NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show.h addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON THE BACK OF THIS FORM!

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. h the furtherance of

- their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the AFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

OSCEOLA COUNTY FAIR & LIVESTOCK SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITION

- 1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
- 2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
- 3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
- 4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
- 5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
- 6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
- 7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
- 8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
- 9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
- 10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

SECTION 1 - CITRUS TREE CONTEST Rules and Regulations

ELIGIBILITY:

- Exhibitor must be 8 years old by September 1, of current 4-H year. Exhibitor must be a current member of Osceola County 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA.
- No club/chapter trees will be permitted.

TREE REQUIREMENTS:

- All trees must be planted and grown in the original container issued to them in April of the prior year. If an identification tag is issued in April, it must be the original tag and present on tree at the time of fair.
- Plants will be examined upon check-in at the fair. Contest officials have the right to reject entries of inferior quality or diseased plants. Plants will be examined upon check-in at the fair.

REGISTRATION:

- All trees must be registered <u>ONLINE</u> (Please see Event Calendar for exact date & time.)
- By purchasing a tree in April, it DOES NOT automatically register you for fair.

SHOW LIMITATION:

- Entries shall be limited to one tree per individual. Contestants must only show the tree issued to them in April of the prior year. Replacement trees may only be obtained within the thirty days following the original issuing of trees, and only as long as trees from the original lot are still available.
- Record books are NOT required to show at the fair.

DRESS CODE:

- o FOR THE SHOW:
 - All exhibitors must wear a white, sleeved, collared dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with dark blue or black western trousers or western jeans.
 - o Boots or leather closed toed shoes.
 - Exhibitors may wear a 4-H or FFA jacket. A 4-H or FFA tie may be worn if the exhibitor desires.
 - o No other jackets, vests, or ties will be allowed.

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- o FOR SALE:
 - All exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt, collard dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with nice clean jeans or western dress trousers.
 - o Boots or leather closed toes shoes.
 - o Hats, jackets, ties, vests, will be allowed.
 - THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE.

TREE CARE:

• Each exhibitor is responsible for the care of his or her tree during the fair.

TREE JUDGING AND AWARDS:

- Trees will be pre-judged and classified as blue, red, or white by qualified judges based upon a pre-established set of standards.
 - o Trunk width and form, sturdiness of tree.
 - Sprouts and tree stake removed
 - o Canopy size and form
 - o Leaf shape and size
 - o Free of insects and insect damage
 - o Free from disease signs and symptoms
 - Overall tree appearance
- Trees rated as blue will be eligible to be "shown" by the exhibitor in the citrus show.
- Separate classes will be held for junior, intermediate, and senior exhibitors. Within these three groups, trees will be placed first through fifth place and winners will receive rosette ribbons. During this final judging process, exhibitors need to be prepared to answer questions concerning the care of their trees.
- First place winners from the three classes will be considered for overall grand champion tree. The class receiving the grand champion citrus tree will then be represented by the second-place tree of that class.
- Then from those three classes, the reserve grand champion will be chosen.
- Grand champion and reserve champion will receive trophies.
- Exhibitors are responsible for recruiting their own buyers.
- Cloverbuds will receive a participation ribbon. They may enter <u>one</u> of each fruit crop plant into the fair. At the cloverbud show, participants may choose to bring one of their fruit crop plants (citrus, peach, or blueberry) to the show arena.

TREE SALES:

- Top 6 Exhibitors selling their tree at live auction Saturday night will be required to:
 - o Provide written care instructions for the buyer.
 - Write a personalized thank-you letter to the buyer. **Your buyer**

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- thank-you letters (one per market entry) must be received in the Fair Office by 5 pm the first Friday after the Fair closes.
- It must be in an UNSEALED ENVELOPE, STAMPED, ADDRESSED TO YOUR BUYER(S), AND RETURN ADDRESSED. Failure to turn in your letters(s) in the allotted time will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per market animal, from your check and the check will be held until you do so.
- Any exhibitor that fails to submit their thank you letter(s) by the deadline for two (2) consecutive years will not be able to show the next year.
- o In addition, exhibitors are required to hand deliver (or mail deliver, if the buyer is from out of county) buyer photo, and buyer gift.
- The KVLS Office will notify exhibitors when the photos are available for delivery, the exhibitor will hand deliver to the buyer, get the buyer's signature and return the form to the KVLS Office to receive their check (mail delivery will require a receipt from the post office).
- Exhibitors will be required to accomplish this by the determined due date.
- Please allow 6 weeks from fair for photos and checks to become available.
- Write a thank you letter for any add-ons received.
- Five (5) percent of sale value of each tree will be deducted by KVLS for expenses of the top six (6) trees sold.
- Exhibitors will be required to accomplish delivering their buyer photo and gifts once the packets are available within 10 business days; any buyer plaque/picture delivery receipt turned in after the 10 business days will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per tree.
- All exhibitors that received a Blue ribbon (except the top 6, see above for info) can sell their tree at the Citrus Tree Sale on Thursday in the Small Animal Tent Arena immediately after the show.
 - o Buyer will pay at the time of sale. Checks will be paid directly to KVLS.
 - Tree sale money will be paid out in your premium check. Please allow 6 weeks for checks.
 - Write a thank you letter to your buyer. This is an honor policy, PLEASE SEND A THANK YOU!

PREMIUMS:

 All premiums will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair. Please allow up to 6 weeks.

CHECK OUT:

• All trees, except those sold during the citrus tree sales, must remain until the close of the fair.

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- Exhibits removed before checkout time and date will result in forfeiture of premium money.
- Trees left post-fair will be forfeited.

- All trees must be planted and grown in the original container issued to them in April of the prior year. If an identification tag is issued in April, it must be the original tag and present on tree at the time of fair.
- Contest officials have the right to reject entries of inferior quality or diseased plants.

REGISTRATION:

- All trees must be registered ONLINE (Please see Event Calendar for exact date & time.)
- By purchasing a tree in April, it does NOT automatically register you for fair.

SHOW LIMITATION:

- Each exhibitor (junior, intermediate, senior) may enter **two** trees.
- Contestants must only show the tree(s) issued to them in April of the prior year. Replacement trees may only be obtained in the thirty days following the

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original issuing of the trees and only as long as trees from the original lot are still available.

• Record books are NOT required to show at the fair.

TREE CARE:

• Each exhibitor is responsible for the care of his or her tree during the fair.

TREE JUDGING AND AWARDS:

- Trees will be pre-judged and classified as blue, red, or white by qualified judges based upon a pre-established set of standards.
 - o Trunk width and form, sturdiness of tree.
 - Sprouts and tree stake removed
 - o Canopy size and form
 - o Leaf shape and size
 - o Free of insects and insect damage
 - o Free from disease signs and symptoms
 - Overall tree appearance
- From the trees that receive blue ribbons, the judges will select a Best in Class from each age division. The judges will then select overall Grand and Reserve Champion trees. The three Best in Class trees will sell their trees at the Fruit Crop Auction on Saturday Night.
- Cloverbuds will receive a participation ribbon. They may enter <u>one</u> of each fruit crop plant into the fair. At the cloverbud show, participants may choose to bring one of their fruit crop plants (citrus, peach, or blueberry) to the show arena.

TREE SALES:

- The Best in Class trees will be sold at live auction Saturday night.
- DRESS CODE:
 - All exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt, collard dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with nice clean jeans or western dress trousers.
 - o Boots or leather closed toes shoes.
 - o Hats, jackets, ties, vests, will be allowed.
 - o THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE.
- AFTER THE SALE
 - Exhibitors selling their peach tree at the live auction will be required to:
 - o Provide written care instructions for the buyer.
 - Write a personalized thank-you letter to the buyer. Your buyer thank-you letters (one per market entry) must be received in the Fair Office by 5 pm the first Friday after the Fair closes.

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- It must be in an UNSEALED ENVELOPE, STAMPED, ADDRESSED TO YOUR BUYER(S), AND RETURN ADDRESSED. Failure to turn in your letters(s) in the allotted time will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per market animal, from your check and the check will be held until you do so.
- Any exhibitor that fails to submit their thank you letter(s) by the deadline for two (2) consecutive years will not be able to show the next year.
- o In addition, exhibitors are required to hand deliver (or mail deliver, if the buyer is from out of county) buyer photo, and buyer gift.
- The KVLS Office will notify exhibitors when the photos are available for delivery, the exhibitor will hand deliver to the buyer, get the buyer's signature and return the form to the KVLS Office to receive their check (mail delivery will require a receipt from the post office).
- Exhibitors will be required to accomplish this by the determined due date.
- Please allow 6 weeks from fair for photos, and checks to become available.

- Five (5) percent of sale value of each tree will be deducted by KVLS for expenses of the top three (3) trees sold.
- Exhibitors are encouraged to put "FOR SALE" signs on trees not participating in the live auction. All sales are optional and between the exhibitor/parent and buyer.
- Exhibitors will be required to accomplish delivering their buyer photo and gifts once the packets
 are available within 10 business days; any buyer plaque/picture delivery receipt turned in after the 10 business days will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per tree.

PREMIUMS:

• All premiums will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair. Please allow up to 6 weeks.

CHECKOUT:

- All trees must remain until the close of the fair.
- Exhibits removed before checkout time and date will result in forfeiture of premium money.

- All plants must be planted and grown in the original container issued to them in April of the prior year. If an identification tag is issued in April, it must be the original tag and present on tree at the time of fair.
- Contest officials have the right to reject entries of inferior quality or diseased plants.

REGISTRATION:

- All plants must be registered <u>ONLINE</u> (please see calendar for exact date & time.)
- By purchasing a tree in April, it does NOT automatically register you for fair.

SHOW LIMITATION:

- Each exhibitor (junior, intermediate, senior) may enter **two** plants.
- Contestants must only show the plant(s) issued to them in April of the prior year. Replacement plant may only be obtained in the thirty days following the original issuing of the plant and only as long as plants from the original lot are still available.
- Record books are NOT required to show at the fair.

PLANT CARE:

• Each exhibitor is responsible for the care of his or her tree during the fair.

PLANT JUDGING AND AWARDS:

- Plants will be pre-judged and classified as blue, red, or white by qualified judges based upon a pre-established set of standards.
 - Canopy size and form
 - Leaf shape and size
 - o Free of insects and insect damage
 - o Free from disease signs and symptoms
 - Overall tree appearance
- From the blueberry plants that receive blue ribbons, the judges will select a Best in Class from each age division. The judges will then select overall Grand

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- and Reserve Champion trees. The three Best in Class plants will sell their trees at the Fruit Crop Auction on Saturday Night.
- Cloverbuds will receive a participation ribbon. They may enter <u>one</u> of each fruit crop plant into the fair. At the cloverbud show, participants may choose to bring one of their fruit crop plants (citrus, peach, or blueberry) to the show arena.

PLANT SALES:

- The Best in Class plants will be sold at live auction Saturday night.
- DRESS CODE:
 - All exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt, collard dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with nice clean jeans or western dress trousers.
 - Boots or leather closed toes shoes.
 - o Hats, jackets, ties, vests, will be allowed.
 - o THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE.
- AFTER THE SALE:
 - Exhibitors selling their blueberry plants at the live auction will be required to:
 - o *Provide written care instructions for the buyer.*
 - Write a personalized thank-you letter to the buyer. Your buyer thank-you letters (one per market entry) must be received in the Fair Office by 5 pm the first Friday after the Fair closes.
 - o It must be in an UNSEALED ENVELOPE, STAMPED, ADDRESSED TO YOUR BUYER(S), AND RETURN ADDRESSED. Failure to turn in your letters(s) in the allotted time will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per market animal, from your check and the check will be held until you do so.
 - Any exhibitor that fails to submit their thank you letter(s) by the deadline for two (2) consecutive years will not be able to show the next year.
 - o In addition, exhibitors are required to hand deliver (or mail deliver, if the buyer is from out of county) buyer photo, and buyer gift.
 - The KVLS Office will notify exhibitors when the photos are available for delivery, the exhibitor will hand deliver to the buyer, get the buyer's signature and return the form to the KVLS Office to receive their check (mail delivery will require a receipt from the post office).
 - Exhibitors will be required to accomplish this by the determined due date.
 - Please allow 6 weeks from fair for photos, and checks to become available.
 - Write a thank you letter for any add-ons received.
 - Five (5) percent of sale value of each tree will be deducted by KVLS for expenses of the top three (3) plants sold.
 - o Exhibitors are encouraged to put "FOR SALE" signs on plants not

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- participating in the live auction. All sales are optional and between the exhibitor/parent and buyer.
- Exhibitors will be required to accomplish delivering their buyer photo and gifts once the packets are available within 10 business days; any buyer plaque/picture delivery receipt turned in after the 10 business days will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per plant.

PREMIUMS:

• All premiums will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair. Please allow up to 6 weeks.

CHECKOUT:

- All plants must remain until the close of the fair.
- Exhibits removed before checkout time and date will result in forfeiture of premium money.
- Plants left post-fair will be forfeited.

The Premier Exhibitor is a points system based on exhibitor participation beyond the required minimum. Points will be based on scoring and are given for the following:

At the end of the year, based on the number of points you have earned you could win the Premier Exhibitor Award for the Fruit Crop Project. An applicant must have a minimum of 150 points to be considered for a Fruit Crop Premier Exhibitor placing. 1st place will receive a belt buckle and monetary award. 2nd and 3rd place will receive a monetary award.

KVLS does not require your participation in the Premier Exhibitor Program. Verification forms must be completed correctly to receive your points.

You must accumulate a minimum of 150 points to be considered for the Fruit Crop Premier Exhibitor award. In the event of a Tie, the following will be used to determine the Tie Breaker:

- 1) Score on Record Book 2) Questionnaire Score 3) Tabletop Placing
- If you are exhibiting in more than one fruit crop project area, you can only compete in PEP with your primary project.

PLEASE TURN YOUR VERIFICATION FORMS IN USING A LARGE MANILLA ENVELOPE, FILE FOLDER, OR BY SIMPLY STAPLING THEM TOGETHER. BE CERTAIN YOUR NAME IS ON ALL YOUR PAPERWORK!!!

You are required to register for the Premier Exhibitor Award online by Friday, December 18th, 2020. When you register, you are registering to compete in the Fruit Crop Premier Exhibitor Program. This means that you are competing against all exhibitors in that category. An exhibitor may register to compete in a maximum of three (3) Premier Exhibitor Programs. (Primary Market Animal, Heifer, and/ or Fruit Crop). Fruit Crop packets, verification forms, and record books are required to be turned in prior to the fair in February to be considered for the award. Packets will not be accepted after the deadline. Due date is to be determined.


