## DEPARTMENT RULES \& REGULATIONS:

- Competitions are open to all residents of Williamson and adjoining counties in 12th grade or under (2023-2024 school year).
- Entries must be created, made and grown primarily by Youth and within the last year (August 2023 - August 2024). Please limit adult assistance as much as possible.
- Youth Department entries shall be submitted based on a youth's current age or school grade (2023-2024).
Note: Baked Goods Division is the exception to this rule.
- There are 3 age Categories in the Youth Division:

。4th grade and lower (10 and under)
。5th grade to 8th grade (11-14)
-9th grade to 12th grade (15-18+)

- Each youth must submit all their entries in the same age category.
- Entries must be submitted into the appropriate "Class" in each Division. There are multiple Classes in each Division.
- Only one (1) entry per Class per person is allowed.
- Youth are encouraged to submit entries into more than one Class, but only one entry per Class per person will be allowed.
- If more than one entry is submitted by the same youth in the same Class, the Youth Department Chair will choose only one entry to be judged at their discretion. The others will not be eligible for awards.
- Some Divisions have additional rules and regulations listed in their Division that apply, such as size restrictions (e.g. Legos), quantity (e.g. Horticulture and Baked Goods) These are clearly listed in the Division when required.
- All entries must be pre-entered online. No entries will be accepted that have not been pre-entered.
- All entries must be dropped off on one of the drop off dates listed above as indicated by Division. No early entries will be accepted.
- The decision of the judges is final. The judges may withhold an award at their discretion if no items are deemed worthy of award. Where there is only one exhibitor in a Class, the judges may award first, second or no prize.
- Entries other than winners may or may not be displayed during the Fair, based on availability of space.
- Unless prior arrangements have been made with the Committee Chairman, any entries and/or ribbons not picked up on the fair pick-up date/time listed above will become the property of the fair and disposal of all entries will be made at the fair's discretion.
- Ribbons will not be mailed.

- All cakes and pies entered in classes 1-14 of this Baked Goods Section are to be donated to the $4-H$ program. Cakes and pies will be auctioned (or priced and sold) at the $4-\mathrm{H}$ Auction on Saturday, August 4, in the Picnic Pavilion. All proceeds will go to the Williamson County $4-\mathrm{H}$ program.
- Cakes in Classes 1-4 must be made from scratch, no mixes.
- Cakes in Classes 5-8, Decorated Cakes, may be just a mix.
- Canned icing is not allowed.
- All pie crust should be homemade. No store-bought crusts can be used in Class 5.
- Cakes and pies must be in a covered container which will be given to the buyer with the cake. Decorated cakes should have a clear cover.
- Recipes on a $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{\prime \prime}$ card must be attached to the container of all cakes and pies to be considerate of possible allergy issues.
- All baked goods class $15-29$ should be brought on a disposable pan or plate and covered with clear plastic or placed in a clear zip-lock bag.
- Do not use a recipe that will require refrigeration. Baked goods will be in an air-conditioned room, but refrigeration is not available.
- Entries must be dropped off at time and date specified above at the Ag Expo Park arena.
- All baked goods other than cakes and pies winners may be displayed until the end of the fair or when they are no longer fresh. At the end of the fair, all remaining baked goods will be disposed of. Ribbons can be picked up at the time listed above.
- Cakes in Classes 1-9 will compete for the Champion Cake award.
- Items in Classes 10-29 will compete for Best of Show for Baked Goods.
