from the grounds, and may also withhold any prizes won.

- c. Participants are required to dress appropriately. Contestants must wear a shirt with sleeves and fully enclosed shoes must be worn. No Croc or Croc adjacent shoes may be worn.
 - d. Only authorized persons are permitted to use two-way radios on the grounds. Any deliberate disruption of range communication by anyone at the event will be considered a safety violation and will be treated as such.
10. **Coaching:** A participant may not be coached while on the shooting line. Coaching includes any communication between the coach, parent, or other spectator and the contestant; verbal or non-verbal. The contestant may request assistance from the range safety officer and the range officer may assign an assistant.
 11. **Scoring:** The double scoring system will be used. All participants will be involved in score keeping. All reported scores are checked for accuracy and corrections will be made when required. Contestants should be familiar with the double scoring system, and able to complete the scoring process without assistance. Show officials maintain the objective of producing timely, accurate and complete scoring records for each event. They do not represent any club, county, team, or individual. The shooting center, via the Shoot Coordinator, will be responsible for conducting any and all aspects of the event pertaining to “shooting”. Including, but not limited to: scoring, posting of scores, determination of winner, and rule interpretation. Parents, coaches, observers and contestants should never have possession of scorecards.
 12. **Appeal/Protest:** A contestant may appeal a ruling on the field immediately if they feel a referee has missed a call. The scorer may poll the squad at their discretion. The decision of the referee on the field is final and not subject to further appeal. Parent/coach scoring is not official scoring and will not be consulted. Contestants may only protest any injustice, violation of the rules, or other circumstances that may have resulted in placing them at a disadvantage relative to other contestants. Such conditions must be reported to the field referee immediately.
 13. **Results:** The contest results, as announced, will be final. Awards will be given at the conclusion of the contest.
 14. **Awards:** Awards will be given to the top three (3) individuals in both the Junior and Senior age divisions of each class.

1. The EXPO CENTER OF TAYLOR COUNTY and the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO of Abilene, Texas will not be responsible for any accidents connected to this contest.
2. QUALIFICATIONS FOR CONTESTANTS:
 - Of age thirteen (13) and older on or before September 30th of the year the student scrambles. Must be attending a public or private primary or secondary school when they return to show their animal at the following WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO.
 - 4-H and FFA members must reside in the following counties: Brown, Callahan, Coke, Coleman, Eastland, Fisher, Jones, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Sterling, and Taylor.
 - Must have been actively participating in 4-H club activities for one year OR enrolled in Vocational Agriculture prior to scrambling.
- OR BE THE FOLLOWING:
 - Senior aged students who plan to attend technical school, junior college, or a four (4) year university.
 - 4-H and FFA members must reside in the following counties: Brown, Callahan, Coke, Coleman, Eastland, Fisher, Jones, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Sterling, and Taylor.
 - Must have been actively participating in 4-H club activities for one year OR enrolled in Vocational Agriculture prior to scrambling.
3. The Calf Scramble will take place during the performance of the PRCA Pro Rodeo on Saturday, September 12, 2026.
4. Twenty-five (25) contestants will compete. One contestant will be selected from each FFA chapter or 4H club which submits entries. If twenty five scramblers have not been selected, an additional contestant will be selected from each FFA chapter or 4H club in the order in which entries were received. In the event that there are more than 25 FFA Chapters and 4H Clubs who submit entries, contestants will be selected lottery style.
5. Alternates: ONLY alternates that are present during roll-call will be considered for the scramble.
6. Ten (10) calves will be turned out into the arena.
7. Contestants and calves will be placed in the arena as determined by management.
8. Contestants will carry into the arena a halter with an attached ten (10) foot rope. Neither the halter or the rope will be used as a lariat. The halter must be placed on the calf in the usual way. The WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO will supply the halter and rope.
9. No shoes with spikes, cleats, or knobs on soles will be worn. No open-toed shoes will be worn. No slip-on shoes will be worn. Shoes must be cowboy boots or shoes with laces.
10. No jewelry, earrings, rings, necklaces, or large belt buckles will be worn. No large holes in pants or jeans will be allowed.
11. Contestants will not be allowed to work as a team. Each contestant will attempt to catch and halter one of the calves themselves. Each contestant catching a calf will be required to lead that calf across the finish line without aid. After catching a calf and placing a halter on the calf, the contestant will not be allowed to fasten the rope to themselves in any manner to aid in leading the calf across the finish line.
12. If a contestant has a hold on a calf, no other contestant will be allowed to touch the calf until it breaks away.
13. If a contestant has caught and haltered a calf and the calf gets away, the contestant can re-catch the calf by the halter. However, once the calf gets free, it is available for anyone to catch – but not by the halter. The new contestant must catch the calf – not by the halter, take the old halter off, and re-halter the calf with their own halter.
14. If a calf is caught by the tail, the contestant catching the calf shall be allowed a reasonable amount of time to place the halter; however, at the discretion of the referee, the contestant will let the calf go.
15. If two or more contestants catch the same calf, they will be ordered by the referee to release the calf.
16. Poor sportsmanship will disqualify any contestant automatically and the referee will not tolerate undue roughness. Any mistreatment of an animal will not be tolerated and is grounds for disqualification.
17. This scramble will be refereed by a group of no less than four (4) referees.

18. The CEA/AST must submit applications to scramble at the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO CALF SCRAMBLE no later than 5:00 pm on August 28, 2026. Only entries that have all paperwork (Entry Form and Release Form) submitted by the deadline will be considered to scramble. Entries can be submitted three ways:

19. Each contestant must submit a Minor's Release to the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO through their CEA/AST. After all releases are checked and accepted by the FAIR Office, contestants will be notified of their acceptance as a contestant and the date and time of participation.
20. Winners are ineligible to compete again.
21. A purchase certificate or scholarship will be issued to the first ten (10) contestants to catch a calf in the following amounts:

22. A purchase certificate must be used for the purchase of livestock, which will be the contestant's 4-H or FFA project. The breed and sex of livestock is to be determined by the contestant and their CEA/AST. All projects purchased must be shown the following year at the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO. Contestants may use the purchase certificate for breeding or market beef cattle, sheep, goats, swine, rabbits, or poultry. Animals need to be of a breed that is exhibited at the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO. Certificates MUST be completed and received by the Fair office no later than September 1 the following year after the certificate is awarded.
23. Scholarships will be paid in full within the first year to the institution in which the scrambler is enrolled. The institution must be a technical school, junior college, or a four (4) year university.
24. Participants will not be allowed to purchase animals from themselves, immediate family members or their ranches (family ranches or partnerships), or any CEA/AST. If livestock is purchased for less than the amount of the certificate, the remaining amount can be used for the purchase of ANOTHER animal to be shown at the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO. A check will be issued to the seller from the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO for the amount outlined in the purchase certificate. Checks will not be issued to 4-H Clubs or FFA Chapters.
25. Steers and heifers must be purchased by July 1, 2026 all other livestock (sheep, goats, swine, and poultry) must be purchased by August 1, 2026. Rabbits must be purchased forty-five (45) days prior to show. At purchase time, the seller will notify the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO of the purchase by sending the purchase certificate and a billing invoice to the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO. A check will be cut when a purchase certificate is received by the seller.
26. The entire program, including the selection of animal, the care and management, and the purchase process will be under the supervision of the CEA/AST. That supervisor will be the CEA/AST of the county/school currently resides under.
27. Scramblers may not transfer their scramble project from their original 4-H Club or FFA Chapter without written approval by the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO.

Participants who fail to fulfil their obligations as stated in these rules, will result in revocation of the Purchase Certificate and the participant will be required to repay the certificate amount value to the WEST TEXAS FAIR & RODEO.

1. **Rules/Regulations:** Contestants are required to bring their own clipboards, calculators, and No. 2 pencils. Scantrons will be available if needed, scantron form #480-5b (meat skill-a-thon) will be used. Contestants are not permitted to talk or use any electronic devices during the contest. This includes but is not limited to the use of smartphones or smartwatches. Contestants are prohibited from touching any items being identified, with the only exception being the wool class. Show officials reserve the right to check all contestant materials to ensure no prohibited items are present. Any contestant who fails to comply is subject to disqualification.
2. **Eligibility:** Contestants must be a Bonafide member of an FFA Chapter or 4H Club. Entries must be completed by the AST/CEA via www.wtexasliv.fairwire.com. There is no limit on how many individuals or teams a chapter or club may enter.
3. **Teams:** Teams will consist of three (3) or four (4) members. Teams which have four members, the highest three scores will be counted. Teams which have three members, all three scores will be counted.
4. **Age Divisions:** Ages will be based on September 1, 2026, and grades will be based on the 2026-2027 school year. Juniors must be at least 8 years old and in the 3rd grade, but no more than the 5th grade. Intermediates must be in the 6th through 8th grades. Seniors must be in the 9th through 12th grades but no older than 19 years of age.
5. **Contest Format:** The contest will be comprised of **four identification stations, three judging classes, an individuality quality assurance exercise, and an industry quiz**. Teams will be divided into groups and have time limits at each station.
 - a. **Livestock Equipment Identification** - Identify the proper name for pieces of equipment used in livestock production.
 - b. **Livestock Breed Identification** – Identify from photographs or pictures livestock (beef cattle, swine, sheep and goat) breeds. Contestants must also match the breed with the most appropriate description supplied for each breed.
 - c. **Retail Meat Cut Identification** – identify beef, lamb and pork retail cuts from the National 4-H Meat Judging Retail ID List. Contestants will identify the retail cut, specie, primal cut, and retail cut name.
 - d. **Feed Sample Identification** – Identify various samples of feeds and indicate their classification.
 - e. **Hay Judging Class** – Rank a class of four hay samples with analysis information and answer questions about the classes.
 - f. **Wool Judging Class** – Rank a class of four fleeces and answer questions about the class.
 - g. **Retail Meat Judging** – Rank a class of four retail meat cuts (beef, pork, or lamb) and answer questions about the class.
 - h. **Individual Quality Assurance Exercise** – Demonstrate how to read a medicine label, calculate withdrawal times, complete a treatment record, and make responsible management decisions regarding quality assurance
 - i. **Industry Quiz** – Complete a 30-question multiple choice quiz concerning the total livestock industry.
 - j. **SENIOR TEAMS ONLY** – This area will not affect individual scores. Each team will complete 2 team exercises. Team members are allowed to collaborate on team exercises. Possible team exercises include Keep/Cull, Livestock Performance and Marketing, Quality Assurance, and Nutrition and Feeding. Meats and Carcass Evaluation, Reproduction.
6. **Resources:** A complete list of resources can be found on our website under “Livestock Skill-a-thon Resource Material.” Other resources used are at the discretion of each contestant.
7. **Awards:** Awards will be given at the conclusion of the contest to the top three (3) teams and the top (3) individuals in each age division.

Contestants are not permitted to talk or use any electronic devices during the contest. This includes but is not limited to the use of smartphones or smartwatches. Show officials reserve the right to check all contestants' materials to ensure no prohibited items are present.
2. **Eligibility:** Contestants must be a bonafide member of a FFA Chapter or 4H club. Entries must be completed by the AST/CEA via www.wtexasliv.fairwire.com. There is no limit on how many individuals or teams a chapter or club may enter. Names of contestants and number of teams must be submitted by the coaches to show officials at registration the morning of the contest.
3. **Age Divisions:** Ages will be based on September 1, 2026 and grades will be based on the 2026-2027 school year. Juniors must be at least 8 years old and in grades 3-8. Seniors must be in grades 9-12 and no older than 19 years of age.

 - a. **Classes:** The classes in the contest will consist of four wool classes. There will be 20 wool grading fleeces. The contest will be graded using scantrons. Judges for the contest will be comprised of the members of the committee. The West Texas Fair & Rodeo will provide scantrons if needed. Contestants will be allowed fifteen (15) minutes on each class of fleeces to make their observations and to make their placing and reasons. Contestants will be given 30 minutes on the grading division of wool. Ties will be broken by awarding the higher place to the individual or team scoring the highest in wool grading.
5. **Awards:** Awards will be given to the top three (3) teams and the top three (3) placing individuals in each age division. All awards will be given at the conclusion of the contest. No awards will be mailed.
