

Local Rules

General Rules

- 1. All State and Local Rules apply.
- 2. Entries are open to Yolo County residents and neighboring counties: Sutter, Sacramento, Colusa, & Solano
- 3. All entries must be made online @ https://yolocountyfair.fairentry.com/
- 4. No late entries will be accepted.
- 5. For assistance, we are here to help Monday-Friday 9 am 4 pm. 530-402-2222 or email us at entries@yolocountyfair.net
- 6. No refunds of entry fees.
- 7. The California Fairs State Scorecards apply to all exhibits and entries, unless otherwise specified.
- 8. All information contained in the Yolo County Fair Competition Exhibit Book is subject to be amended and/or changed.
- 9. The owner or authorized agent(s) must present exhibits in person. Exhibits will not be accepted by mail. Please note the days and hours that exhibits will be received and judged in your division, as major changes may have been made in that area.
- 10. Fair Management is not responsible for finding errors on your entry form. Management may refuse entries but will do so without prejudice or discrimination.
- 11. Failure of any exhibitor to maintain his/her exhibit to the satisfaction of the Fair Management may result in removal of the exhibit, the cancellation of awards, premiums and Auction proceeds.
- 12. All judges are provided by the Yolo County Fair Management and, in every instance, the decision made by the Judge is final.
- 13. Cash awards will be paid only as recorded on signed Judging Sheet and only to the exhibitor.
- 14. Placing ribbons does not guarantee a correct judging placement. Only the official placing stated on the judging sheet(s) constitutes the final placement.
- 15. No Exhibitor or spectator is allowed in the building while judging takes place.
- 16. Exhibits will remain in place for the duration of the Fair.
- 17. NO motorized scooters, razor scooters, bicycles, skateboards or hover boards are allowed on the fairgrounds or in the livestock area.

Exhibitor Responsibility

- 18. By submitting an application for entry, participants agree to comply with all rules and regulations governing the Yolo County Fair as published in the Competition Exhibit Book.
- 19. The fair will not be responsible for exhibits after the close of pickup times following the fair. All exhibits and equipment MUST be claimed and removed within 5 days. After 5 days the items become property of the fair.

- 20. Premium checks must be cashed by **December 31, 2025**. No check will be reissued or the time extended. Questions on discrepancies in check amounts must be made prior to **October 1, 2025**. No premium adjustment will be made after that date.
- 21. Each exhibitor is responsible for any loss, consequential or otherwise, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her. Exhibitors shall indemnify the 40th District Agricultural Association and the County of Yolo against all legal proceedings in regard thereto.
- 22. A Junior Exhibitor, who in the opinion of Fair Management, 4-H Leaders or FFA Advisor, fails to conform to or accept the set standards of conduct as designated by his/her organization or by the 40th DAA Rules, may be disqualified from competition and removed from the fairgrounds along with his/her entries. This decision may be made at the discretion of his/her leader, advisor or Fair Management.
- 23. The Yolo County Fair has the right to refuse entry forms signed by unauthorized leaders and/or advisors. Before the entry deadline, Fair management also may ask that the community leader and/or County 4-H advisor to sign/authorize entries if proof and/or suspicion of wrong-doing has occurred.
- 24. Vehicles belonging to participants/volunteers are requested to park in the parking lot and walk onto the grounds to their assigned building.
- 25. Glass containers are not allowed on the grounds.
- 26. Animals are not permitted on the grounds unless they are part of an authorized show or exhibit. Service Animals are the only exception. Guide Dog puppies may be on the grounds and must comply with Fair Board Policy.

Exhibitor Divisions

- 27. Adult Divisions: For exhibitors eighteen (18) years and older.
- 28. Junior Divisions: For youth up to eighteen (18) years old prior to the first day of fair (except livestock see livestock competition book for age rules)

How To Enter a Junior Exhibit for the Yolo County Fair 2025

A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

STEP 1: Download/View or Pick-up a Competition Guidebook:

 The Competition Guidebook is located on the fair's website @ <u>www.yolocountyfair.net</u> or you can pick up a copy at your local library or the Yolo County Fair office.

<u>STEP 2: Review the Competition Guidebook:</u> Review the Guidebook to see all the different types of exhibits and classes that are available for Junior Exhibits.

<u>STEP 3: Determine the correct Age Classification.</u> The Junior Department is broken down further into the following age categories (age as of 1st day of fair August 13, 2025). ALL EXHIBITORS MUST ENTER A VALID BIRTHDATE.

- Exhibitor Ages 4 & Under
- Exhibitor Ages 5-8
 - Exhibitor Ages 9-12
 - Exhibitor Ages 13-15
 - Exhibitor Ages 16-18

STEP 4: Entry Options: You have two available options to enter your Still Exhibits.

- 1. Online @ www.yolocountyfair.net or
- 2. Turn in your completed entry form to the fair office by the entry deadline date.

<u>STEP 5: Entry Information:</u> Whichever way you decide to enter, you will need to provide your full contact information and enter the division and class numbers for each of the exhibits that you wish to enter. (This information is detailed in the Competition Guidebook for each entry)

<u>STEP 6: Turn in the Entry Form by the Entry Deadline:</u> All Still Exhibit Entries must be entered by July 21, 2025, by 10:00 pm PST for online entries or delivered to the fair office by 5:00 pm PST on July 21, 2025.

<u>STEP 7: Deliver the Exhibits:</u> You will need to bring your exhibits to the fairgrounds on the "Entry Delivery" dates which are specified in the Competition Guidebook. There will be signs at the fairgrounds directing you to the correct location to deliver your exhibits to.

<u>STEP 8: Visit the Fair:</u> Come to the fair and see your exhibits being displayed & all the awards you may have earned. You are welcome to take pictures of your exhibits on display and share them online using your favorite tag lines or this year's fair hashtags; #agcitedtobehere, #myfairmemories, #yolocountyfair.

Eligibility:

- Open to Yolo County residents and neighboring counties, ages 18 and under.
- Unless otherwise noted, exhibitors are <u>not</u> required to be members of any 4-H Club or FFA Chapter to enter a Still Exhibit. All youth & teens, aged 18 or younger are welcome to exhibit their work and projects in the fair!

Age Classifications:

- To enhance the exhibitor's experience classes have been broken down into the following age categories:
 - Ages 4 & under
 - Ages 5 to 8
 - Ages 9 to 12
 - Ages 13 to 15
 - Ages 16 to 18

Judging:

Unless otherwise noted, all divisions in the Junior Still Exhibits Department will be judged
using the Danish Judging System. It is based upon the established standards of quality
for each type of product. In this system each exhibit is judged according to how well
it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.

Rules:

- Eligibility: Open to Yolo County residents and neighboring counties, ages 18 or under.
- The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural exhibits is the same quality that brings
 the best financial return in the commercial market. Such exhibits must be at least equal in
 maturity to that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural
 Code.
- Items may not be entered in "Any Other" classes if there is a class offered for that item.
- Mature means having reached the stage of ripeness which ensures the completion of the ripening process after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.
- Overripe means having an advanced state of maturity, which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state

Requirements:

- The exhibitor must have grown products entered in these divisions.
- The Fair will not be responsible for the return of exhibits in this department.

- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to provide replacement perishable produce in the quantity entered.
- Spoiled fruits and vegetables will be removed from the exhibit.
- The number of required products to be submitted as an entry follows the class name.

Rules:

- The sale of student-built projects during the livestock auction is open to all 4-H and FFA members in good standing in Yolo and neighboring counties.
- Only projects started on or after the first day of the current school/4-H year for 2024-2025 are eligible for entry in the 2025 Yolo County Jr. Livestock & Ag Mechanics Auction.
- A student may enter a maximum of one (1) entry for the live auction.
- Exhibitors are required to be present at the time of judging for interviews and the taking of pictures for sales placards. Exhibitors must be in official show uniform (see Livestock Dept. for Show Uniform Guidelines) for these pictures and for the auction sale.
- Exhibitors are required to submit documentation (FFA or 4-H record book) with their entries to assist during the judging process. The record book must document all stages of construction from beginning through completion to be considered as "auction ready".
- Only projects constructed or fabricated in school or under the supervision of an instructor or 4-H leader by a student enrolled in an Industrial Technology or Agriculture education course or 4-H project group will be acceptable.
- All entries must be constructed in a manner safe for public viewing.
- Exhibitor must set a valuation on his/her entry. This value should be represented on the record budget page or as part of the display.
- Submission of entry to this competition implies acceptance of all rules and conditions as stated in the Yolo County Fair Competition Guidebook and State Rules.
- A small percentage of commission will be withheld on all Live Auction items.
- The Live Auction will start at 9:00 am on Saturday, August 16, 2025, in the Livestock Show Arena.
- Exhibitor must present their Live Auction Project at the auction.
