GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The object of these rules and regulations are to make a better fair for all exhibitors and people involved.

PUBLIC NOTICE TO ALL CONCERNED

- 1. While the greatest possible care will be taken by the management to protect patrons of the Wright County Fair, each individual will be held personally responsible for their actions and the management will not be accountable or responsible for any injury.
- 2. The Wright County Agricultural Society management assumes no liability for loss or damage to any property to the concessionaire, exhibitor or patron, due to theft, fire, tornado, weather conditions or other causes.
- 3. Upon entering fairgrounds be advised that photographs or videos may be taken of the activities or events and used for future fair promotions publications and social media.
- 4. Fair admission does not guarantee all scheduled events will take place. No refunds once an event has started.
- 5. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on fairgrounds except from their place of business or exhibit. Posting or distribution of any kind is strictly prohibited. Any violation of this rule will result in being asked to leave the fair grounds.
- 6. Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. The designated location is the Northwest corner of the Fairgrounds. No entrances or exits can be obstructed or limited in any way.
- 7. No hover boards, skateboards, roller or inline skates, bikes, or motorized scooters etc, are allowed on the fair grounds. Handicap scooters are the exception. Fair board can authorize acceptance of special needs by stopping at the Fair Office and a permit will be provided.
- 8. No firearms or weapons of any kind are allowed on the fair grounds. Exceptions made for Fair Board approved acts and law enforcement officers.

- 9. Use of motorized vehicles on the fair ground during fair week limited to golf cars, 4 wheelers, gators and the like which are used by the Fair Board and staff will be permitted. All other private units brought or driven to fair grounds MUST come to fair office for possible permit. Must have driver's license and proof of insurance. No underage drivers will be allowed.
- 10. Fast driving or riding within the fair grounds is strictly prohibited. The Sheriff's Department is instructed to deal with any person or persons violating this rule.
- 11. **NO PETS SHALL BE ALLOWED** on the Wright County Fairgrounds premises UNLESS:
- A. It is a bonifide service pet.



- B. Its presence is authorized by the fair board in advance of its attendance and it is either leashed or kenneled at all times while on site.
- C. Its presence is part of an organized & announced fair activity.
- D. ANYONE violating this rule with a pet, will take the pet off fairgrounds property immediately upon being asked by any fair official or law enforcement personnel.

 E. Stray pets will be impounded at the owners
- 12. No live animals shall be given away from a concession, exhibit or FFA barnyard display.
- 13. Persons under 18 staying on the fairgrounds overnight must be exhibitors at the fair and have parent or guardian staying with them.
- 14. No person upon the Wright County Fair Grounds may have in their possession any alcoholic beverage or illegal controlled substance. Alcohol may only be consumed in those areas properly designated, licensed, and approved by the Wright County Fair Board. Persons in violation of this policy will be dealt with accordingly by law enforcement personnel.
- 15. All electrical fans and extension cords used in any building must be OSHA approved.

- 16. No Campfires Allowed unless approved by Fair Board.
- 17. No dunk tanks allowed during the Wright County Fair.
- 18. Rules and regulations will be strictly adhered to. Any person who violates any rule or regulation made by the Wright County Agricultural Society shall be held accountable for their actions.
- 19. Wright County Fair Board shall reserve the privilege of changing any of these rules and regulations to suit the purpose for which they have been made and to pass on their application regarding the Wright County Fair.
- 20. **Membership** in the Wright County Agricultural Society. The annual dues of the Society shall be \$5.00 per person each year. Memberships may be purchased at Fair Office during Fair or from any current Fair Board members. To vote at the annual meeting, you must buy your membership BEFORE Sep. 16, 2022. The annual meeting of the society is the third Monday in October of each year at a time and place to be announced.
- 21. NO Smoking in any buildings on the grounds, grandstand or bleacher areas (includes E-cigarettes).

2022 CAMPING GUIDELINES: The Wright County Fairboard is assigning requested spaces for campsites. *CAMPSITES WILL BE ASSIGNED ON A FIRST COME*, *FIRST SERVED BASIS*. Campsites will only be assigned once a completed camping form and fee is received. Campers will be given an opportunity to check which preferred camp area they want, based on availability. Group camping is allowed if all forms and fees are submitted together by July 10, 2022.

For Safety Reasons, we are assigning camping and trailer spaces to exhibitors and vendors staying overnight at the Wright county Fairgrounds. **ANY OVERNIGHT STAY REQUIRES A CAMPER OR VEHICLE TO BE REGISTERED.**

To reserve a campsite you must be 18 years of age and represent an open class or 4-H animal exhibit. Any person under 18 requires adult supervision. Any disruptive conduct could result in removal from the Fairgrounds.

Space is reserved on a first come, first served basis and spaces are limited. *Campers must purchase a 5-day camping pass for* \$50.00. A Single Night stay is available upon request for \$15.00. Pass does NOT include admission or extra vehicles.





Official Rules and Information

The Wright County Fair Talent Show is open to all AMATEUR entertainers who reside in Wright County. Professionals (Union musicians or performers whose talent is a principle source of income) are not permitted to enter. In acts with more than one performer, only one must reside in the County.

Acts that have participated in the past may compete again. The only exception is the former 1st place Open Class winner, may not compete again. The former Teen or Pre-Teen winner is required to compete in the Open Class Division if they qualify for this year's show. If you won as a solo act, you may compete as part of a group act only to compete in your age group again.

All registered acts will audition on Thursday, July 7, 2022 at 6 pm in General Exhibit Building - Fair Grounds. Howard Lake Video auditions can also be submitted.

Out of the 30 acts that audition, selected acts will go on to compete at the Wright County Fair. The show will be on stage in the Hoop Building, July 21, 2022 at 6:00 pm.

EXHIBITOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

The object of these rules and regulations are to make a better fair for all exhibitors.

- 1. Rules and regulations will be strictly adhered to. Any person who violates any rule or regulation made by the Wright County Agricultural Society shall be held accountable for their actions.
- 2. No exhibitor other than livestock will be allowed more than one entry in any one lot.
- 3. Rule #2 shall not effect sweepstakes or special competitions.
- 4. A: All livestock must be entered in the name of the true owner. B: All domestically created articles entered must have been made by the person exhibiting and made between Aug. 1, 2021 and July 18, 2022
- 5. Each article in competition must correspond in number and description with the premium and be in its proper place in order to obtain a premium. No change or alteration will be permitted after the books are placed in the hands of the judges.
- 6. Each entry shall be securely attached to the stall/pen or receptacle in which it is shown.
- 7. No article or animal on exhibit shall leave before the close of the fair under penalty of forfeiture of premium except by permission of the Fair Board.
- 8. Exhibition of articles not competing for premiums must be arranged to conform with the wishes of the superintendents.
- 9. Those in charge of different divisions shall conveniently group each lot within the classes.
- 10. The Association will take every precaution in its power for the preservation of articles and livestock on exhibition but cannot be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of the exhibits.
- 11. If from stormy weather or other causes the fair receipts should prove insufficient to meet all payable demands, the Society reserves the right to first pay all true expenses of the Fair and pay premiums with the balance on hand.
- 12. The superintendent of the division shall keep a record of the awards. The record shall be signed by Judge and returned to the Secretary.
- 13. The awards shall be designated by ribbons as follows: First: Blue, Second: Red, Third: White, and Grand Champion: Purple. Lost, damaged or unclaimed ribbons will not be replaced.
- 14. All awards shall be made by comparing the individual merits of lot entries

- 15. Any interference by exhibitors to influence in any way a judge's decision, will be sufficient cause for excluding that entry from competition and will be reported to the Fair Board Secretary through the Division Superintendent.
- 16. No appeal of a decision shall be allowed. An exhibitor may protest to the Superintendent of the division at the time of the award who may then require the judges to give reasons for their awards.
- 17. Premiums will not be awarded on articles or animals of inferior merit, regardless of the number in competition. The judges may award first, second or no premium, as merit may warrant, stating the reasons in writing when requested.
- 18. Special premiums may be offered by interested persons for entries which conform to the general classifications of the Fair Association.
- 19. No livestock trailers, tents, campers, etc., shall be parked before permission is obtained from the Fair Board. Unauthorized parking will be subject to towing at owner's expense.
- 20. PREMIUM CHECKS must be cashed within 20 days of their written date to be valid.
- 21. There is no limit to the number of entries of LIVESTOCK per lot (with the exception of group lots) BUT exhibitors of livestock cannot win more than two premiums per lot.
- 22. Exhibitors must keep their stock stalls and pens in good condition and open for inspection from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM. All exhibitors must furnish their own hay, straw and grain. No paper bedding will be allowed for livestock use
- 23. Exhibitors of livestock are responsible for knowing when their animals will be judged. LIVE-STOCK must be in the show ring promptly after being called. Any exhibitor failing to comply with this order will be ruled out of competition.
- 24. Sires, dams and groups entered as such must be owned by the individual or firm exhibiting them. Their progeny may be shown simply with proof of their breeding without ownership.
- 25. All exhibited animals shall be shown to judges under the supervision of the superintendent.
- 26. Exhibitors of bulls 1 year or older must lead the animal with a staff attached to a nose ring.
- 27. In all classes which call for registered stock, all animals over one year old should be accompanied by a certificate registry showing that the animal is properly registered in the studbook, herdbook or flockbook which is recognized as being authentic for the breed which the animal is supposed to represent.

- 28. Purebred animals under one year of age shall not be required to show certificate of registry, but the exhibitor of such animals shall be required to give a certified statement that both sire and dam of such animals are properly registered purebreds, according to their breed association.
- 29. Persons under 18 staying on the fairgrounds overnight must be exhibitors at the fair and have parent or guardian stay with them.
- 30. The Wright County Fair Board reserves the privilege of changing any of these rules and regulations to suit the purpose for which they have been made and to pass on their application regarding the Wright County Fair.
- 31. Whatever errors or omissions may arise will be corrected as soon as possible and at the division superintendent's discretion.
- 32. Livestock exhibitors: If illness or injury of any nature is suspected in any animals, said animal is subject to examination by the Official Wright County Fair Veterinarian and owner/exhibitor of said animal must abide by the decision of this veterinarian. Examination and treatment by the Official Wright County Fair Veterinarian will be at the cost of the owner. If the owner/exhibitor cannot be reached, the Official Wright County Fair Veterinarian has the right to treat said animal at the cost of the owner. The animal will be placed in Quarantine Area on grounds.
- 33. The Society will not assume any responsibility for disease, sickness, injury, loss or damage contracted during the Fair.
- 34. All electrical fans and extension cords used in any building must be OSHA approved.

No Campfires Allowed. Unless approved by Fair Board

ENTRY FEES:

No animals will be assigned a place on the grounds until their entry fees have been paid. 4-H and FFA animals that are also entered in open classes must pay their open class fees no later than the entry fee closing date.

- Exhibitors must furnish their own hay, straw and feed. Due to limited space, supplies cannot be stored in the stalls. Once all cattle are stalled some areas for supplies may be designated.
- 3. Exhibitors may exhibit any entry in all 3 shows. Any exhibit in 4-H, FFA and Open Class may enter any show, provided the proper registration is received for each entry in each show by the date entries are set to close for each show. This rule must be strictly adhered to in order to provide accurate placing recording at each show. Any entry not on the pre-printed entry listing cannot receive a premium.
- Entry Fee: \$3.00 per head. Mail check and entry form (located at the beginning of the premium listings) before July 2nd. There is no entry fee for FFA exhibitors.
- 5. Entries accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis until barns are full.
- 6. Judging begins with the 4-H show at 8:30AM Thursday, followed by the Open Class and FFA after a lunch break. The Youth Division Show will be the first class following lunch break.
- 7. If there are 7 or more Open Class entries in one lot, 5 places will be paid. 5th place is paid the same as 4th place.
- 8. The Open Class Dairy and FFA show <u>will begin</u> <u>immediately following the 4-H Dairy Show.</u>
- 9. The Open Class and FFA Dairy show will begin with the milking age classes beginning with lot 9 through lot 17. Following the milking age classes, a lunch break will be held. The Open Class Youth Division Show will be the first class after lunch break using both rings. Following the Youth division, the young female classes 1-8 will be judged. The group classes, Open Class lots 18-20 will be the final classes judged.
- 10. The FFA Classes will be judged in the same ring at the same time as the open class. If an exhibit is entered in both of these shows it will receive a placing, ribbon and premium for both shows. Lots 1-19 are the same for both shows. Both shows will be recognized and announced by the judge and the announcers. PREPARATION FOR EXHIBIT

- Snap Beans: Harvest before constrictions appear between seeds when seeds are about half grown. Ends of pods should not be broken off in picking. Pods should be uniform. Pods may be wiped clean, but not washed.
- Beets, Carrots, Parsnips, Rutabagas: Root crops should be mature but not overgrown, pithy or coarse in texture. Tops should be trimmed to 1½" above crown. Side roots should be trimmed off but not the top root. Roots can be washed but not scrubbed.
- Broccoli: Heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Leave on about a 5" stem.
- Cabbage: Cut stem about ½ inch below the head. Remove blemished or broken leaves but take care not to peel the heads too much. A few outside wrapper leaves are desirable. Specimens may be washed.
- Cauliflower: Heads should be white, compact and free of small leaves and ricy texture. Cut stems to leave 4 to 6 leaves. Outer leaves should be trimmed 1 or 2 inches above the white head. Use a soft bristled brush to remove dirt.
- Celery: Remove roots of stalk and trim butt to form a triangle or pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves on the outside until green color is uniform
- Sweet Corn: Select ears that are well filled out to the tip. Kernels should be milky and juicy. Remove outer husks but allow a short shank and the inner husks to remain.
- Cucumbers, Pickling: 3 to 5 inches long. Specimens should be the same stage of maturity and uniform in size, shape and color.
- Cucumbers, Slicers: select specimens that are straight and dark green; about 6 to 10 inches long. Specimens should be uniform in size, shape and color.
- · Kohlrabi: Roots should be removed just below the ball. Remove all but the upper 4 to 6 leaves. Select specimens that are a uniform medium size and not hard or woody. Skin should be easily punctured by a thumbnail. Specimens should be clean, but not washed.
- Onions: Specimens should be mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. Do not peel to give a slick appearance. Only outer scales that are broken or discolored should be removed. Small basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform length. Wipe or brush clean, but do not wash.
- · Potatoes: Tubers should be uniform in size, shape and color. Washing is permitted, but unwashed, clean potatoes are preferred. Be careful not to blemish the skin by scrubbing. Avoid specimens with defects or disease.

- Rhubarb: Select specimens that are straight, uniform and unblemished. Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut.
- Trim leaf blade to 1 inch above the stalk.
- Summer Squash: Select small to medium size fruits when the rind is soft and easily punctured with a thumbnail. Leave about 1/2' of stem and wipe fruits clean.
- Winter Squash and Pumpkins: Select mature specimens when the rind resists the pressure of the thumbnail. Each should be free of defects. Leave stems attached.
- Swiss Chard: Select plants that are fresh, crisp and have bright green leaves. Trim off roots and trim butts to a pyramid shape. Trim off diseased and broken leaves on the



WINNING SUGGESTIONS

Collect flowers to be exhibited the evening before and place them in a pail of warm water (110 degrees). Set the pail in a cool place or refrigerate 12-24 hours. Be sure to use a very sharp knife to cut the specimen blooms. To exhibit, leave attached as much stem and as many leaves as possible. But be sure no leaves are underwater. Check for dirt, bugs and discoloration on the leaf underside. Remove excess blossoms close to the stem, leaving no knobs.





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
