OSCEOLA COUNTY FAIR & LIVESTOCK SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITION

- 1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
- 2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
- 3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
- 4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
- 5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
- 6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
- 7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
- 8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
- 9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
- 10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Exhibitor must be a current member of Osceola County 4-H.
- Exhibitor must be between the ages of 5-7, exhibitor must be five (5) years old by September 1st of current year.

NOTICE: KVLS IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST, DAMAGE, OR STOLEN ITEMS REGISTERED FOR PUBLIC VIEW. ITEMS MAY BE BROKEN OR STOLEN WHILE ON DISPLAY AT THE FAIR.

CHECK-IN SATURDAY:

- All entries will be turned in on check in day except for Baked Goods, Small Animals and Horticulture. Check-in will be from 12-4 pm.
- All Rabbit and Poultry animals must be transported in an animal safe carrier or cage to and from the fair.

CHECK-IN THURSDAY:

- All Baked Goods, Horticulture and Small Animals will be **checked in from 5-7 pm**.
- Market Hog Exhibitors can check in from 1-3 to allow them time to go their mandatory Hog Meeting.

ENTRIES:

- EVENT CENTER EXHIBITS: Cloverbuds may enter a **total of nine (9) entries**. This is separate from live animal and fruit crop show entries.
- LIVE ANIMAL/ FRUIT CROPS AND SHOW EXHIBITS: Rabbit, poultry, small animal, fruit crops, Share the Fun, Talent Show, egg show, showmanship, skill a thon or costume contest is separate from non-animal exhibits.

JUDGING:

• Exhibitors must be present during the judging of Rabbits, Poultry, and Small Animals or prior arrangements made with committee, otherwise no premiums will be paid.

PREMIUMS:

- There is no competition amongst Cloverbuds. All entries exhibited will receive a Cloverbud ribbon and a \$3.00 premium per entry. **Unless otherwise noted.**
 - All premium checks will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair.
 - Please allow up to 6 weeks.
 - Any exhibits **removed** before checkout time will forfeit their premium money unless prior arrangements have been made with Youth Exhibit Chair or Co-Chair.
 - Any exhibits **NOT PICKED UP** during checkout time will forfeit their **PROJECT** unless previous arrangements have been made.
 - Anyone can pick up your exhibits if they have your claim checks. They will be asked to sign for them.
 - No Exhibits will be held in the Fair or Extension Services after checking out day.
 - Any remaining items will be discarded unless prior arrangements have been made.

PRE-FAIR WORKSHOP:

- Cloverbud Poultry and Rabbits need to be brought to *Rabbit & Poultry Workshop* prior to the Fair.
 - o For workshop please check online calendar.
- Poultry must attend the Bathing/Pest Control Workshop portion immediately following the pre-fair workshop for those who did not attend in 2021-2022 (a list is on file with the Poultry Chair). Please bring one bird per family.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- All animals are required to be free of disease, parasites, and mites.
- If not free of the listed above, they will be disqualified.
- All animals will be checked at check-in.

ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY:

- All small animals must be left in their own cages at the fair.
- Rabbits must be (5) months of age or older by fair check in date and youth must have rabbit by registration deadline. Poultry must be (6) months or older by fair check in date.

ANIMAL CARE:

- Exhibitors are required to feed and water their own animals, including rabbits, poultry, and small animals.
- They are also required to bring their own feed and keep their pens and cages clean.
 - a. If not clean, premiums will be forfeited.
 - b. Please clean out cages daily and rake under pens **DAILY**.
 - c. For Rabbits and Poultry: <u>NO HAY OF ANY KIND or bedding material allowed or permitted inside the cages.</u>
- · Feeding hours must coincide with fair hours.
- **Animals removed before checkout time and date** will result in forfeiture of premium money.
- All animal areas must always be clean (inside/underneath/around), including checkout time.
- ANIMALS NOT PICKED UP AT CHECKOUT TIME WILL FORFEIT PREMIUMS.
- No locks are allowed on Rabbit cages, but zip-ties may be used for safety.
- LOCKS ARE REQUIRED on all Small Animal cages, with a secure cover on all aquariums or ratchet locks.

DRESS CODE:

- FOR THE RABBIT/ POULTRY/ SHOWMANSHIP SHOW:
 - All exhibitors must wear a white, sleeved, collared dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with dark blue or black western trousers or western jeans.
 - Boots or leather closed toed shoes.

ANIMAL TENT RULES:

- Only approved signs provided by the fair office and committees are permitted on cages and/or pens.
- Vehicles are not permitted on the fairgrounds during operating hours.
- Exhibitors are not permitted to give anything or act as if may give anything to any judge during any show.
- No foam core/poster board or cardstock permitted for the health of the animals. Please do not remove the plexiglass dividers from between the cages.

- Readers will be available to assist during the skill-a-thon.

SECTION 6 | Poultry & Rabbit Costume Contest

- Poultry or Rabbit must be entered in the Cloverbud show and can only be shown by registered exhibitor.
- Cloverbud may enter either poultry or rabbit.
- Does not count toward Cloverbud total entries.
- EXHIBITORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO GIVE ANYTHING TO ANY JUDGE OR ACT AS IF MAY GIVE ANYTHING TO ANY JUDGE DURING ANY SHOW.

RULES:

- May display a 4x6 image of exhibitor with pet.

SECTION 8 | CLOVERBUD BAKED GOODS

RULES:

- Open to all Osceola County 4-H Cloverbud, members may enter THREE (3) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- A recipe form can be found on the fair website **UNDER YOUTH EXHIBITS** and must be used for your entry.
- Recipe must be attached to provided box for judges. Please list ingredients and cooking information.
- Baked good must be presented in a DISPOSABLE SEALED, but removable lid, display.
- All baked goods must be brought to the Thursday Youth Exhibit check-in from 5-7 pm.
- Items must be on/in DISPOSABLE CONTAINERS and require NO REFRIGERATION.
- Items must be cooked (except candy), must contain flour (except candy), and cannot use raw eggs in recipe or have meringue (all eggs must be cooked or baked into recipe).
- No "Friendship" bread or other products that are "aged" without refrigeration before baking. A minimum of five ingredients is required.
- A new recipe is required each year.
 - a. For example, if you made Grandma's chocolate cookies last year you cannot make them again this year.
- NO PRE-PACKAGED, BOXED PRODUCTS OR PREMADE INGREDIENTS MAY BE ENTERED (for example, no boxed cake mixes, frozen bread or pre-made pie crusts, etc.).

Recipes will be moved to another class if mis-entered.

- The exhibiting member is responsible for labeling all plants with common botanical name(s). Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own tag.

SECTION 16 | SHARE THE FUN | TALENT SHOW

RULES:

• All 4-H Cloverbuds may participate in the Share the Fun – Cloverbud Talent Show. You will receive a medal for participation. No premium will be paid for participation. 4-H S-T-F entrants may present acts as individuals or groups (groups are limited to 5 members*). You may compete in one (1) act. (One (1) Individual or One (1) Group. The time range for each act is three (3) to five (5) minutes. S-T-F participants will be performing at the Fair. Please note that you will be required to provide all the necessary instruments (including securing a piano) and materials needed during your act. It will not be the job of the 4-H Agent or the Fair to secure or move any equipment or provide adequate space for dance routines.

NOTE: You must complete a data sheet that is available from the Fair website. This form must be submitted to the Extension Services (4-H office) no later than February 1, 2019. NO EXCEPTIONS or act will be disqualified. Data Sheet must also include words/lyrics for songs, dramatic readings, monologues, poems, or skits. The Data Sheet must include description of act. Complete a data sheet for each member of a group act listing all members and each member of the act must indicate the category and class on their Youth Exhibit Registration form.

- Replacement trees/plants may only be obtained in the thirty days following the original issuing of trees/plants, and only if trees from the original lot are still available.
- All trees/plants must be planted and grown in the container issued to them.
- Must have the original tag on the tree/plant when checked in at fair.
- These trees must be turned in on the same day as all other Citrus Trees and Blueberry plants; and will be exhibited in the Citrus Tree area in the tent.
- Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their tree/plant during the fair.
- Cloverbuds are permitted to participate in the skill-a-thon.
